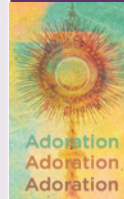

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Visitors to Catholic churches this time of year often ask: why are we singing Christmas songs after Christmas? Since we'll still be singing carols this week and next, this is a good time to answer that question.

Outside the Church, Christmas is often a secular season of materialism and consumer goods, that's basically finished when the gifts are opened. But for Catholics, Christmas is a season of joy and fulfillment at the birth of Christ, that follows our Advent time of waiting. How long does a family celebrate a newborn child? As we all know, for a very long time—and the Church does the same for the birth of Jesus.

In the Church's calendar, the Christmas celebrations go for about two weeks—that's where we get the old idea of the "12 Days of Christmas." Christmas Day (December 25) celebrates Jesus' birth; the Sunday after Christmas (December 30) celebrates the Holy Family in Bethlehem; the next Sunday (January 4) marks the visit of the Wise Men; and the Sunday after that (January 11) celebrates Jesus' baptism by John the Baptist. Basically, the Christmas season celebrates the entirety of the Lord's childhood and early years.

I'd encourage everyone to take advantage of our 12+ Days of Christmas in your own families and prayers. Enjoy saying "Merry Christmas" to everyone you meet, since Christmas is too big of a feast to be celebrated in one day! May we all experience the joy of the intercession of Mary, the Mother of God, and our patron St. Thomas in this holy season.

Queridos hermanos y hermanas,

Los visitantes en las iglesias católicas en esta parte del año a menudo preguntan: ¿por qué cantamos canciones navideñas después de Navidad? Dado que cantaremos esas canciones este fin de semana y en el siguiente, es un buen momento para responder esa pregunta.

Fuera de la Iglesia, la Navidad es a menudo una temporada secular de materialismo, que básicamente termina cuando se abren los regalos. Pero para los católicos, la Navidad es una temporada de alegría en el nacimiento de Cristo, que sigue al tiempo de espera de Adviento. ¿Cuánto tiempo una familia celebra a un niño recién nacido? Como todos sabemos, mucho tiempo, y la Iglesia hace lo mismo con el nacimiento de Jesús.

En el calendario de la Iglesia, las celebraciones navideñas duran aproximadamente dos semanas; ahí es donde obtenemos la tradición de los “12 días de Navidad.” El día de Navidad (25 de diciembre) celebra el nacimiento de Jesús; el domingo después de Navidad (29 de diciembre) se celebra la Sagrada Familia en Belén; el próximo domingo (5 de enero) marca la visita de los Reyes Magos; y el domingo siguiente (12 de enero) se celebra el bautismo de Jesús por Juan el Bautista. La temporada de Navidad celebra la totalidad de la infancia y los primeros años del Señor.

Animo a todos a que aprovechen nuestros 12+ días de Navidad en sus propias familias y oraciones. Que digamos “Feliz Navidad” a todos los que conozca, ya que la Navidad es una fiesta demasiado grande para celebrarla en un día. Y que experimentemos la alegría de la intercesión de María, la Madre de Dios, y nuestro patrón Santo Tomás en esta temporada santa.
