Introduction and Summary

This report is a preliminary assessment of trees and hedgerows within the site and immediately adjacent to it (as defined by the Local Planning Authority). It is intended to help applicants accurately complete the Planning Application form mandated by Article 7 of the Town and Country Planning (Development Management Procedure) (England) Order 2015 concerning trees and hedgerows.

This preliminary assessment is not a full arboricultural survey and does not replace a BS 5837:2012 Tree Survey. Instead, it provides supporting evidence and additional information. The report is designed to support Local Planning Authorities in determining whether the information provided on the form is accurate and whether a more detailed arboricultural assessment is required, in line with both national standards and local validation requirements.

Data is derived from both a site survey and the Government's non-woodland tree dataset. The report also invites the applicant to access publicly available data to check whether the site lies within a designated Conservation Area or whether any Tree Preservation Orders (TPOs) are recorded. Applicants remain responsible for confirming any designations directly with the Local Planning Authority.

The report was produced with the assistance of the Preliminary Tree Assessment Tool, which can not guarantee the accuracy of the information herein.



The Root Protection Area (RPA) has been calculated in accordance with BS 5837:2012, Clause 4.6, which specifies a radius of 12 times the stem diameter measured at 1.5m above ground level, subject to a maximum of 707m².


Projected canopy and Root Protection Area (RPA) intersections are calculated automatically by the Preliminary Tree Assessment Tool. Canopy

areas are based on estimated crown spread derived from user-entered dimensions, and RPAs are calculated in accordance with BS 5837:2012 Clause 4.6 (12 × stem diameter at 1.5m above ground, capped at 707m²). The tool then calculates the overlap between these areas and the proposed development footprint. These figures are provided as indicative only.
