Legal Kiosk



The Texas Legal Services Center (TLSC), a nonprofit funded by the Texas Access to Justice Foundation, operates 45 kiosks statewide to help low-income Texans access free legal services. These accessible legal kiosks function as local legal aid centers, allowing residents to connect with courts, receive legal help, and find community resources in a trusted public setting. Kiosks are available in English and Spanish and include step-by-step guidance, technical support, and access to free legal advice through [TexasLawHelp.org](https://www.texaslawhelp.org). This kiosk is located at the Doyle Community Center.

Community Legal Services Kiosk



Community Legal Services' Kiosk Project's eight self-service kiosks were placed throughout the state in public areas such as courthouses, libraries and community centers where travel to one of their offices is too burdensome. The kiosks are designed to be a user-friendly portal for Arizonans to learn about civil legal issues, find court information and forms, access legal aid providers by appointment and locate community resources. This kiosk is located at the Mohave County Court House.

Legal Kiosk Project



Nevada's Legal Kiosk Project emerged from a collaboration among the state's five leading legal aid providers, including Nevada Legal Services, in response to the digital divide laid bare by the COVID-19 pandemic. That divide disproportionately affected seniors and others without reliable access to or comfort with technology, limiting their ability to access the legal system. Because many people turn to local libraries for help, placing free Legal Kiosks in libraries across the state creates a trusted, practical access point for both library staff and the communities they serve. This kiosk is located at the West Las Vegas Library.
