At Kippax North Primary School, we aim to deliver a PSHE curriculum that is inclusive, engaging and accessible to all pupils. Through dedicated PSHE lessons, whole-school assemblies and focused events, we support our pupils to develop the knowledge, skills and confidence they need to become responsible, independent, healthy and confident members of the school community and the wider world.

We encourage our children to feel confident in addressing and discussing a range of issues they may encounter, including moral, social and cultural topics. Our pupils are supported in developing a strong sense of self, enabling them to build positive relationships and become thoughtful role models for others.

PSHE at Kippax North 2026/2027

Our PSHE curriculum at Kippax North is built around three core themes:

- Health and Well-being
- Relationships
- Living in the Wider World

Our long-term plan is delivered thematically, meaning that the whole school focuses on the same overarching theme during each half-term. This approach helps to create a shared understanding across the school while allowing learning to be developed in an age-appropriate way.

The statutory requirements of the **Relationships Education and Health Education framework** are fully embedded within this thematic structure to ensure pupils receive the knowledge and understanding needed for their personal development.

At Kippax North Primary School, we recognise that our curriculum must reflect the needs of our pupils. While we draw upon guidance and resources from the PSHE Association to support our planning, teachers adapt lessons to meet the needs of their classes and respond to any emerging issues or concerns that arise during the year.

Through our PSHE curriculum, we aim for all pupils to leave Kippax North in Year 6 as confident, healthy, respectful and responsible individuals who are well prepared for the next stage of their education and for life in modern society.

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A British Value will also be taught each half term as well as being embedded throughout the whole school curriculum:

Our aim with the British Values curriculum is to make sure that each child can easily access it. We want to equip them with the knowledge and skills necessary to be independent and responsible members of society. This curriculum will prepare them for life and work, regardless of their individual starting points, helping them develop the essential attributes they need. By understanding a variety of social, moral, cultural and spiritual perspectives, children will have a strong foundation to navigate and be inspired by our diverse society and be proud of their own background and culture. All pupils will grasp the fundamental British values that uphold our way of life.

******During the school half term, a designated week has been set aside to allow staff the opportunity to address any contextual safeguarding concerns that may arise. This dedicated period ensures that teachers and safeguarding leads have the necessary time and flexibility to respond appropriately to emerging issues affecting students' welfare, both within and beyond the school environment. By prioritising this time, the school demonstrates its ongoing commitment to maintain a safe and supportive learning atmosphere for all pupils.

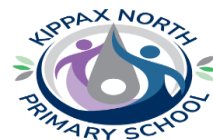
