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#### Year 5 & 6 Girls' Beach Football

This half term, some of our Year 5 and 6 girls headed down to Goodrington Sands to take part in a Girls' Beach Football Festival.

The girls were given a number of different challenges to help them learn and improve their football skills, to work in teams and as individuals, ending with a couple of quick matches.

One of the coaches was from the England Beach Soccer Women's Team and she chatted to the girls about her experience playing for England. There was so much fun, joy and laughter amongst the girls under the September sunshine. What a memorable afternoon!



















This half term, Year I went on a trip to Torre Abbey Sands: identifying human and physical features in our local environment. The children used their maps to help them find the way from school to the beach. On the way, we stopped off at King's Gardens to feed the local ducks—and swans—. We then walked along the seafront and the tide was really far in so the children loved watching the waves crash up against the wall, trying not to get wet!—We were lucky to find a little bit of beach at the corner of Corbyn Head where the children sketched a human and physical feature. We then had a play on the beach before heading back to school. Lots of fun was had by everyone, we were very lucky with the weather again—. Thank you to those parents that were able to come along and help!



























This half term, Year 2 had a slightly soggy fieldwork trip to the seafront. We were looking for human and physical features and even carried out a survey to see whether we met more tourists or locals (it was about even!). The children behaved beautifully and did some lovely sketches of geographical features they had seen.



















This half term, Year 3 visited Torre Abbey Gardens as part of their art and science learning enquiry. The children enjoyed taking photographs and sketching the flowers and leaves that they saw. They hosted a fabulous showcase where they were able to show off their creativity and flair with parents.



































Year 4 visited Torquay Museum to learn about the Romans. They learned about their armour and how their armies attacked and defended themselves. They looked around the museum and learned many interesting facts.























Year 5 took a trip to Cockington Court to explore their yearly sculpture trail, somewhere where we will display our finished art sculptures.

While they were there, they were lucky enough to take part in a workshop with sculptor Allan Poxton, who gave them a brilliant introduction to making wire sculptures. He showed them some of his amazing work, talked about his creative process, and explained how long each piece can take to bring to life. We cannot wait to show him our finished pieces.

The children showed all our school values while at Cockington Court and were an asset to the school. They even displayed their sculptures in one of the studios. They will be there over half term if you would like to pop down and take a look!





















Year 6 have been getting stuck in with their learning this half term with a visit from Miss Wilson, a former teacher here. Many of the children remembered her from their Year 3 days, and it was wonderful to welcome her back to Cockington. She shared her journey as an artist, talking us through her inspirations, techniques and the creative process behind her work.

Her visit left them full of ideas, and they used this inspiration in their art sessions over the half term as they looked closely at nature and experimented with different ways to capture it — while also exploring and developing their own artistic styles.

Safe to say, Year 6 really branched out with their creativity this term!




