Field Dates: March 25-26, 2026



SURVEY METHOD

This survey was conducted online within the United States on **March 25-26, 2026**, among **2,009 registered voters** by The Harris Poll and HarrisX.

Respondents for this poll are recruited through opt-in, web-panel recruitment sampling. Recruitment occurs through a broad variety of professional, validated respondent panels to expand the sampling frame as wide as possible and minimize the impact of any given panel on recruiting methods.

Results are weighted for age within gender, region, race/ethnicity, marital status, household size, income, employment, education, political party, and political ideology where necessary to align them with their actual proportions in the population. Propensity score weighting was also used to adjust for respondents' propensity to be online. The margin of error for the total sample is +/- 1.99 pts on a 95% confidence level.









Would you say that your personal financial situation is improving or getting worse?










Do you approve or disapprove of the way Congress is doing its job?








How often do you vote in Congressional midterm elections?


How likely or unlikely are you to vote in the upcoming 2026 Congressional midterm elections on November 3rd?

If the congressional election were held today would you be more likely to vote for a Democrat or a Republican for Congress?








Do you think it is in the U.S.' interests or not:

Do you think that the Democrats are standing now for open borders or are they against open borders?




Are Democrats for or against deporting violent criminals here illegally?































Is the economy today better or worse than it was when Biden was president?




































































































Does this statement make you more likely to support or oppose the military strikes on Iran?



Do you support or oppose Donald Trump's handling of the Iran conflict so far?







How much thought have you given to the 2028 presidential election, if any?




Who would you favor to be the next Democratic candidate for president:
