Taxi & ride share services

Each terminal has a sheltered taxi rank with supervisors on hand in peak hours. Passengers are required to pay for any bridge or road toll on top of the fare, a \$4.75 airport toll is payable by all passengers taking a taxi from any of Sydney Airport taxi ranks.

Ride share pick-ups are now available at Sydney Airport. You can request a ride from your preferred app and get picked up from either the domestic or international terminals. Ride share users are collected from the Priority Pick-up zone.

Currency and Credit Cards

The basic unit of currency is the Australian Dollar. Notes come in AUD 100, AUD 50, AUD20, AUD 10 and AUD 5 denominations. Coins come in 5C, 10c, 20c, 50c, and AUD 1 and AUD 2 denominations.

Major credit cards such as American Express, Visa, MasterCard and Diners Club are widely accepted.

Australian Visa Information

Excluding Australian and New Zealand citizens, all travelers to Australia must obtain a valid authority, either a visa or an Electronic Travel Authority (ETA) you can apply online using the <u>Visa Finder</u>.
