



Part-Time Therapist

Hope House is seeking a clinical/behavioral health professional to join our team as a part-time Therapist. This role provides clinical counseling and care to survivors of domestic violence.

- **Location:** On-Site at Independence Campus, or Remote as needed and approved
- **Classification:** Part-Time, Non-Exempt, Hourly
- **Starting Rate of Pay:** \$27.16 - \$36.77/hour, dependent upon experience
- **Schedule:** 15-20 hours per week. Requires availability of 2-3 weekdays each week, including at least one evening; two evenings are preferred. Weekends are generally not allowed.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Provide immediate crisis intervention, safety planning, and behavioral health assessments
- Develop individualized treatment plans and monitor progress
- Provide regular individual therapy to a caseload of 13-15 clients
- Provide clinical case support services to survivors
- Facilitate psycho-educational and/or support groups
- Maintain clinical files and documentation according to legal and ethical standards
- Complete progress notes, treatment plans and summaries, outcome measurement tools, and other required documentation
- Participate in ongoing supervision
- (Optional) Provide on-call assistance to the Shelter and Guardian Program operations on a rotating basis

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

- Master's degree in Counseling or Social Work
- Licensed Professional Counselor (LPC) or Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW) in the state of Missouri

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS

- Bilingual (English/Spanish)
- Experience working with survivors of domestic violence
- Certifications in trauma-informed therapeutic modalities (EMDR, TF-CBT, DBT, etc.)



WORK ENVIRONMENT

This position is typically on-site at our Independence campus and may work remotely dependent upon client needs and supervisor approval. Therapists frequently interact with individuals experiencing trauma, crisis, or emotional distress.
