There are lots of options but here we've chosen just six straight-forward trips for you to enjoy.

£1 single journey for children & young people (5 to 18)

**All-day Moors Rover tickets £10**

(£3 child; £15 family). Single fares start at £1.

## 1. Saturdays to Sutton Bank (30 mins) & Helmsley (1 hr)

**11:13** leave Rosedale Abbey on Moorbus M6 to Wrelton

**11:30** get off at Wrelton

**11:46** catch bus 28 to Helmsley

**12:16** arrive in Helmsley *cross over the road to the co-op*

**12:22** catch Moorsbus M4 from the co-op to Sutton Bank

**12:35** arrive Sutton Bank

*The National Park Visitor Centre has displays, café, toilets and trails. James Herriot's 'Finest View in England' is a short stroll from the bus stop. You'll see the site of the Battle of Byland (1322) between England and Scotland.*

**13:09** depart Sutton Bank on Moorsbus M4 to Helmsley

**13:22** arrive in Helmsley

*Helmsley is a thriving market town with many good shops, cafes, tea rooms and pubs. Toilets are just off the Market Square in Borogate. Medieval castle (English Heritage). Helmsley Walled Garden (café & toilets). National Centre for Birds of Prey is in the grounds of Duncombe Park.*

**14:30** catch EY 28 (Monument bus stop) to Pickering

**15:08** arrive in Pickering

**15:45** catch the Moorsbus M6 to Rosedale Abbey

**16:09** arrive in Rosedale Abbey

## 2. Saturdays to Danby (2hrs) & Pickering (2hrs)

**10:09** leave Rosedale Abbey on Moorsbus M6 to Danby

*The bus climbs onto the high moors, passing the Millennium Stone and Ralph Cross before descending into the Esk Valley*

**10:39** arrive at Danby Lodge National Park Centre

*At Danby Lodge you'll find exhibitions, an art gallery, shop, café, toilets, picnic and play areas. Free admission.*

**12:43** leave Danby Lodge on Moorsbus M3 to Pickering

**13:38** arrive in Pickering

**15:45** leave Pickering on Moorsbus M6 to Rosedale Abbey

**16:09** arrive Rosedale Abbey

## 3. Sundays & Bank Holidays to Hutton le Hole (3hrs) & Danby (1hr)

**11:13** leave Rosedale Abbey on Moorsbus M6 to Pickering

**11:37** arrive Pickering *(wait at the bus stop by the library)*

**11:45** leave Pickering on Moorsbus M3 to Hutton le Hole *(the bus leaves from the stop where you got off)*

**12:08** arrive Hutton le Hole

*The picturesque village has a pub, toilets, tea rooms and craft workshops. The Ryedale Folk Museum is an award winning open-air museum with 20 historic buildings set in a 6 acre site. Exhibits range from a reconstructed Iron Age hut to a medieval manor house, with cottages, workshops and even a photographic studio.*

**15:08** leave Hutton le Hole on Moorsbus M3 to Danby

Your journey is over the central moorlands, passing the isolated Lion Inn before reaching Ralph Cross where you can see a panorama of the Cleveland Hills and out to the North Sea. The route then drops down into the Esk Valley, passing through the villages of Castleton and Danby before arriving at the National Park Centre.

**15:40** arrive Danby

**16:43** leave Danby on Moorsbus M6 to Rosedale

**17:13** arrive Rosedale Abbey

## 4. Sundays & Bank Holidays to Scarborough

**11:13** leave Rosedale Abbey on Moorsbus M6 to Pickering

**11:37** arrive Pickering

*You've just over half an hour in Pickering. Time for a coffee?*

**12:15** catch Bus 28 to Scarborough from the co-op side of The Ropery

**13:13** arrive in Scarborough

**14:40** leave Scarborough on Bus 28 from near Scarborough Railway Station

**15:36** arrive in Pickering

**15:45** catch Moorsbus M6 to Rosedale (from outside the library)

**16:09** arrive Rosedale Abbey

## 5. Sundays & Bank Holidays to Kirkbymoorside & Helmsley

**11:13** leave Rosedale Abbey on Moorsbus M6 to Pickering

**11:37** arrive Pickering

**11:45** leave Pickering on Moorsbus M3 to Kirkbymoorside *(Catch the bus outside Pickering library)*

**12:00** arrive Kirkbymoorside

*An hour in Kirkbymoorside to explore the shops or have a ea or coffee (or lunch) at one of the cafes or pubs. Toilets are in the Town End Farm Car Park towards the top of the Market Place.*

**13:01** catch Bus 28 to Helmsley from outside Wainds the butchers on Piercy End *(the other side of the road where you got off the M3)*

**13:21** arrive Helmsley

*Just over an hour to enjoy some of the charm of Helmsley—its castle, walled garden, shops, cafes and pubs. Toilets are just off the Market Place in Borogate.*

**14:30** leave Helmsley on Bus 28 to Pickering

**15:11** arrive Pickering

**15:45** leave Pickering on Moorsbus M6 to Rosedale

**16:09** arrive in Rosedale Abbey
