Join the team behind [KNOCA](#) (the Knowledge Network on Climate Assemblies), run by DEMOCRACY X (formerly the Danish Board of Technology) in collaboration with the University of Westminster and the European Climate Foundation. KNOCA's mission is to strengthen climate assembly processes and their political impact by documenting existing initiatives and identifying best practices.

As an intern at KNOCA, you will have the opportunity to work both practically and analytically, while building an international network of researchers and practitioners working at the intersection of green transition and democratic innovation.

YOUR TASKS WILL INCLUDE

- Document and analyze existing climate assemblies
- Participate in meetings, webinars, and workshops, take minutes, and manage the technical aspects (the network's activities take place online)
- Prepare membership analyses
- Contribute to strategic discussions on the development of the network
- Assist in developing network activities and best-practice guidelines
- Plan and execute communication initiatives related to the network's activities

DEMOCRACY X AND THE PRACTICALITIES

Democracy x is a non-profit, self-owned foundation and internationally recognized center of expertise in innovative political methods, engagement, and technology. Our projects focus on pressing societal challenges such as climate adaptation, biodiversity, and privacy protection. With over 30 years of experience, we collaborate with organizations including the UN, the EU, foundations, and municipalities. As an intern with us, you will be assigned to 1–2 projects, working closely with a project manager and a project coordinator. Developing your internship report is an integral part of the program. We place strong emphasis on your professional growth and ensuring a rewarding and meaningful internship experience. The internship is unpaid and typically lasts 5 months, with a workload of 30 hours per week. The workplace is located at Sorøgade 6, 2100 Copenhagen Ø, with the possibility of working from home up to one day per week by arrangement.

Interviews will be held continuously, so make sure to apply as soon as possible.
