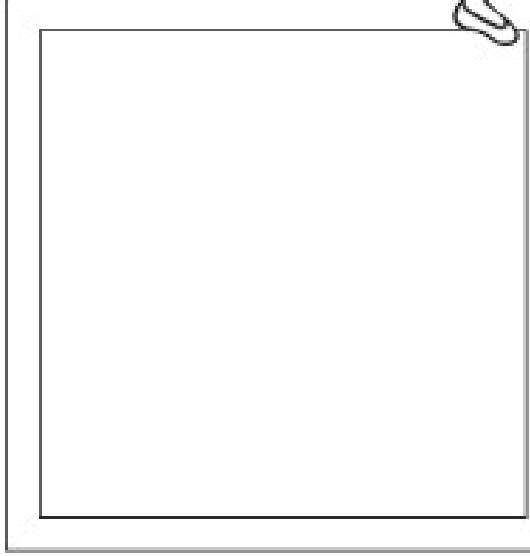
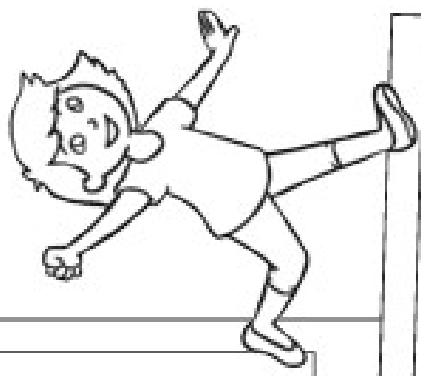
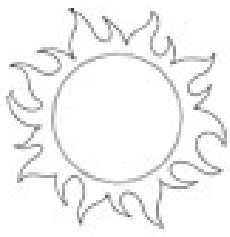


10 Things to Do at Half-Term

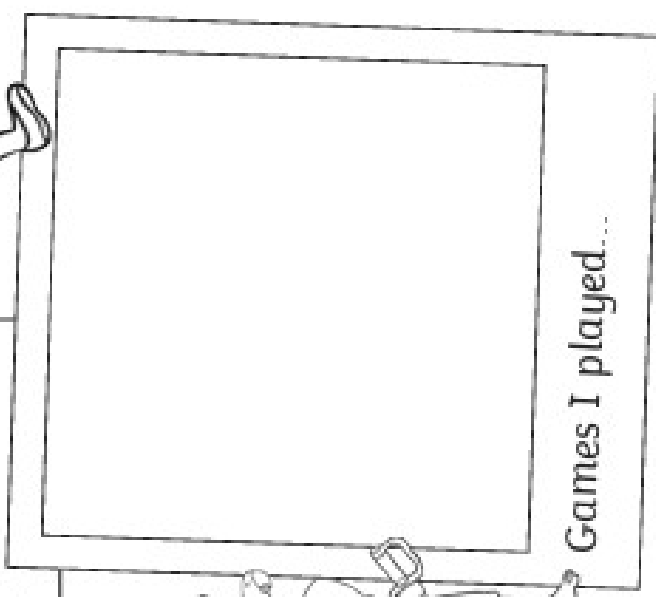


- 1. Go on a Nature Walk**

Try a simple experiment at home like making slime or creating a volcano with baking soda and vinegar.

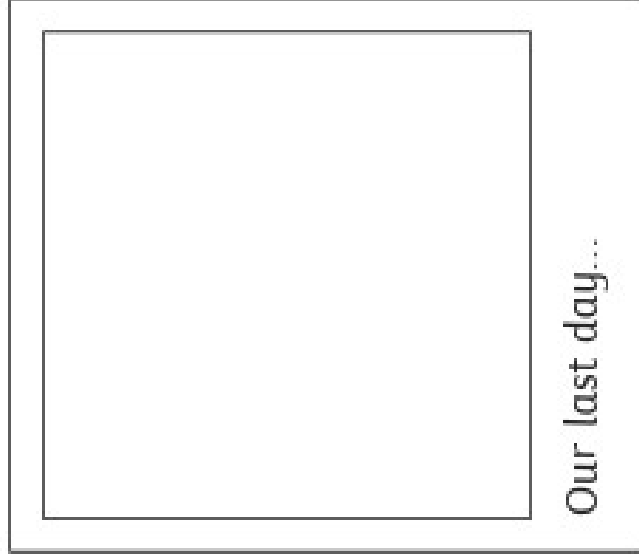
