Creating a safe, inclusive space. This conference aims to promote safety and inclusion. For this reason, violence and bigotry of any kind will not be permitted. Please communicate with respect and consideration, and try to speak for yourself only. Refrain from comments that are abusive in nature or that perpetrate racism, sexism, homophobia, transphobia, ableism, or any other form of discrimination or harassment. If something makes you feel uncomfortable, please do not hesitate to talk to the conference team about it! We are committed to creating an environment where participants from all over the world feel they belong and can share ideas. Anyone who violates the principle of zero-tolerance for violence or compromises the safety of others will be asked to leave.

Recognising confidentiality and intellectual property. During this conference, participants will be encouraged to share their ideas and connect around a diversity of themes and resources. Just like the P4wC model, we aim to democratize philosophical thought and creation by encouraging the inclusion of people from all levels and backgrounds. Since the program draws on participatory approaches, your involvement is key! That said, anything that is shared

with the group is confidential and must stay within the space. Please take care of everyone’s privacy! Further, panelists and presenters will be offering insights from their research and practice that may be copyrighted or only available thanks to permission granted by authors or collaborators. Please do not share any of the content publicly, nor use the materials or processes outside the conference context, without expressed authorisation from presenters.

Cultivating reflective dispositions. This conference tackles concepts and perspectives that can challenge and even confront us. Please be kind and gentle with yourself as you navigate through these ideas. Much like we learn through P4wC dialogue, allow yourself to doubt, to feel uncertainty or discomfort, to welcome ambiguity and complexity, to change your mind and to cultivate intellectual humility. It is completely acceptable to disagree, as long as you do so respectfully! Please be mindful of what you share and how often you speak so everyone has a chance to participate. Whenever possible, be an active listener and build on the ideas of others to enable co-construction!
