



ENVIRONMENTAL, ENGINEERING, AND PLANNING INTERNSHIP & CHARRETTE



The EEPIC internship program aims to expand representation within the environmental, engineering, and planning fields by creating meaningful opportunities for students across all backgrounds.

This includes, but is not limited to, students who identify as Black, Indigenous, or People of Color (BIPOC); veterans; individuals with disabilities; and students who are the first in their families to attend college. All EEPIC interns will engage in a traditional internship within their selected firm, along with a unique two-week charrette in July, where they'll collaborate on a real-world project addressing a planning challenge or goal proposed by a city, county, or local agency. This opportunity is available for junior and senior undergraduates, as well as graduate students.

HOW TO APPLY:

- To be considered, you must apply to each firm you are interested in. You may apply to multiple firms. When applying, ensure that your location and desired area of focus align with each firm's internship posting requirements.

DURING THE TWO-WEEK CHARETTE, YOU WILL:

- Produce planning, environmental, economic, engineering, and other technical work products.
- Conduct assignments in the field (i.e., visit project sites), participate in public outreach, analyze data, and contribute to research.
- Learn about local planning, environmental issues, and requirements.
- Work, collaborate, and network with various technical teams and other diverse students in the cohort.
