#### CRAIG SWEENEY AWARD

Craig Sweeney played in the first four test matches for the United States in the modern era, captaining the team in the third and fourth tests. Unfortunately, not too many months after returning from England where he earned his fourth cap, Craig was training on the track at Santa Monica and suffered a fatal heart attack.

The late Keith Seaber, who was the Chairman of the National Selectors at the time, remembered Sweeney fondly. "While extremely talented, Craig was also modest and revered by his teammates. He was a great captain and a wonderful ambassador for the game, U.S. Rugby and the United States of America. After the initial shock, we, the Union, decided to have an award in his memory. The National Selectors were given the responsibility of selecting an individual who had played for the Eagles, who was respected by his peers and the rugby community, has made significant contributions back to the game following his playing career, and be a person of exemplary character."

# CRAIG SWEENEY AWARD RECIPIENT RAY LEHNER



Ray Lehner's rugby journey began at Jesuit High School (Sacramento) and flourished at the University of California, Berkeley, where he led Cal to three national championships (1991–1993), earned All-American honors, and served as team captain. His international career spanned 37 caps for the USA Eagles from 1995– 2000, including the 1999 Rugby World Cup.

Following his undergraduate studies, Lehner earned four Oxford Blues while completing his MSt at Oxford University. As a coach, he has impacted all levels of American rugby—serving in roles from Assistant Coach at Cal to Head Coach of Olympic Club, USA U20s, West Coast Falcons, Lamorinda Rugby, and Bishop O'Dowd High School, where he founded the rugby program and teaches Civics and Economics.

Lehner exemplifies rugby's core values of discipline, teamwork, and perseverance. His lasting legacy as a player, coach, and educator continues to shape American rugby and inspire future generations.

# PRUSMACK AWARD ALY CUNNINGHAM



Aly Cunningham's rugby journey began at age five, quickly emerging as a standout athlete. At Catholic Memorial High School (WI), she led her team to State, Midwest, and National Championship success while also winning backto-back Wisconsin High School Ski Race titles. She was named CMH's 2021 Athlete of the Year.

At Sacred Heart University, Aly captained the Pioneers to top national finishes, including 5th place at CRAA 7s Nationals (2024) and 3rd (2025). She earned All-NIRA First Team honors three times and received SHU's 2024–25 Athletic Director's Award. A double major in business management and business analytics, Aly graduated in May 2025.

Internationally, Aly has trained with USA Rugby's age-grade programs since 16 and will represent the USA Falcons in Brazil this summer. She competes for the New York Exiles in Women's Elite Rugby and will pursue her MSc at the University of Edinburgh this fall. Aly also gives back by coaching youth rugby.



# PRUSMACK AWARD MANULUA "MANU" TAULA

Born in New Zealand, Manulua "Manu" Taula moved to the United States in 2019 at age 15 to live with his uncle and aunt. Though the transition brought challenges and sacrifices, Manu has embraced the opportunity with gratitude, drawing strength from the constant support of his family in New Zealand and the U.S.

Now a standout player at St. Bonaventure University, Manu has overcome academic and personal adversity to emerge as a leader both on and off the field. After a challenging sophomore year, he refocused on his academic and athletic goals, returning to form by his junior season.

Looking ahead, Manu aspires to continue his rugby career in Europe, while remaining grounded in faith, humility, and gratitude. His journey reflects resilience, growth, and an enduring love for the game. As he says: "The marathon continues."





# LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD KEN DALY





Ken Daly's remarkable rugby journey began in Dublin, Ireland, in 1943. After emigrating to Canada and later to Boston, Daly became a pioneer in American collegiate rugby. In 1968, he founded the Boston College Rugby Football Club (BCRFC), coaching both men's and women's teams for 47 years while building one of the most successful programs in the country.

Under Daly's leadership, BCRFC amassed over 900 matches, multiple championships, and produced numerous All-Americans and Eagles. His coaching philosophy, grounded in the Jesuit principle of "Men and Women for Others," emphasized character, perseverance, and service.


Beyond coaching, Daly helped build the administrative foundation of rugby in the U.S. as a founding member and longtime leader of the New England Rugby Football Union (NERFU). His contributions have shaped generations of players, coaches, and administrators. Daly's legacy continues to inspire, making him one of the most influential figures in American collegiate rugby history. This will be the 5th Hall of Fame to recognize Ken.

# LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD DR. BOB DAVIS

Dr. Bob Davis began his rugby journey in 1974 at the University of Maryland Medical School, playing for 40 years before retiring at age 65. While his club playing career included Chesapeake and UNC, it was his coaching that left a lasting legacy. Beginning in 1983, Davis transformed Salisbury University's rugby program into a national powerhouse, guiding them to four Division II Collegiate National Championships and 15 Final Four appearances over 22 years.

Beyond coaching, Davis secured facilities, funding, and university support for Salisbury Rugby while also contributing as a certified referee and providing critical on-field medical care throughout his tenure. His leadership helped produce numerous All-Americans and future MLR players.

Dr. Davis's impact was recognized with induction into the Salisbury Rugby Hall of Fame and the naming of the Salisbury University Intramural Athletic Complex in his honor. His legacy remains one of mentorship, excellence, and dedication to developing both outstanding athletes and men of character.





## 2025 US RUGBY HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE BARB FUGATE



Barbara "Barb" Fugate's 40-year rugby career helped shape women's rugby in America. She began playing in 1985 with Belmont Shore, later competing for San Diego and the Minneapolis Valkyries, reaching three straight Women's Club National Finals (2003–2005). Her representative career included the Southern California Griffins, Pacific Coast Grizzlies, and Midwest Select Side, where she captained from 1995–1996.

In 1989, Fugate organized the first women's territorial tour to New Zealand, laying groundwork for U.S. women's international competition. She earned 4 caps with the USA Eagles starting in 1990 and was part of the historic 1991 Women's World Cup Championship Team.

Off the field, Fugate served on the USA Rugby Board (1996–2004), chaired strategic planning, coached the USA U23 Women (2000–2008), and continues to develop players as Rugby Development Officer for Metropolis RFC. Her many honors include multiple Hall of Fame inductions and the inaugural Kathy Flores Lifetime Achievement Award.

#### 2025 US RUGBY HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE BILL "CHIEF" LEVERSEE



Bill "Chief" Leversee began playing rugby at 18 as a freshman at UC Santa Barbara, quickly becoming a standout All-American and Pacific Coast Grizzlies selection. His international career with the USA Eagles began in 1988, earning 15 caps through 1996. Leversee represented the USA on multiple international tours and played in the 1991 Rugby World Cup, starting against Italy.

At 6'4" and 235 pounds, Leversee was one of the youngest locks of his era to earn a cap at 24, competing with the world's best he used his great athleticism against bigger opponents. His club career included 10 years with OMBAC, contributing to five national championships, and professional stints in Italy, South Africa, and New Zealand.

After retiring, Leversee became a cornerstone of youth rugby development in San Diego, coaching several teams to Southern California championships and mentoring hundreds of young players. Today, he remains an influential leader in American rugby, embodying the sport's core values both on and off the field.

## 2025 US RUGBY HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE DANITA KNOX



Danita Knox's 40-year rugby journey began at Clemson University in 1985. As a player, she helped build the Atlanta Harlequins into a national powerhouse, leading them to multiple top-four finishes between 1995 and 2005. While her playing career was impressive, Knox's greatest impact has come through her leadership and advocacy for women's rugby.

In 2005, Knox founded the US Women's Rugby Foundation (USWRF), which has grown into the leading advocate for girls' and women's rugby in the U.S., where she continues to serve as President. She also served on the USA Rugby Board (2004–2013), led the formation of Geographic Unions, and created numerous player development programs. In 2017, she helped establish the Women's Rugby Coaches and Referees Association (WRCRA), the premier professional development platform for women in U.S. rugby.

Knox continues to drive youth rugby development through Atlanta Youth Rugby while maintaining a successful career with Hitachi Energy.

# 2025 US RUGBY HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE JILLION POTTER




Jillion Potter's extraordinary rugby career began at the University of New Mexico in 2005. Rapidly rising through the ranks, she earned spots on the USA U19, U23, and Women's National Teams within two years. As a Number 8, Potter earned 21 caps for the USA Eagles 15s (2007– 2014), including the 2014 Women's Rugby World Cup.

In 2012, Potter transitioned to sevens, earning approximately 60 caps and captaining the USA Women's Sevens at the 2016 Rio Olympics, where rugby returned to the Olympic stage. Her career is defined by remarkable resilience, overcoming a broken neck in 2010 and Stage III cancer in 2014 to return to international play.

Beyond playing, Potter has contributed as a coach, referee, and founder of the RAN Leadership Development Scholarship, advancing women's leadership in rugby globally. Her journey remains an inspiring testament to rugby's values of perseverance, leadership, and service to the game.

# 2025 US RUGBY HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE JONE NAQICA




Jone Naqica's rugby career spanned nearly 30 years, beginning at age 5 and culminating in 2014. He earned 8 caps with the USA Eagles 15s (2001–2010), scoring two tries in his debut against England. But Naqica's lasting legacy came in sevens, where he represented the USA from 2001–2010, earning 23 caps and 97 appearances while captaining the side from 2006–2010. Upon retirement, he was USA's all-time leading scorer in sevens with 411 points.

At the club level, Naqica starred for the Denver Barbarians (2001–2006) and San Francisco Golden Gate (2007–2014), winning multiple national titles. He also represented the Pacific Coast Grizzlies and West Mustangs, captaining both sides.

Renowned for his skill, humility, and leadership, Naqica seamlessly transitioned into coaching, helping develop future American players through Eagle Impact Rugby Academy. His playmaking vision, leadership, and record-setting performances continue to influence American rugby today

## 2025 US RUGBY HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE KORT SCHUBERT




Kort Schubert stands among the most accomplished players in American rugby history. Born in 1979, his rise began at Jesuit High School in Sacramento before earning selection to the USA U-19 National Team in 1998. At just 20 years old, Schubert made his senior debut for the USA Eagles in 2000, launching a remarkable eight-year international career that included 49 caps, 17 consecutive tests as captain, and 42 straight international appearances—a record for USA Rugby.

Schubert starred at the 2003 Rugby World Cup in Australia, scoring tries against Fiji, Japan, and France to lead the USA in tournament scoring. A true pioneer, he became one of the first Americans to play professionally in Europe with Northampton Saints and Cardiff Blues, helping open pathways for future U.S. players abroad.

Domestically, Schubert played for Olympic Club and later dedicated himself to coaching at UC Berkeley and Danville Oaks. Inducted into the California Athletics Hall of Fame in 2021, Schubert's legacy continues to elevate American rugby.

## 2025 US RUGBY HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE TONY "TR" RIDNELL



Tony "TR" Ridnell's rugby career spans over five decades, beginning in Australia before continuing in the U.S. at West Point, where he earned honors as Most Valuable Forward in 1982. After graduating, Ridnell balanced military service with rugby, playing for Oklahoma University RFC, Hawaii Harlequins, and the US Combined Services team.

From 1985–1993, Ridnell earned 14 caps for the USA Eagles 15s, competing in both the 1987 and 1991 Rugby World Cups. In sevens, he earned 16 caps from 1989–1993, competing in the Hong Kong Sevens, 1993 Rugby World Cup Sevens, and captaining the USA Cougars.

At the club level, Ridnell helped Old Puget Sound Beach RFC win four National 7s Championships. Off the field, he founded TR International and continues to serve rugby through leadership roles with USA Rugby, the Eagles XVs Club, and as the "Voice of the Seawolves." His lifelong service embodies rugby's core values of leadership, dedication, and advocacy.

#### A LETTER FROM TOM PIRELLI, HALL OF FAME CLASS OF 2024

We are working to **create future generations of US Rugby Hall of Famers** and would like your help. Our simple strategy is to reach out to Physical Education teachers in elementary and middle schools around the country to see if they would be interested in a **flag rugby program as part of their PE curriculum.** 

PE teachers have **responded enthusiastically**. Working in partnership with the MLR, **we have implemented coed flag rugby in 800+ schools, involving 250,000+ kids.** We currently have a backlog of 400 schools wanting to start the program.



The **Youth Rugby Initiative (YRI)** is headed by the **Executive Director, Mike Te'o**. Mike is a veteran of Belmont Shore, the Eagle 7s, Eagle 15s and the San Diego Legion. Mike has worked with hundreds of Physical Education teachers to introduce Flag Rugby to elementary and middle school students.

If you have a son, daughter, grandson or granddaughter in elementary or middle school, a donation of just \$300 would enable YRI to introduce flag rugby to their school's physical education teachers.

In return for your donation, we will put your designated school on our priority implementation list.
