A SLAM DUNK FOR EDUCATION: ORLANDO MAGIC YOUTH FOUNDATION AWARDS \$25,000 TO SUPPORT KINDERGARTEN READINESS IN OSCEOLA

Kissimmee, FL (Tuesday, August 26, 2025) - The Early Learning Coalition of Osceola County (ELC of Osceola) is honored to have been awarded one of 18 Orlando Magic Youth Foundation grants for the summer cycle. Out of \$1.6 million being distributed to meaningful organizations, \$25,000 will be awarded to ELC of Osceola County for its Transition to Kindergarten Initiative.

The initiative aims to prepare children in Osceola for kindergarten through a community-driven approach. This means investing in early education professionals with professional development and personalized coaching. As for families, the ELC of Osceola will provide more interactive educational events in their communities, while also equipping families with tools and resources to support early literacy and playbased learning at home.

The state's reduced early education budget has greatly impacted the ELC of Osceola. This grant brings hope during a time of uncertainty in education.

"We need more key players in our communities to invest in our children and their futures. Investing in children is one of the greatest returns on investment anyone can make."
