Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This Sunday, we celebrate another special feast day that only falls on a Sunday every seven years: the feast of the dedication of the Basilica of St. John Lateran, the cathedral church for the city of Rome. It might seem like an unusual celebration, but the readings make the idea very clear. The church buildings where we pray and worship are a sacramental sign of what we as believers are being made into: the Temple of the Living God, where the Holy Spirit dwells (I Cor 3:16). We have visible churches, because as creatures with bodies we need a physical space to worship, so that our souls can come closer to God. A beautiful church lifts up the heart, to help us be joined more closely to the worship that even now takes place in heaven.

With that idea in mind, it's a sign of God's providence that this weekend we are unveiling the parish's updated site master plan, with a beautiful vision for a new church, a columbarium, expanded parking, and a separate school building for when we need it. We've been discerning the details of this for over four years, with conversations about the parish's needs and dreams and future. I truly believe we have a plan we will be excited about, and it also provides us with a goal to focus on as a community for the next few years.

The heart of this new plan, of course, is the new church. Every time I look at the concept images, I'm amazed by how it brings together every thread of our community's conversations over many years and addresses all of the things we need to address. Seats and parking for our growing community. A layout that adds capacity while keeping our community gathered closely around the altar. A worship space that balances modern conveniences with the beauty of Catholic worship. A style that is dignified without being excessive or over-the-top. I've spent a lot of time on my knees as we've developed this, and I'm convinced that this plan is the best way to meet our parish's needs for generations to come.

Of course, it's never easy to do something worth doing. Building this new church and parking area will probably be the hardest thing our parish has ever done. We're going to have to pull together to gather the resources we'll need to do it, and it's going to be a marathon. This is our task, the moment when our community is invited to come together and sacrifice and be built both visibly and invisibly into the one People of God in our place and time. You'll be seeing and hearing a lot about the work we need to do to make this happen. But for now, in this space, I'd like to celebrate the moment. We have inherited the gift of a solid foundation, from the generations before us who worked and sacrificed to get us to where we are today. And through the continued intercession of Mary, the Mother of the Church, and St Thomas the Apostle, I have every confidence that we will continue being built into the Temple of God, both visibly and spiritually

Queridos hermanos y hermanas,

Este domingo celebramos una fiesta muy especial que solamente cae en domingo aproximadamente cada siete años: la fiesta de la Dedicación de la Basílica de San Juan de Letrán, la catedral de la ciudad de Roma. Las lecturas explican el sentido de esta fiesta muy claramente. Los templos donde nos reunimos para orar y adorar a Dios son un signo de lo que nosotros, como creyentes, estamos llamados a llegar a ser: el Templo del Dios Viviente, donde habita el Espíritu Santo (1 Cor 3,16). Tenemos iglesias visibles porque, como criaturas corporales, necesitamos un lugar físico, para que nuestra alma pueda acercarse más a Dios. Una iglesia hermosa eleva el corazón, para ayudarnos a unirnos más íntimamente al culto que ya tiene lugar en el cielo.

Con esta idea en mente, es un signo de la providencia de Dios que este fin de semana estemos presentando el plan maestro actualizado de la parroquia, con una visión hermosa para un nuevo templo, un columbario, estacionamiento ampliado y un edificio escolar independientemente cuando sea necesario. Hemos estado discerniendo los detalles de esto por más de cuatro años, conversando acerca de las necesidades, los sueños y el futuro de la parroquia. Creo sinceramente que tenemos un plan que nos entusiasmará, y que además nos brinda una meta clara para orientar nuestro trabajo comunitario durante los próximos años. El corazón de este nuevo plan, por supuesto, es el nuevo templo. Cada vez que veo las imágenes conceptuales, me impresiona cómo logra reunir todos los hilos de nuestras conversaciones a lo largo de muchos años y aborda todo lo que necesitamos resolver. Asientos y estacionamiento para nuestra comunidad creciente. Una distribución que aumenta la capacidad manteniéndonos reunidos cercanamente alrededor del altar. Un espacio litúrgico que equilibra las comodidades modernas con la belleza del culto católico. Un estilo digno sin ser excesivo. He pasado mucho tiempo de rodillas mientras desarrollábamos esto, y estoy convencido de que este plan es el mejor camino para responder a las necesidades de nuestra parroquia por generaciones.

Por supuesto, nunca es fácil realizar algo que vale la pena. Construir este nuevo templo y el estacionamiento será, probablemente, la obra más difícil que nuestra parroquia haya emprendido. Tendremos que unir fuerzas para reunir los recursos necesarios, y va a ser una carrera de distancia, no un sprint. Esta es nuestra misión: el momento en que nuestra comunidad está siendo llamada a unirnos, a sacrificar, y a ser edificada como el único Pueblo de Dios, aquí y ahora.

En las próximas semanas estaremos viendo y escuchando mucho acerca del trabajo necesario para lograrlo. Pero por ahora, en este momento, quiero simplemente celebrar lo que Dios está haciendo. Hemos heredado el don de un fundamento sólido, de generaciones antes de nosotros que trabajaron y se sacrificaron para llevarnos hasta este punto. Y, por la constante intercesión de María, Madre de la Iglesia, y de nuestro patrono Santo Tomás Apóstol, tengo plena confianza en que seguiremos siendo edificados como el Templo de Dios, visible y espiritualmente
