- Coordinate and perform field inspections across civil, structural, mechanical, piping, and electrical construction activities.
- Collaborate with project teams, subcontractors, clients, and inspection agencies to ensure quality requirements, testing, and documentation are completed and approved.
- Maintain accurate quality records, including ITPs, inspection reports, qualifications, RFIs, drawing revisions, and vendor data deliverables.
- Monitor and control measuring and testing equipment calibration and inventory records.
- Track worker qualifications and ensure compliance with applicable codes, standards, and procedures.
- Identify, document, and help resolve non-conformances while supporting corrective action and closeout activities.
- Participate in client and project meetings, communicate quality hold points, and maintain photographic documentation of project activities.
