Where is it?

- Kenya is on the continent of Africa.
- Its capital city is Nairobi.
- It has borders with Somalia, Ethiopia, South Sudan, Uganda, Tanzania and the Indian Ocean.

What sights might you see?

- Mount Kenya is the highest mountain in Kenya and the second highest mountain in Africa.
- Tsavo National Park is the largest nature reserve in Kenya and one of the largest in the world.
- The Nairobi National Museum reflects Kenya's history, nature and culture.

What is the wildlife like?

- Kenya is home to many animals including elephants, buffalo, rhinoceroses, leopards and giraffes.
- The national animal is the lion.

Did you know...?

- 1 The three largest cities are Nairobi, Mombasa and Kisumu. Over five million people live in Nairobi.
- 2 English and Kiswahili are the two official languages. There are also many indigenous languages.

We have been learning about 2D shapes this week. We would like you to search around your house to spot what shapes you can find

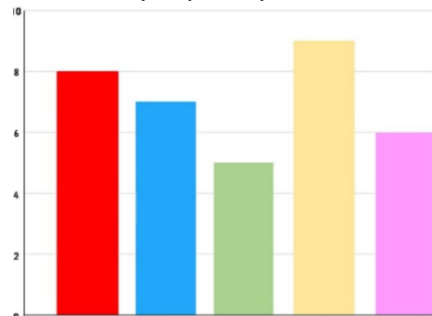
Shape Hunt
