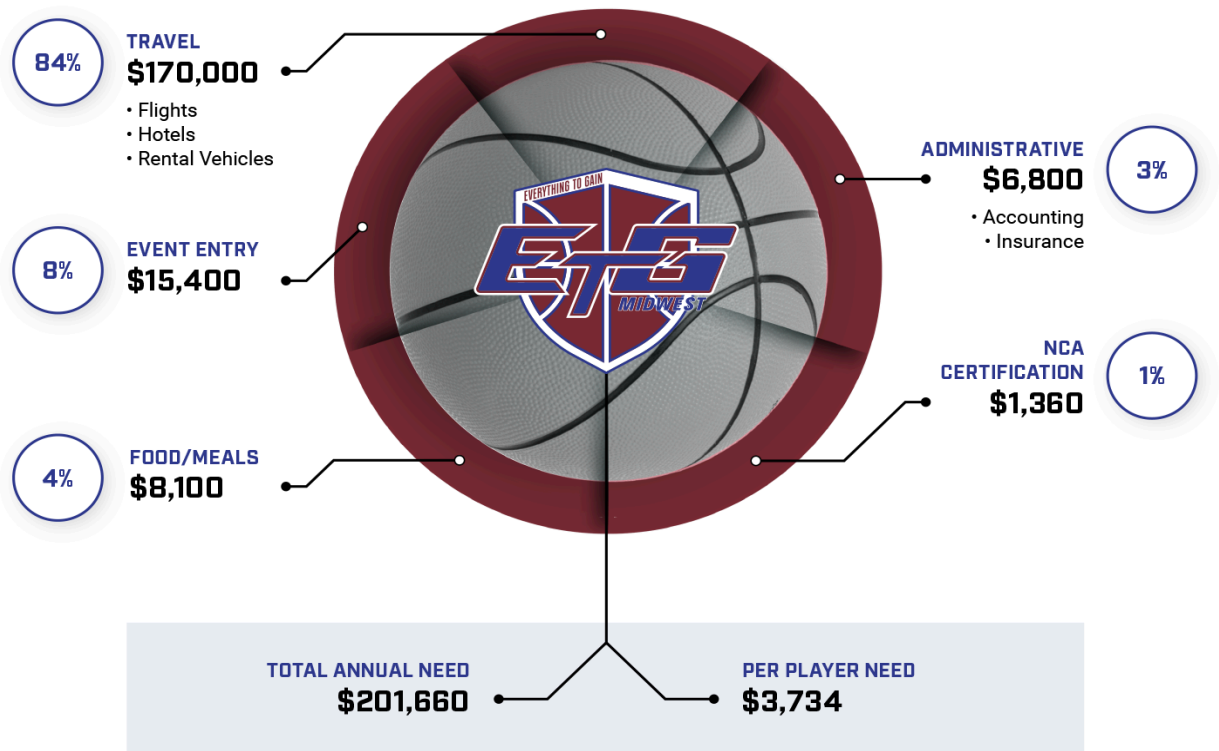

Kelsey Woodard (Davis) Crusader Grad 2007

- 1. Can you take a moment and describe your experience while playing with the Crusaders? Any significant moments or memories stand out?**

Those years hold such a special place in my heart! The things that stick out most are the relationships built with teammates and coaches. I don't know that I could necessarily recall an exciting play or game result, but I can definitely remember both on and off-court moments between teammates/coaches. One of my favorite dynamics was playing alongside girls with Crusaders, and then playing against them during the high-school season. It is also pretty cool to be able to tell my kids that we played at some of the places that we see on TV, like Cameron Indoor



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Stadium. In hindsight, we got to travel to some awesome places and I should've been more grateful to my parents for spending so much time and money on my basketball career!

2. What advice or insight could you give to student athletes and/or coaches regarding the recruiting process?

I was fortunate enough to have an older sister that had an amazing college basketball experience and I wanted to follow in her footsteps, so my recruiting process was somewhat unique. That said, it is so important to surround yourself with people you trust and try to make a decision that aligns with your goals and values. I know NIL has changed the calculus of that decision, but I still think relationships and culture should be prioritized above all else! You are going to be spending a LOT of time with the coaches/players in the program and how you fit in with that can make or break an experience, much more than what deals you get with which sponsors. Lastly, basketball likely won't be your career post-college, so you want to look at things holistically and make sure your decision incorporates any career aspirations you have (e.g., does it have a nursing program if you want to be a nurse). Be open-minded and level-headed!

3. How has grassroots basketball changed since your days with the Crusaders? Do you see the changes as mostly positive or negative?

I think it is much more organized at an earlier age now, which is both good and bad. It signals that the game has grown, which is obviously good, but the risk of overuse and burnout is real. I believe it's important to be involved in as much as possible and not specialize in basketball too early. The off-season is needed and a time where you can really hone in on your craft on the side, while being in-season in another activity. I have strong opinions about what youth basketball should look like (e.g., 9-ft rims through 4th grade, no zone or zone press until 6th grade, etc.) but those would take up an entire Spotlight of their own so will refrain from oversharing. From a skills perspective, it does seem like the game



has gotten more creative over the years though so I've loved seeing that evolution! Overall, I think the more that former players get involved in coaching, reffing, etc, the better off the game will be and we can maintain some of the tradition while also supporting the growth.

4. Tell us a little about your life now with basketball and then just family...basically a day in the life of Kelsey Davis!!

My husband, Dustin, and I have been married for 14 years and have 3 kids - Dashel (10), Finley (8), and Leighton (3.5). We are in the thick of youth sports and love (most) every second of it! The boys play soccer, football, basketball, and even tried their hand at baseball last spring. Leighton is their biggest cheerleader and will start organized activities at some point, but we aren't rushing it. I work in the Accounting Department at Union Pacific Railroad and Dustin works for the US Army Corps of Engineers, where we've both been since we interned in college. 4. Right now I'm living in Berlin, Germany with my fiance, playing professional basketball for Alba Berlin. We play in both the BBL (top german league) as well as the BCL (one of



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the best european leagues). The seasons over here are long with pre-season starting in August and the post-season ending in May or June for teams. But Berlin is a great city with so many things for us to do. This is my third year playing professionally with my first two seasons being in Bonn, Germany. I hope to continue playing as long as I am still having fun with it and my body is holding up!



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
