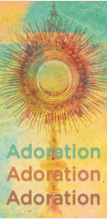

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

There's a lot of energy in the air right now at St. Thomas! God has truly blessed our community, and I'm so grateful to be with the people of this parish in this season of growth and mission.

Our Gospel reading this week is a tricky one, but that I think makes a lot of sense if we think about it in terms of stewardship. We're not officially into our Stewardship Month of October yet, but with a parable about a steward, the message is a clear one. It tells the story of a steward (basically, a mid-level manager in a company) who gets told that he's about to lose his job. Since he doesn't have a retirement plan, he uses the weeks from when he gets notice to when he actually is fired to make sure that he does good in his community, so that in the future others will remember the good he did. And then, unexpectedly, his boss finds out about and just kind of laughs: "Yeah, that was dumb for me to leave you in charge. I'd have done the exact same thing in your situation, so I can't really blame you."

The analogy for us today is pretty clear. For us, everything we have—our material resources, our time, our talents, everything—is limited to the short few years of our lives. But we can use those gifts we have to prepare for us and others to have eternal life. Like Jesus says, "Make friends for yourselves with [earthly] wealth, so that when it fails you will be welcomed into eternal dwellings."

Since we're on the subject of stewardship, I'd like to take a moment to highlight one particular opportunity for generosity that's very important to our Diocese: the annual Catholic Charities and Communities campaign. For those who are new to our area, or who are new to the Catholic Church, this drive is the annual appeal from our Bishop to support the major Catholic ministries and social services in our area. There are lots of national organizations out there with similar names, but this particular campaign is purely local: the money stays here. When you hear about our Diocese helping out victims of tornados or providing food to refugees, much of that funding comes through our Catholic Charities campaign. I would add that we receive a lot of our funding for the Campus Ministry through Catholic Charities. It's an exceptionally worthwhile charity that makes a huge difference for people right here in Alabama.

You should be receiving a letter and pledge card about it from the Diocese very soon, and I would encourage everyone to prayerfully consider being part of it this year. Last year, our parish raised almost \$60,000 for this campaign. Many thanks to everyone who took part. Your generosity continues to make a difference for so many people in need. We'll talk about it at Mass next Sunday, as well, plus have pledge cards available for anyone who didn't receive them in the mail.

Thank you to everyone for the many ways that you look out for the needs of our parish, our Church, and our neighbors. Through the intercession of St. Thomas and Blessed Mary, Ever-Virgin, let's continue to be committed to service of the Lord and each other.

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo:

¡Se siente un gran entusiasmo en el ambiente aquí en Santo Tomás! Dios ha bendecido verdaderamente a nuestra comunidad, y estoy muy agradecido de poder caminar con el pueblo de esta parroquia en este tiempo de crecimiento y de misión.

El Evangelio de este domingo es uno de esos pasajes que pueden parecer difíciles, pero creo que se entienden muy bien si los leemos desde la perspectiva de la corresponsabilidad cristiana. Todavía no hemos llegado oficialmente a nuestro Mes de la Corresponsabilidad en octubre, pero tratándose de una parábola sobre un administrador, el mensaje es bastante claro. Jesús cuenta la historia de un administrador (algo así como un gerente intermedio en una empresa) que recibe la noticia de que está a punto de perder su trabajo. Como no tiene plan de retiro, aprovecha el tiempo entre para ganarse el aprecio de la gente: condona deudas, hace favores, ayuda a quienes puede, de modo que, cuando ya no tenga empleo, otros lo recuerden por el bien que hizo. Y entonces, inesperadamente, su jefe se entera y simplemente se ríe: “Sí, fue un error dejarte a cargo. Pero, siendo sincero, yo habría hecho lo mismo en tu situación, así que no puedo culparte”.

La enseñanza para nosotros hoy es bastante directa. Todo lo que tenemos—nuestros bienes materiales, nuestro tiempo, nuestros talentos, todo—nos ha sido confiado solo por unos pocos años de vida. Pero podemos usar esos dones para preparar el camino, para que tanto nosotros como los demás podamos alcanzar la vida eterna. Como dice Jesús: “Gánense amigos con el dinero de este mundo, para que, cuando este falte, los reciban en las moradas eternas”.

Ya que estamos hablando de corresponsabilidad, quiero hablar de una oportunidad concreta de generosidad que es muy importante para nuestra Diócesis: la campaña anual de Caridades y Comunidades Católicas. Para quienes son nuevos en la zona o nuevos en la Iglesia Católica, esta campaña es la colecta anual que hace nuestro obispo para sostener los principales ministerios y servicios sociales católicos en nuestra región. Existen muchas organizaciones nacionales con nombres parecidos, pero esta campaña en particular es completamente local: el dinero se queda aquí. Cuando escuchan que nuestra Diócesis está ayudando a víctimas de tornados o distribuyendo comida a personas refugiadas, gran parte de esa ayuda viene de nuestra campaña de Caridades Católicas. Además, muchos de los fondos que recibimos para el Ministerio Universitario provienen también de ahí. Es una obra sumamente valiosa que realmente transforma la vida de muchas personas aquí mismo en Alabama.

Muy pronto deberían recibir una carta y una tarjeta de compromiso de parte de la Diócesis, y los invito a todos a considerar en oración participar este año. El año pasado, nuestra parroquia recaudó casi \$60,000 para esta campaña. Muchas gracias a todos los que colaboraron: su generosidad sigue marcando la diferencia para tantas personas necesitadas. También hablaremos de la campaña en la Misa del próximo domingo y tendremos tarjetas disponibles para quienes no las reciban por correo.

Gracias a todos ustedes por las muchas maneras en que cuidan las necesidades de nuestra parroquia, de nuestra Iglesia y de nuestros hermanos y hermanas. Que por la intercesión de Santo Tomás y de la Bienaventurada María, siempre Virgen, sigamos firmes en nuestro compromiso de servir al Señor y de servirnos unos a otros.
