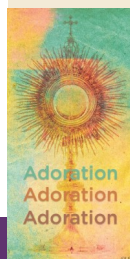

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Easter season is over, but the special celebrations continue! This weekend, we're enjoying a time of reflection on the mystery of the Blessed Trinity: the truth revealed in Jesus Christ that God is both one and three. One divine nature, three divine persons.

This truth of our faith can seem a bit abstract, to the point that we sometimes wonder why we dedicate a whole Sunday every year to reflecting on it. The reason, of course, is that the Trinity lies at both the core of our faith and the core of our prayer. It's easy to see why this truth is at the core of the faith: the Creed we say each Sunday proclaims it, and we know that to profess the truth that Jesus is Lord is to profess the truth of the Trinity. But maybe it's harder to see why the Trinity is at the core of our prayer—our relationship with God.

Some years ago, I received great advice from a spiritual director that helped me bring the mystery of the Trinity into my own prayer. He suggested that I become aware of which Person of the Trinity I was praying to whenever I prayed. Very simple, but very profound. So often, we pray to God as an impersonal heavenly blob, without awareness of the Person or Persons we're speaking to. But when you pay attention to the Person, prayer truly becomes more personal. You experience God not just as a "power" that's "out there," but as a Father, a Son, and a Spirit with different personalities and ways of working within us.

So give it a try in your prayer this week! Especially as this weekend's celebration of Father's Day brings family relationships to mind (a happy Father's Day to all dads!), let's be inspired and enriched by the even deeper relationships among the Persons of the Trinity. Through the intercession of Blessed Mary, Ever-Virgin, and our holy patron St. Thomas, let's come to appreciate anew the heart of our faith that they knew so well from personal experience.

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo:

El tiempo de Pascua ha terminado, pero las celebraciones especiales continúan. Este fin de semana, disfrutaremos de un tiempo de reflexión sobre el misterio de la Santísima Trinidad: la verdad revelada en Jesucristo de que Dios es uno y trino. Una naturaleza divina, tres personas divinas.

Esta verdad de nuestra fe puede parecer un poco abstracta, hasta el punto de que a veces nos preguntamos por qué dedicamos un domingo entero cada año a reflexionar sobre ella. La razón, por supuesto, es que la Trinidad es el núcleo tanto de nuestra fe como de nuestra oración. Es fácil ver por qué esta verdad es el núcleo de la fe: el Credo que rezamos cada domingo la proclama, y sabemos que profesar la verdad de que Jesús es el Señor es profesar la verdad de la Trinidad. Pero quizás sea más difícil ver por qué la Trinidad es el núcleo de nuestra oración: nuestra relación con Dios.

Hace algunos años, recibí un gran consejo de un director espiritual que me ayudó a incorporar el misterio de la Trinidad a mi propia oración. Me sugirió que tomara conciencia de a qué Persona de la Trinidad le estaba rezando cada vez que oraba. Muy simple, pero muy profundo. A menudo, oramos a Dios como una mancha celestial impersonal, sin ser conscientes de la Persona o Personas a las que nos dirigimos. Pero cuando prestas atención a la Persona, la oración se vuelve verdaderamente más personal. Experimentas a Dios no solo como un "poder" que está "ahí fuera", sino como un Padre, un Hijo y un Espíritu con diferentes personalidades y maneras de obrar en nosotros.

¡Así que inténtalo en tu oración esta semana! Especialmente porque la celebración del Día del Padre este fin de semana nos trae a la mente las relaciones familiares (¡feliz Día del Padre a todos los papás!), dejémonos inspirar y enriquecer por las relaciones aún más profundas entre las Personas de la Trinidad. Por la intercesión de la Santísima Virgen María y nuestro santo patrón, Santo Tomás, revaloricemos la esencia de nuestra fe que ellos conocieron tan bien por experiencia propia.
