Supporting Your Child's Learning

Whole School Development of 'Phonological Awareness'

This week, the children have once again been focusing on the following skill: **"Deleting Syllables"**. This means getting rid of one (or more) syllables within a word and then saying the rest.



Here are some ideas to help children delete syllables in words:

Younger children

Stick to 2 syllable words, and start with compound words (two words grouped together to make a new word e.g. 'tea-pot', 'tooth-brush', 'train-track') as younger children find these the most easy to break apart. First, ask your child to clap the syllables (to make sure they get this bit right), then ask them to "take away the first syllable / last syllable". You can hold up 2 fingers and use these to help show them ☐

Older children

Choose a word with multiple syllables, like "butterfly" or "happily." Have your child say the word and then ask them "what word would you get if you delete the first / middle / last syllable". For instance, for "but-ter-fly," you could delete "but" and end up with "ter-fly."

“Be Not Afraid of Greatness”

Much Ado About Nothing
by Holbeach Primary School
at The Albany, 13th November 2025
appraised by Iain Jones

It is an absolute delight, in our 25th anniversary year, to be celebrating with Holbeach Primary School and to be marking this milestone with their wonderful production of Much Ado About Nothing as part of Shakespeare Schools Theatre Festival's autumn season. Here are some of my highlights from the performance at The Albany.

This Company, comprising of Years 4, 5, and 6 took on a mature story with remarkable confidence and creativity. The production didn't shy away from the play's big themes of deceit and trickery, drawing the audience into a vibrant, busy, and wonderfully gossipy world. This was perfectly captured in the ball scene which sparkled with brilliant masks, fancy dancing, and a sense of joyful playfulness.

What a brilliant idea to reimagine the narrators as announcers inside an ingenious TV set. This clever device gave the show a modern twist, reminiscent of Gogglebox. The announcers commented on the unfolding drama, filled in the backstory, and even tried to shout through the screen when things went wrong! This was an inventive and funny way to keep the audience engaged while making the story feel accessible and fresh.

Visually, the production was vibrant and detailed. The costumes added colour and character. The Police looked suitably official in their hats, Don Pedro's military jacket gleamed with epaulettes, the Friar's robe lent gravitas, the announcers looked very showy in pink and blue jackets, and Hero's wedding dress and veil were simply stunning. The wedding scene itself was dramatic and powerful, with Hero's fainting moment drawing shocked gasps from a stunned audience.

The company showed great skill in reimaging the language. This helped to make the plot relevant without losing its traditional flavour. The young cast delivered their lines with clarity and confidence, ensuring the story was easy to follow. Don John was splendidly evil, while Dogberry's hilarious mix-ups, particularly his instruction to “stay vegetarian” instead of “stay vigilant” had the audience in stitches. One TV announcer's quip about needing marshmallows “for when it all goes up in flames” was another memorable modern touch. Accompanied by a romantic soundtrack, the entire performance balanced humour and heart beautifully. This was a lively, imaginative take on this timeless comedy from a talented young company.

Performances like this show us that Shakespeare can live on, in the hands of young people, in fresh, exciting and reimagined ways. We hope to welcome you back to Shakespeare Schools Theatre Festival for another 25 years - and beyond!
