


# GROUNDHOG DAY

During the middle of winter, we celebrate this fun tradition called Groundhog Day. On February 2nd each year, we wait for a groundhog named Punxsutawney Phil to check out the weather.



Phil lives in Pennsylvania, and his job is to “predict” the start of spring. On Groundhog Day, we all watch as Phil comes out of his burrow at sunrise.

If it's a sunny day and he sees his shadow on the ground, he will run back into his burrow. Seeing this shadow means there will be six more weeks of winter.
