

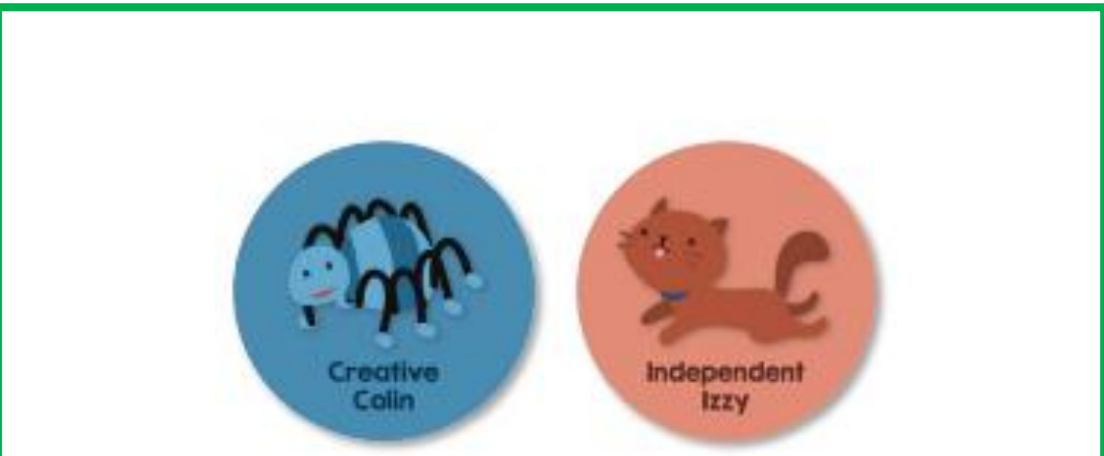
How has transport changed overtime?

Big Idea: 3. Connecting to our locality: Our locality is a place of historical, cultural and geographical significance and this impacts our lives.

Do you remember when you explored our local area at the beginning of the year? You discovered the beach and learnt about the physical and human features of the place we live in. People have always wanted to travel further and explore new places, and over time new forms of transport, from the wheel to steam trains, have helped make journeys quicker and easier.

Working together, you will compose a piece that tells the story of transport through the ages.

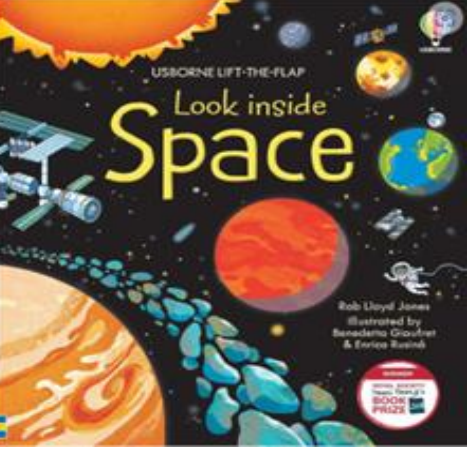
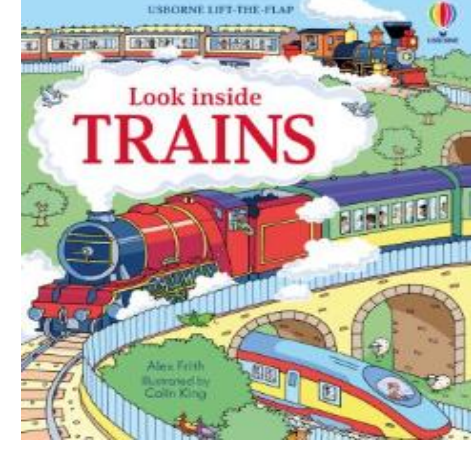

What sounds would you have heard on a sailing ship, a steam train, or an early motor car? How do modern trains, aeroplanes, and electric vehicles sound different from the transport of the past?

In this exciting Learning Enquiry, 'Transport Through Time: A Musical Journey,' you will travel through history to discover how transport has changed over time. You will explore a range of old and new forms of transport, from some of the earliest wheeled vehicles and sailing ships to steam trains, cars, aeroplanes and modern rail travel. Along the way, you will investigate how transport has helped people travel further, faster, and more safely throughout history.

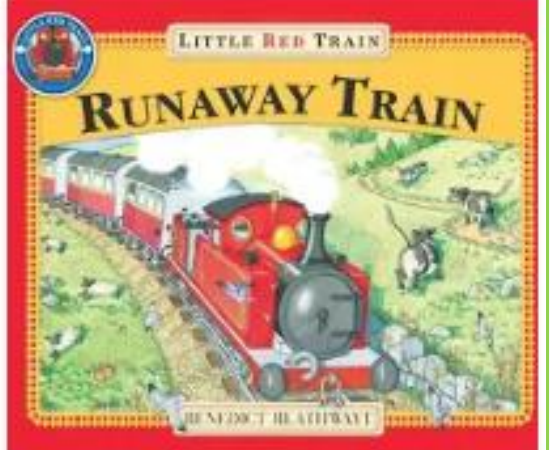
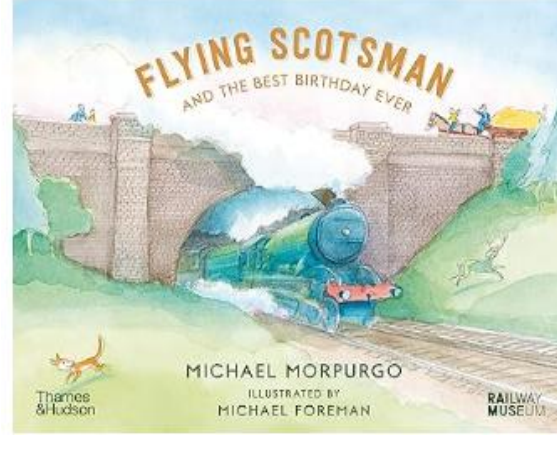
Using music as your guide, you will listen to, create, and perform sounds inspired by different types of transport. You will explore how transport moves, sounds and communicates, experimenting with rhythm, pitch, tempo, and dynamics to bring journeys to life through music.

Working together, you will become composers, creating an original musical piece that tells the story of transport changing through time. From the clip clop of a horse's hoof and the chugging of steam trains to the roar of aeroplanes and the hum of modern transport, your music will take listeners on an exciting journey through the ages. Along the way, you will discover how music can tell stories, create atmosphere, and capture the excitement of travel and adventure.

We will be going on two train journeys as part of our learning about transport through time. First, we will travel on a modern train from Torquay Train Station to Paignton Train Station, experiencing how people travel by rail today. We will then journey on a traditional steam train from Paignton to Dartmouth Kingswear and back, stepping back in time to explore what train travel was like in the past. Throughout the day, we will compare old and new trains, discussing differences in comfort and speed. We will investigate how rail travel has changed over time and consider how these changes have improved journeys for passengers. Along the way, we will enjoy the experience of travelling on both modern and historic trains while taking in the beautiful scenery of the English Riviera.

Music Sticky Knowledge

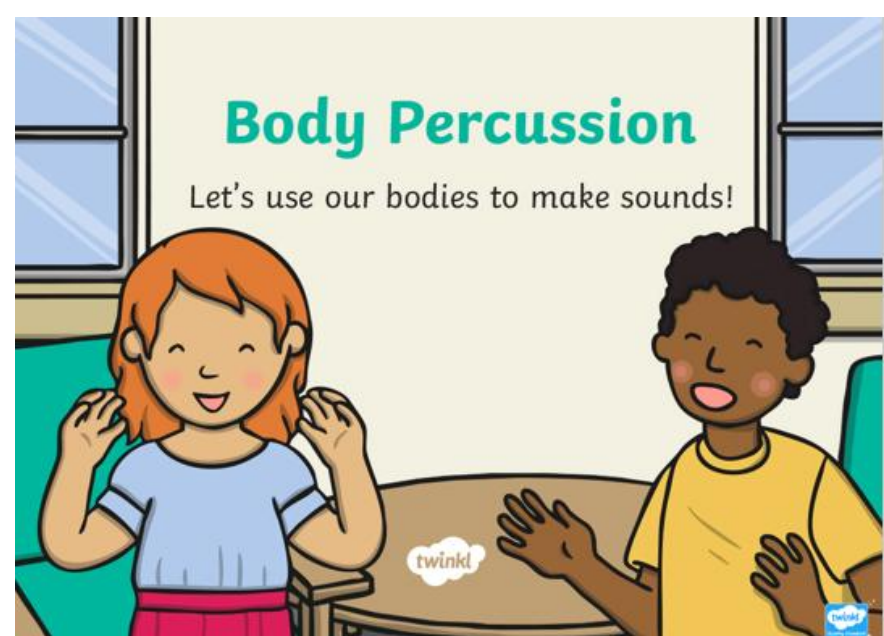
Music can change a person's mood and make them feel happy or sad.

Musicians use symbols to show when different sounds are played.

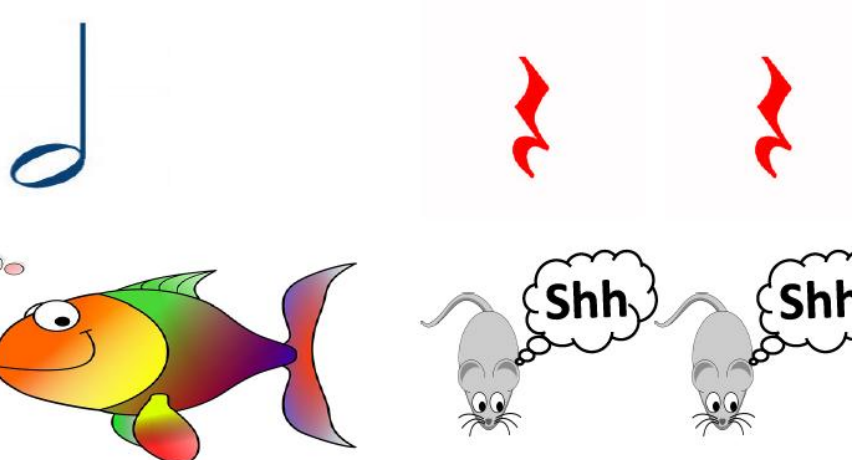
Sound effects can be used to represent sounds in real life.
