

2026 Transparency Act Due Diligence Statement for Vårgrønn AS

Vårgrønn AS is committed to responsible business conduct and compliance with the Norwegian Transparency Act (Åpenhetsloven). We actively work to identify, prevent, and mitigate adverse impacts on human rights and working conditions throughout our operations and supply chains.

Our due diligence process includes supplier assessments, stakeholder engagement, as well as ESG risk analysis, we maintain robust governance through internal policies, certified management systems, and regular reporting aligned with international standards.

We disclose our findings and actions annually, ensuring transparency and accountability. Our efforts are guided by the OECD Guidelines and the UN Guiding Principles, and we collaborate with partners to drive continuous improvement.

1. Company Commitment

Vårgrønn's commitment extends to all internationally recognised human rights as well as ensuring decent working conditions across our operations and supply chains, which include those set out in the International Bill of Human Rights and the International Labour Organizations, Declaration on Fundamental Principles and Rights at Work. We align with UNGP and OECD Guidelines, and further details can be found within our [Human Rights Policy](#).

2. Due Diligence Process

We conduct regular due diligence assessments to identify and address potential adverse impacts. This includes supplier questionnaires and screenings. Where risks are identified the assessment may be expanded to include, inter alia, interviews, site visits, and ESG risk evaluations.

3. Governance and Policies

Our governance framework includes a dedicated sustainability committee, a comprehensive code of conduct, and a supplier code of conduct. As an ISO 9001 (quality) and ISO 14001 (environmental) certified organisation, we are committed to full compliance with international standards, regulatory requirements, and best practices to ensure continuous improvement, environmental responsibility, and ethical business conduct across our operations and supply chain.

4. Reporting and Transparency

We report annually on our sustainability performance, including compliance with the Transparency Act. Our disclosures are submitted to and made available to stakeholders. Any findings are reported as required in the requisite forums.

5. Continuous Improvement

We continuously refine our processes through collaboration with external partners and participation in initiatives such as the UN Global Compact and Responsible Business Alliance.

6. Measures to Mitigate Risks in the Supply Chain

In addition to risk mitigation measures outlined in our Annual Report, we implemented the use of Achilles <https://www.achilles.com/en-uk/> from Q3 2025 to ensure that we build resilient, compliant supply chains and meet non-financial reporting obligations through trusted data, collaboration, and actionable insight.

This will enable us to better:

- understand and manage supply chain risk
- strengthen our compliance with audits and assessments
- streamline non-financial reporting
- manage our carbon impact
- access strategic guidance on ESG

7. Whistleblowing

At Vårgrønn, we encourage our team members and external parties who work with us to report on any conditions or actions that breach our Code of Conduct, or other policies, procedures and rules.

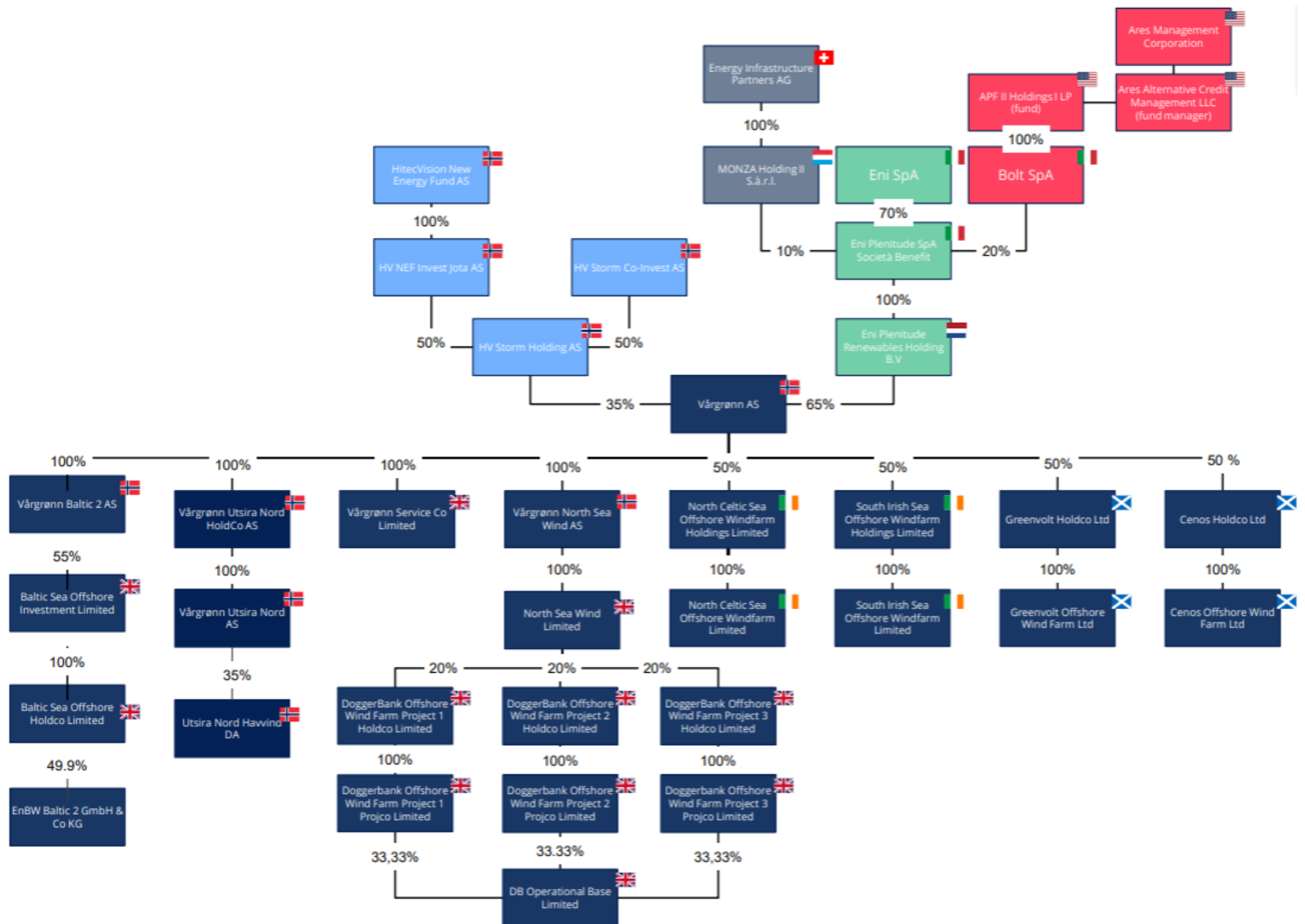
8. Company Structure
