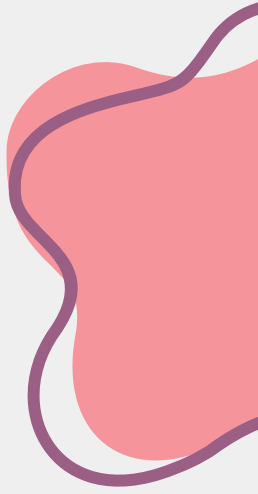

We are starting the Mini Police in January at Exford School which will be lovely for the Children to get involved.

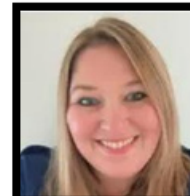

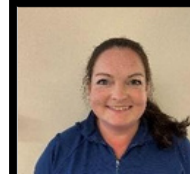

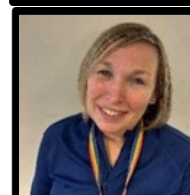
