


HARVARD CAPS HARRIS POLL



Field Dates: February 25-26, 2026



SURVEY METHOD

This survey was conducted online within the United States on **February 25-26, 2026**, among **1,999 registered voters** by The Harris Poll and HarrisX.

Respondents for this poll are recruited through opt-in, web-panel recruitment sampling. Recruitment occurs through a broad variety of professional, validated respondent panels to expand the sampling frame as wide as possible and minimize the impact of any given panel on recruiting methods.

Results are weighted for age within gender, region, race/ethnicity, marital status, household size, income, employment, education, political party, and political ideology where necessary to align them with their actual proportions in the population. Propensity score weighting was also used to adjust for respondents' propensity to be online. The margin of error for the total sample is +/- 1.99 pts on a 95% confidence level.



Country: Right Track / Wrong Track




M1. In general, do you think the country is on the right track or is it off on the wrong track?





Would you say that your personal financial situation is improving or getting worse?











CONGRESSIONAL APPROVAL NOW AT 34%

Favorability of Political Figures




























If the congressional election were held today would you be more likely to vote for a Democrat or a Republican for Congress?












Was it appropriate or inappropriate for some Democrats to boycott President Trump's State of the Union address?














































































































Do you support or oppose Trump's handling of the Ukraine-Russia conflict so far?






