M3 & M6 TIMETABLE CHANGE: hopefully **16 AUGUST**

North Yorkshire Council have told us that the roadworks which have stopped the M6 using its normal route for 3 years will not now be completed on time.

The road will not open until at least mid August. The first day of the M6 'B' timetable is now **expected to be Saturday 16th August**. Until then please continue to use timetable 'A'.

We can only offer our apologies for the inconvenience and disappointment that this will cause to so many of our passengers (as well as the local community in Rosedale). We share your frustration. Watch notices on buses and the web.



Concessionary Pass for 'free travel' please remember to reswipe it every time you get on the bus AND every time the bus changes its service such as in Pickering or Helmsley or when it restarts from its destination.

Moorsbus gets a very low rate for each journey by a pass

holder. This comes from central government (i.e. your taxes) via the local 'Travel Concession Authority' (usually the local council).

It's a complicated process and is *intended* to ensure that bus operators are '*no better off, no worse off*' as a result of accepting passes. As we carry so many older people it's important that we can claim for each journey.

45 YEARS OF MOORS-RIDING

At 10:30 on Sunday 24th August 1980 a red and cream United bus left Loftus depot on the inaugural run of the 'Moorsrider' service over the moors to Hutton le Hole and Pickering.

Master-minded by John Austin, it started something that the following year became known as **Moorsbus** and has carried thousands of people to the North York Moors ever since.

We answer some of the questions you've raised through the survey forms, via social media, or simply by asking us...

▲ Fantastic service, opens up more opportunities for walks on the moors. We love it. However, restricted to the 11:52 depart and 4.30 return to Castleton. Would prefer an early morning (8-9am) and later (7 -8pm) services for longer trips. (YO21)

This year, the lack of bus operators from Teesside has made things very difficult. Giving you a start at 8 - 9 am would mean a start from Stockton at 7 - 8am, or 6.30 to 7.30 from Darlington which is where we've usually started our M3 bus.


And your later return of 7 - 8pm, would mean a return to Darlington at 8.30 to 9.30pm. Not only would that be a very early start (and finish) for any passengers from Darlington or Stockton, but we've also got to work within very strict regulations regarding the length of working day for drivers, as well as rest breaks and actual driving time. What's great for someone may be a real problem for someone else. ▲ I'd like to make a donation and need your bank details. (YO32)

Mo Penson has been our Moorsbus contact and part time publicist in the Thirsk area for a number of years. She has lots of timetables which she takes to the Thirsk Tourist information centre, the Thirsk library, to the motor homes' site on the racecourse when there aren't any race-dates - and to as many caravan sites as possible in the area.

"When I call into the caravan sites I always try to speak to the site warden and explain how useful it would be if he/ she would be kind enough to pass a timetable to each of the residents or visitors so that they knew how to see and visit the various areas by bus rather than use their cars - and at a very low cost. "I tell them (and everyone I meet elsewhere - I always carry some

United number 6151 was one of 10 Bristol buses delivered to the company in July and August 1972. As well as being the first 'Moorsrider, it ran on the 128 route between Scarborough and Helmsley in the 1970s from its depot in Scarborough. Apparently it was in service for only 11 years as it was scrapped in 1983.

The body (a Panorama Elite III) had been built by Plaxton's in Scarborough so it spent most of its life near the seaside town.

Plaxton's was originally a joinery business in Scarborough , established in 1907 and which branched out into building car bodies and then, from the late 1920s, coaches.

It is now part of the Alexander Dennis group and if you're a regular Moorsbus rider you'll see the Alexander Dennis brand on many of the buses we use. Who said bus-spotting wasn't cool?
