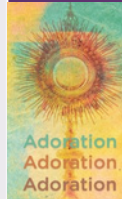

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

There are just a few days to go until Lent! Ash Wednesday is this Wednesday, February the 18th. Our Masses for the day will be at 6am (bilingual), 9am (English), 5pm (English), and 7pm (bilingual). We will be doing Mass both in the main church and the parish hall at 7pm, to make sure we can accommodate everyone. Please be sure to take a look at our Lenten program flyers in the bulletin this week (and available in the gathering space throughout Lent).

For this week, I'd like to provide a brief run-down on the way the Church's disciplines of fasting and abstinence work. The details of how this works can be a bit confusing, so it will hopefully be helpful to go over them a bit.

First, fasting. There are two days every Lent where all Catholics from the ages of 18 to 59 are required to fast (if you're medically able): Ash Wednesday (February 18) and Good Friday (April 3). In canon law, this is defined as only taking a single full meal at some point during the day. We're also allowed two light snacks throughout the day, but the total amount eaten shouldn't add up to a full meal. For example, you might eat a normal lunch, but keep breakfast to a banana and have an evening snack of a granola bar. A lot of people like to completely fast on those days (by not eating anything), but that's not required. There's nothing wrong with needing to keep your blood sugar and energy levels up enough to be able to focus on work or school. And be sure to drink plenty of water when fasting—water isn't covered by the fasting rules. Coffee or tea without any milk or sugar are considered the same as water for the purposes of the fast.

Second, abstinence. When talking about Lent, what this means is that all Catholics who are at least 14 years old are asked to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays during Lent. This means no beef, pork, chicken, or other animal meats. That said, the Church doesn't require us to go completely vegan on those days: things like eggs, milk, and butter are OK. That said, I would recommend following the spirit of the fast and trying to keep things simple on days of abstinence.

In our modern world, these kinds of rules can seem old-fashioned, but I think there's a lot we can learn by not just following them begrudgingly but rather embracing them. Everyone who becomes a saint starts somewhere, and walking the Lenten journey by sharing some of the basic disciplines with our brothers and sisters is a well-traveled path. Through the prayers of Our Lady and St. Thomas, let's ask God to help us embrace the spirit of this season of the Cross, so that together we will come to the joys of the Resurrection.

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

¡Faltan pocos días hasta que llegamos a la Cuaresma! El Miércoles de Ceniza es este miércoles 5 de marzo. Nuestras misas de ese día serán a las 6am (bilingüe), a las 9am (inglés), a las 5pm (inglés) y a las 7pm (bilingüe). Celebraremos la misa en la iglesia principal y en el salón parroquial a las 7pm, para asegurarnos de que podamos acomodar a todos. Asegúrese de echar un vistazo a los flyers de Cuaresma, que son disponibles en el espacio de reunión durante la Cuaresma.

Para esta semana, me gustaría hacer un breve resumen sobre cómo funcionan las disciplinas de ayuno y abstinencia de la Iglesia. Los detalles suelen ser un poco confusos, por lo que espero que sea útil repasarlos un poco.

Primero, el ayuno. Hay dos días cada Cuaresma en los que todos los católicos de entre 18 y 59 años deben ayunar (si lo puedes medicamente): Miércoles de Ceniza (18 de febrero) y Viernes Santo (3 de abril). Esto se define como tomar una sola comida completa durante el día de ayuno. También se nos permiten dos refrigerios ligeros ("snacks") durante el día, pero la cantidad total no debe sumar una comida completa. Por ejemplo, puedes comer un almuerzo normal, pero limitarte a desayunar una banana y tomar una barra de granola como refrigerio por la noche. A muchas personas les gusta ayunar completamente esos días (sin comer nada), pero eso no es obligatorio. No hay nada de malo en mantener tu nivel de energía lo suficientemente alto como para poder concentrarte en el trabajo o la escuela. Y asegúrate de beber mucha agua durante el ayuno; el agua no está cubierta por las reglas del ayuno. El café o el té sin leche ni azúcar se consideran lo mismo que el agua para los fines del ayuno.

En segundo lugar, la abstinencia. Cuando hablamos de Cuaresma, lo que esto significa es que a todos los católicos que tengan al menos 14 años se les pide que se abstengan de comer carne el Miércoles de Ceniza, el Viernes Santo y todos los viernes durante la Cuaresma. Esto significa nada de carne de animales. Dicho esto, la Iglesia no nos exige que nos volvamos completamente veganos en esos días: cosas como huevos, leche y mantequilla están bien. Dicho esto, yo recomendaría seguir el espíritu del ayuno y tratar de mantener las cosas simples en los días de abstinencia.

En nuestro mundo moderno, este tipo de reglas pueden parecer anticuadas, pero creo que hay mucho que podemos aprender no solo siguiéndolas a regañadientes, sino abrazándolas. Todo aquel que se convierte en santo comienza en alguna parte, y recorrer el camino de la Cuaresma compartiendo algunas de las disciplinas básicas con nuestros hermanos y hermanas es un camino bien transitado. A través de las oraciones de Nuestra Señora y Santo Tomás, pidamos a Dios que nos ayude a abrazar el espíritu de esta temporada de la Cruz, para que juntos lleguemos a las alegrías de la Resurrección.
