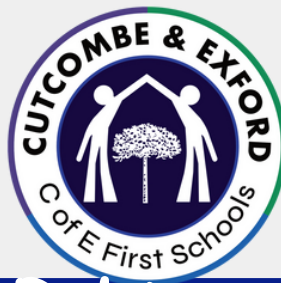




# Our School Newsletter

It has been lovely to welcome the children back into school after the Christmas break full of excitement and enthusiasm.

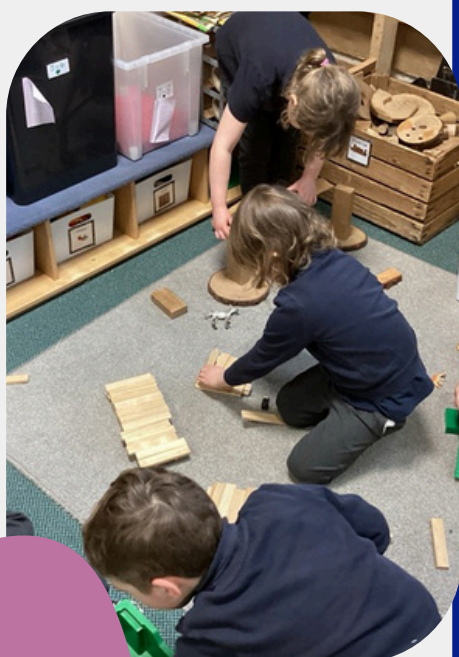
We launched straight in to our new learning in Geography and Understanding the world where we will be learning all about weather and climate around the world.

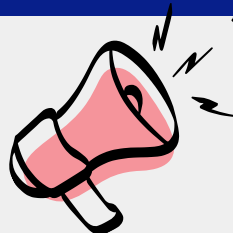
