PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we begin the Lenten season together, I thought I would take the next few weeks in this space to discuss the basic disciplines of Lent: the way they help us offer a sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to God. For this week, I wanted to spend some time talking about how the three classic practices (prayer, fasting, and generosity) work together to bring us closer to God.

The classic point of reference on these practices in the Catholic tradition is from St. Peter Chrysologus, who was the bishop of Ravenna (an important city in Italy) from 433 to 450 A.D. He was especially admired as a preacher—and he had the great skill of being able to say what he needed to say without going on for too long! In a particularly memorable homily, he once said: “There are three things, my brothers and sisters, by which faith stands firm, devotion remains constant, and virtue endures. They are prayer, fasting and mercy. Prayer knocks at the door, fasting obtains, mercy receives. Prayer, mercy and fasting: these three are one, and they give life to each other. Fasting is the soul of prayer, almsgiving is the lifeblood of fasting. Let no one try to separate them; they cannot be separated.”

I think everyone who's embraced these three practices together will agree with the saint that they work together in an amazing way to bring God's strength into our lives. With prayer, we knock on the doors of heaven. With fasting, we open the entirety of our lives to the Lord's power, by embracing our own weakness. And with generosity (also called almsgiving), we find ourselves becoming instruments of God's goodness towards others.

Through the prayers of Our Lady and St. Thomas, let's ask God to help us embrace the gift of the holy season of Lent and offer the Lord a worthy sacrifice of praise.

Primera Lectura: (Génesis 2:7-9; 3:1-7)

Dios crea al hombre y lo pone en el Edén con libertad para comer de todo menos del árbol del conocimiento, pero la serpiente engaña a la mujer y ambos desobedecen al comer del fruto prohibido.

Salmo Responsorial (Salmo 51 3-4, 5-6, 12-13, 17)

El salmista reconoce su pecado, admite que ha fallado contra Dios, pide ser renovado con un corazón limpio y un espíritu firme, y afirma que Dios valora un corazón quebrantado y arrepentido.

Segunda Lectura: (Romanos 5:12-19)

Pablo explica que el pecado y la muerte entraron al mundo por un solo hombre, Adán, pero la gracia y la vida vienen por un solo hombre, Jesucristo, cuya obediencia trae justificación para muchos.

Evangelio: (Mateo 4:1-11)

Jesús es tentado por el diablo en el desierto después de ayunar cuarenta días, pero resiste cada tentación usando la Palabra de Dios y permanece fiel al Padre.

CARTA DEL SACERDOTE

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

Al comenzar juntos la Cuaresma, pensé en dedicar las próximas semanas en este espacio a hablar sobre las disciplinas básicas de la Cuaresma: cómo nos ayudan a ofrecer un sacrificio de alabanza y acción de gracias a Dios. Esta semana, quería dedicar un tiempo a hablar sobre cómo las tres prácticas clásicas (oración, ayuno y generosidad) se complementan para acercarnos a Dios.

El referente clásico sobre estas prácticas en la tradición católica proviene de San Pedro Crisólogo, obispo de Rávena (una importante ciudad de Italia) del 433 al 450 d.C. Fue especialmente admirado como predicador, y tenía la gran habilidad de decir lo que necesitaba decir sin extenderse demasiado. En una homilía particularmente memorable, dijo una vez: “Hay tres cosas, hermanos y hermanas, por las que la fe se mantiene firme, la devoción permanece constante y prácticamente perdura. Son la oración, el ayuno y la misericordia. La oración llama a la puerta, el ayuno obtiene, la misericordia recibe. Oración, misericordia y ayuno: estos tres son uno y se dan vida mutuamente.

El ayuno es el alma de la oración, la limosna es la savia del ayuno. Que nadie intente separarlos; no se pueden separar.”

Creo que todos los que han abrazado estas tres prácticas juntas estarán de acuerdo con el santo en que trabajan estas de una manera asombrosa para traer la fuerza de Dios a nuestras vidas. Con la oración, llamamos a las puertas del cielo. Con el ayuno, abrimos toda nuestra vida al poder del Señor, al abrazar nuestra propia debilidad. Y con la generosidad (también llamada limosna), nos convertimos en instrumentos de la bondad de Dios hacia los demás.

A través de las oraciones de Nuestra Señora y Santo Tomás, pidamos a Dios que nos ayude a abrazar el don del santo tiempo de Cuaresma y a ofrecer al Señor un digno sacrificio de alabanza.
