Maths

This term we have been working on **number and place value** as well as **addition and subtraction**.

Over the Christmas break we would like you to do as much '**real life**' Maths as possible. Count as many things as you can e.g brussel sprouts on your dinner, houses you see with Christmas lights or the amount of times you hear a Christmas song —what is the highest number you can get to?

Where possible use your addition and subtractions skills. If 4 people live in your house and 3 more are coming for dinner, how many plates will you need?

If there are 12 chocolates in a bowl and you have eaten 3, how many are left?

You can also log on to **My Maths** to complete some activities .



Phonics

This term we have been learning **Phase 5 Phonics**.

Attached to this sheet are all the sounds that we have learnt (highlighted with a rectangle—some are still to learn)


Over the holidays practise the sounds. You could use them in some writing or look out for them as you read.

The common exception words we have been learning are also attached. You could also look out for these as you read or make up your own game using the words.

You could make a snap game, hide some words to find or even have a spelling race with someone at home.

Topic

In the Spring Term for **History**, we will be exploring timelines. We will be looking at the life of **David Attenborough**. In preparation for this, we would like you to start thinking about your own timeline. Talk to someone at home, what significant events have happened in your life so far? e.g birth of a sibling, first holiday, attended a wedding. Although we don't need them yet you could also start looking at some photographs to bring in later in the term.




Reading


Please try and remember to read your book for 10 minutes everyday.
