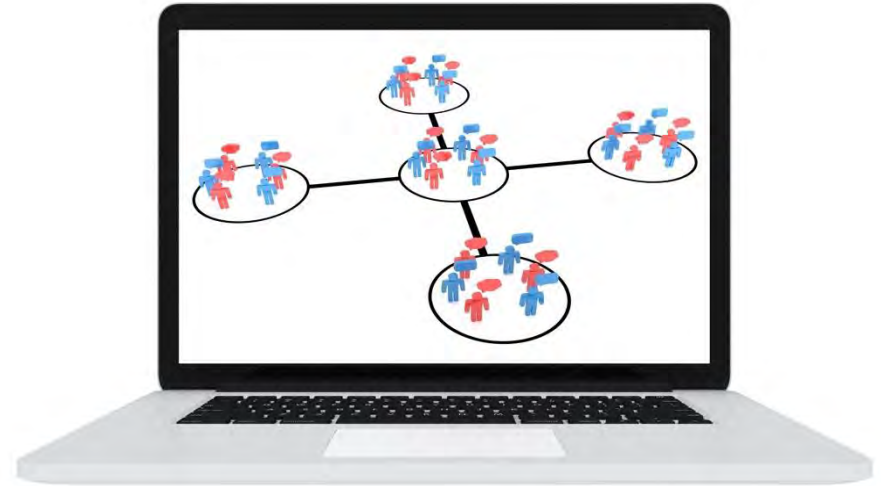

Why Change Is Unavoidable

Emotional Reactions to Change

People often feel uncertainty, fear, and skepticism when faced with change due to its unknown impact on roles and security.

Change Fatigue and Withdrawal

Repeated or poorly managed changes can cause fatigue, disengagement, and withdrawal as people cling to familiar routines.

Leadership Response to Resistance

Effective leaders interpret resistance as a signal for clarity and involvement rather than defiance, fostering constructive engagement.

Role of Psychological Safety

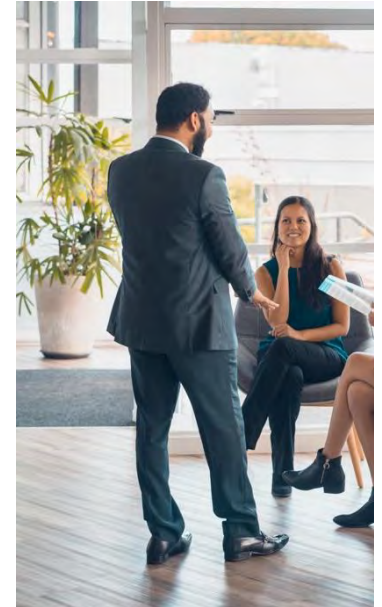
Feeling safe to express concerns and ask questions enables employees to engage constructively with change.

Encouraging mentorship between experienced and younger employees fosters knowledge sharing and innovation.

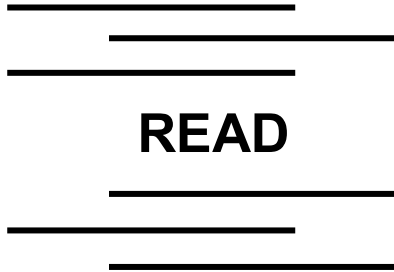
Inclusive Practices and Diversity

Focus on adapting communication styles to effectively reach diverse age groups within teams.

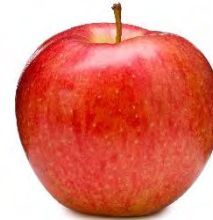

Leadership Over Tools

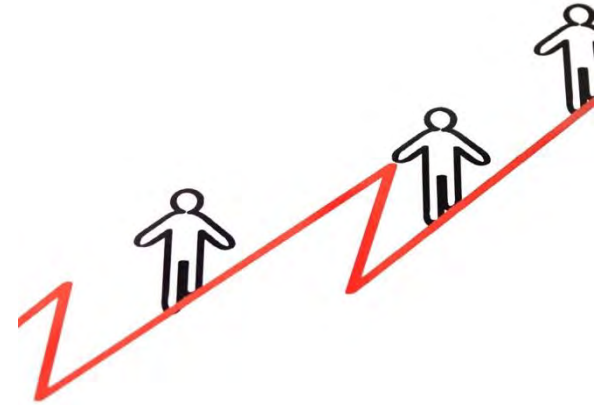
Effective leadership behavior impacts change more than any single tool or framework.
