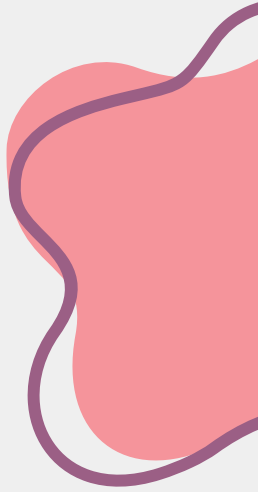
We are also eagerly anticipating Sports Day, alongside a range of other exciting activities and events that will make the final term both enjoyable and memorable for all.
