Ash

Over the last two weeks, Ash Class has been busy with lots of exciting learning across the curriculum. In PE, the children have been developing their tennis skills by learning a variety of strokes and practising how to control the ball and successfully hit it over the net. In English, they have been exploring the features of biographical writing, identifying key information and understanding how biographies are organised. During Roots and Fruits, Reverend Helene helped the children learn about the meaning behind The Lord's Prayer, encouraging thoughtful discussion about its messages and significance. In Geography, the class has been studying the countries of South America and learning about the different hemispheres of the world. In RE, the children have been learning about the Jewish New Year celebration of Rosh Hashanah, exploring its traditions, symbols and importance within the Jewish faith. Well done to everyone in Ash Class for your enthusiasm and hard work.

Orchid Class enjoyed making thoughtful Father's Day cards, putting great care into their designs. Our lifeguard visit was a real highlight, with children learning how to stay safe around water as we head into summer. In maths, Reception have been using rekenreks to explore different number compositions to 10, while KS1 have been developing their understanding of multiplication through practical, hands-on activities. All the children have produced fantastic summer-themed writing, describing all the things they can see, hear and notice at this time of year.



Forest School

This week at forest school the children learnt to decorate fabric using cyanotype. They collected natural resources, lay them out on the fabric which has already been chemically treated, then in the sun for 15 minutes, rinse and you're left with a beautiful decoration. The children thoroughly enjoyed this experiment. While at the fire side the children perfected their bread making expertises and added several different toppings to them, then enjoyed trying them

Message from ... Mr Moise-Souch

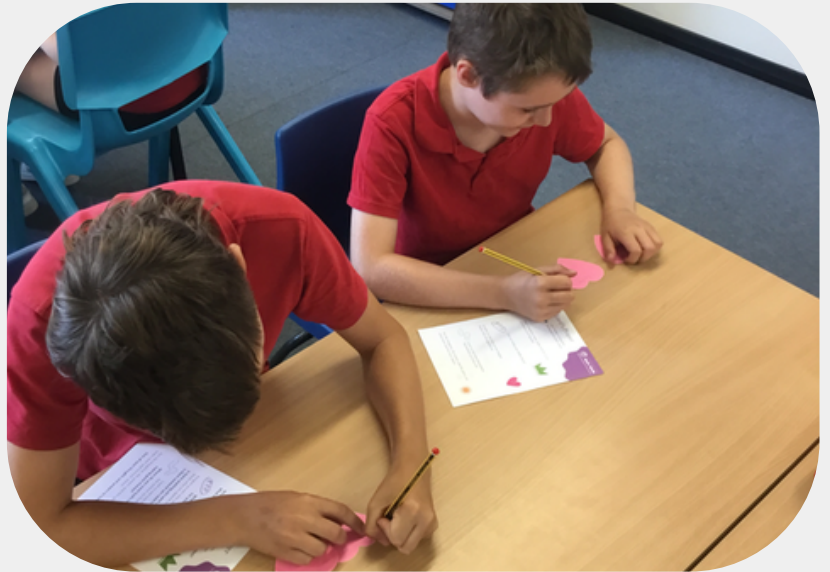
