












The history of American whiskey is a captivating journey that began with early colonists distilling surplus grains into unaged spirits. In the late 18th century, Kentucky pioneered bourbon, a unique whiskey made primarily from corn and aged in charred oak barrels. The 19th century witnessed the expansion of whiskey production across the American frontier. Prohibition in the 1920s forced many distilleries to close, giving rise to illegal moonshine production, but it was repealed in 1933, leading to a resurgence in the whiskey industry. Since then, American whiskey, particularly bourbon and rye, has enjoyed global popularity and a renaissance, with craft distilleries offering a diverse range of unique expressions. Today, American whiskey's rich history reflects both tradition and innovation in the world of spirits.

To be considered bourbon, a whiskey must must be produced in the United States, it must be made from a grain mixture that is at least 51% corn. (Remaining grains include barley, rye, and/or wheat) must be aged in new, charred oak barrels, distilled to no more than 160 proof and entered into the barrel for ageing at no more than 125 proof (62.5% alcohol by volume), bottled at a minimum of 80 proof (40% alcohol by volume), and contain no additives, except for water.

There is no minimum ageing requirement for calling a whiskey "bourbon," but to be labelled as "straight bourbon," it must be aged for at least two years, and any bourbon if aged less than 4 years must have an age statement

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



The Latin name for distilled alcohol was 'aqua vitae' or 'water of life' and was translated into Gaelic as 'uisge beatha' (pronounced uska beg). Over time, the name became shortened to uska and eventually evolved into the word 'whisky' that we know today.

Scotch whisky is renowned for its diverse range of styles, exceptional flavours and aromas. It stands as a symbol of Scotland's craftsmanship, history, and enduring legacy in the world of spirits.

To be considered Scotch whisky, it must adhere to specific criteria including being produced in Scotland, made from malted barley and water,

aged in oak barrels for a minimum of three years and bottled at a minimum of 40% ABV:

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## Australia



The history of Australian whiskey is a relatively recent yet remarkable journey of revival and innovation. While early distillation attempts date back to the 19th century, the modern Australian whiskey industry began to take shape in the 1970s, led by pioneers like Bill Lark. Tasmania, with its ideal climate and pristine water sources, became a focal point for whiskey production, with distilleries such as Lark and Sullivan's Cove gaining international acclaim.

Australian whisky, like whisky produced in other countries, has specific characteristics and requirements that define it including it must be produced in Australia, can be made from a variety of grains, including malted barley, corn, rye, and wheat, aged for a minumin of 2 years, bottled at a minimum of 37% ABV and can have not other additive other than water and adjust final ABV.

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The history of Irish whiskey is a tale of enduring tradition and revival, and a contentious centuries old argument with Scotsman over who invented it first. In Ireland the word 'whiskey' (or whisky) comes from the Irish word uisce beatha, meaning water of life (noting the similarity to Scotland)

The oldest known document of whiskey is contained in the Annals of Clonmacnoise from 1405 noting the death of the head of the clan after "taking a surfeit of aqua vitae".

Irish whiskey, known for its smooth and approachable character, is defined by specific production standards and regulations that distinguish it from other types of whiskey.

To be considered an Irish whiskey, a spirit must meet be distilled in Ireland, typically made from a mixture of malted and unmalted barley (and some other grains), historically triple distilled (but some may be only double), aged for minimum of 3 years, and bottled at a min 40% ABV.
