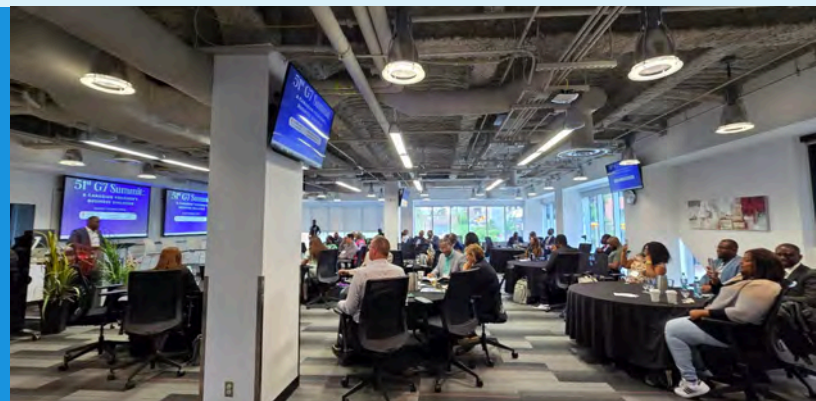




OFNEDA JOINS GLOBAL CONVERSATION AT G7 ON INCLUSIVE TRADE AND PARTNERSHIPS

REFLECTING ON 50 YEARS OF LEADERSHIP: ANNUAL CHIEFS ASSEMBLY MARKS HISTORIC MILESTONE



The 50th Anniversary Annual Chiefs Assembly (ACA) of the Chiefs of Ontario, themed *"Pathways to Progress: Walking with the Wisdom of Our Ancestors,"* was held from June 17 to 19, 2025, at the Gathering Place in Hiawatha First Nation.

Over the course of three days, First Nations leadership and community members gathered to reflect on five decades of advocacy, strength and unity. The event focused on key priorities for First Nations in Ontario, providing an opportunity for thoughtful discussions, knowledge sharing and strategic planning.

OFNEDA was honoured to attend this historic gathering and to stand alongside other leaders committed to empowering Indigenous communities across the province. A highlight of the ACA was the gala on June 18, which celebrated this important milestone and honoured the enduring leadership of Ontario's First Nations. The Assembly was hosted by the Michi Saagiig of Hiawatha First Nation and offered both in-person and virtual participation, ensuring accessibility for communities across Ontario.

The ACA served as a powerful reminder of the collective strength and future direction of First Nations in Ontario. It stood as a testament to the past 50 years of determined leadership and the unwavering commitment to building a brighter, more equitable future for the next generation.

This month, we are proud to shine a spotlight on a groundbreaking partnership that is transforming the mining industry while advancing Indigenous economic sovereignty: Aki-eh DIBINWEWZIWIN Limited Partnership (ADLP).

ADLP is a limited partnership between Wahnapiatae First Nation, Atikameksheng Anishnawbek, and Technica Mining. As one of Canada's largest Indigenous and Canadian-owned underground mine contracting partnerships, ADLP is setting a powerful example of what true collaboration and a shared vision can achieve.

This partnership is more than a business arrangement. It is a bold step toward reshaping the economic landscape on the traditional and territorial lands that span the Greater Sudbury basin. With Atikameksheng and Wahnapiatae holding a 51 percent stake, the partnership ensures that Indigenous communities are not only present at the table but are leading the way.

Technica Mining, a respected industry leader with over 25 years of experience, serves as the operating partner. Together, the partners bring a unique and forward-looking approach to mining that integrates traditional Indigenous knowledge with modern, sustainable practices. This philosophy inspired our name, gifted by Elders and language keepers, meaning *"to be owned by the earth"*.

This model does not only reflect inclusion; it exemplifies leadership and vision in a sector that is critical to Canada's economic future. For generations, mining in the Sudbury basin occurred on First Nations' traditional lands with minimal benefit or involvement for Indigenous communities. **ADLP** is a powerful example of how corporations can move beyond words and take real, measurable steps toward economic reconciliation. It represents a tangible shift towards economic independence, high-value employment, and meaningful wealth generation for First Nations people.

As the global demand for minerals rises, ADLP is ready to demonstrate that Indigenous leadership in mining is not only possible, but also good business. It brings generations of knowledge, stewardship, and a holistic understanding of the land. With ADLP's success and proven ability to develop large scale projects, the sky is the limit for the two First Nations' participation in mining their territory. The combination of know-how, capacity, land rights, and collaborative relationships with sector proponents bring together conditions for big things to come.

M'Chigeeng First Nation has initiated a project to implement Electric Charging Stations for electric vehicle users, promoting environmental sustainability.

M'Chigeeng First Nation is in the process of developing a plan to install two EV charging stations within the community, strategically located at our local arena (two level 2 EV chargers) and the Business Development Centre (two level 3 EV chargers).

This initiative contributes positively to the environment, fostering a pollution-free, healthier lifestyle and aligns with our Community Energy Plan. The transition underscores M'Chigeeng's commitment to environmental sustainability while ensuring members maintain the convenience they enjoy with their current vehicles.

By embracing EV technology, MFN sets a strong example of innovation and responsibility by structuring EV business ventures under M.E.R.E. (Mother Earth Renewable Energy)

From May 27 to 29, our Director of Indigenous Procurement joined CANDO and NACCA, along with 25 Indigenous businesses, to attend CANSEC 2025, a major trade expo in Ottawa hosted by the Canadian Association of Defence and Security Industries. The event provided a platform for businesses to showcase their services.

CANDO and NACCA co-developed the Indigenous Defence Supply Chain Pilot, which included weeks of training to prepare businesses for exhibiting at the event.

This marks the first year of a three-year pilot aimed at creating more opportunities for Indigenous businesses to participate in government procurement processes at CANSEC. 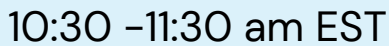

Green Energy Utility Hub Feasibility Study for Saugeen First Nation



Project Description: Green Energy Utility Hub Feasibility Study

The Chippewas of Saugeen First Nation (SFN) invites non-binding proposals for a feasibility study to assess the potential for a community-owned, for-profit Green Energy Utility Hub.

This study will build on the Community Energy Plan and review proposals received for potential partnerships. It will explore opportunities for sustainable energy projects, including large-scale battery storage, solar farms and wind farms. The aim is to determine the economic and operational viability of a utility hub that supports local energy independence and reduces greenhouse gas emissions.

This work will help guide Saugeen's path to energy self-sufficiency and long-term sustainability.

The selected Consultant will:

- Evaluate the potential for a utility hub and provide a recommended model
- Assess the need, size and estimated cost of a dedicated utility hub building
- Explore battery storage options that leverage Saugeen's proximity to Bruce Power
- Review the feasibility of managing green energy sources through the hub
- Gather community and leadership input throughout the process
- Recommend phased implementation steps and timelines

Bear Island Access Study

Closing Date: July 4, 2025, at 11:59 p.m. (local time)

Temagami First Nation is seeking proposals from qualified consulting firms or independent consultants to undertake a Community Access Study.

The objective is to assess and document the current state of access to Bear Island, located on Lake Temagami in Northern Ontario, and to provide actionable recommendations to improve transportation accessibility for the community's approximately 300 residents.

Access to Bear Island is currently limited to boat travel in the summer and ice roads in the winter. However, shorter ice road seasons and increasingly unpredictable weather patterns are affecting reliability during freeze-up, break-up and mild winter periods.

The study will address these challenges and explore sustainable, year-round solutions to enhance mobility for residents.
