Rules
Please pitch tents on gravel pads, no tents on grass. Only select sites allow extra tents with a fee of \$30 (plus taxes) per night are permitted. Quiet hours: 10:30pm - 8:00am Speed Limit: 15km/hr It is illegal in Alberta Parks to cut/damage trees, attach items to trees or to pick flowers. Dogs must remain on leash at all times (leash must be no longer than 10ft.) Pets must not be left in tents unattended.

Hikes for Every Explorer
Troll Falls: Easy A scenic 3.4km out-and-back trail with minimal elevation gain, perfect for families and beginners. Rawson Lake: Moderate A 6.8 km out-and-back trail with 423 metre elevation gain, leading to a serene alpine lake. The steady climb through the forest rewards you with breathtaking mountain & lake views. King Creek Ridge: Difficult A steep but rewarding 6km out-and-back trail with 750 metre elevation gain. The ridge offers incredible panoramic views of Kananaskis Valley, making the tough ascent well worth the effort.
Don't Forget: Carry bear spray and know how to use it. Ensure you have adequate food and water and always let someone know where you'll be going.
Bear Safety
For your safety and to protect wildlife, all food, drinks, toiletries, and any scented items must be stored properly. Do NOT store coolers, food, attractants, or garbage inside your tent, tipi, or trapper's tent. Bears and other wildlife have a strong sense of smell and may be drawn to your campsite. Store all food and scented items in: A hard-sided vehicle or at the Trading Post if you don't have a car. Dispose of waste properly: Use designated bear proof garbage bins, never leave food scraps or garbage unattended and clean cooking areas thoroughly after meals. Additional Bear Safety Tips: Never leave food or scented items unattended (even for a short time), cook & eat away from your sleeping area and always carry bear spray and know how to use it. Be alert, make noise while hiking, and respect wildlife. A fed bear is a dead bear.
