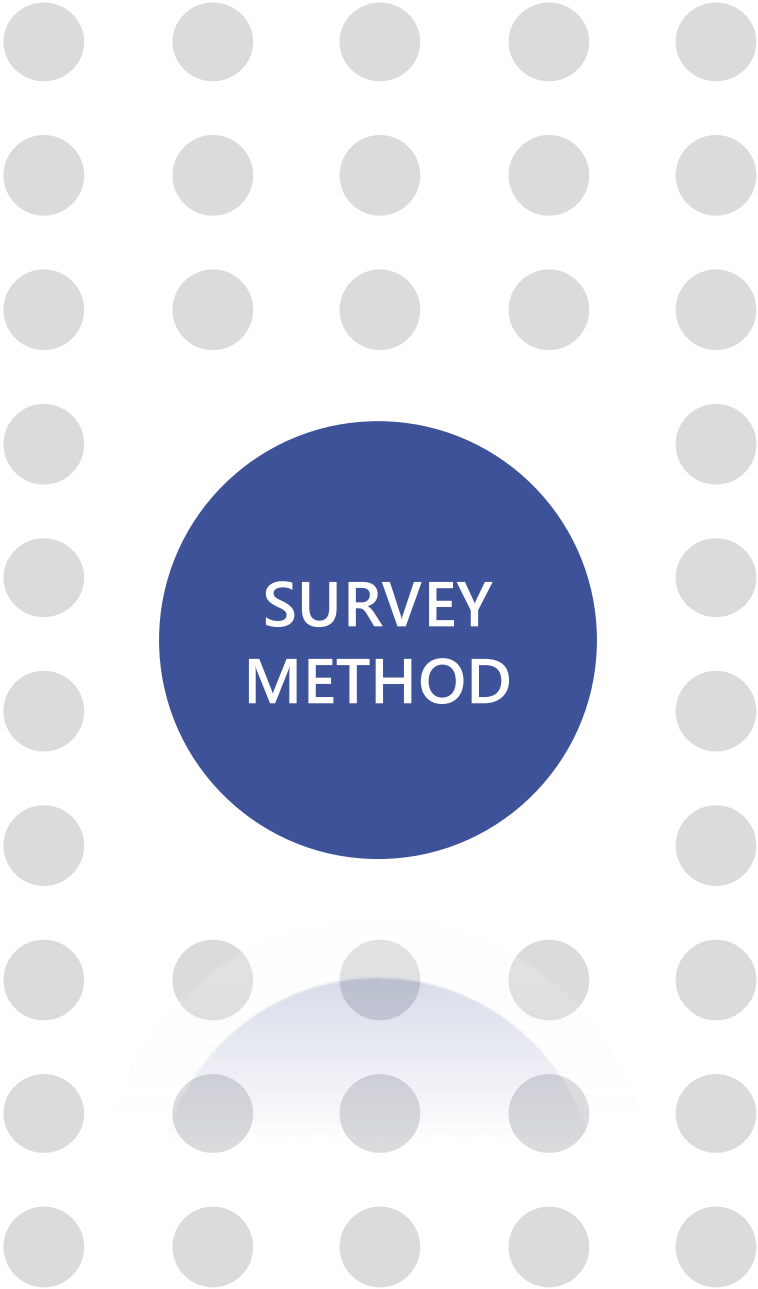


HARVARD CAPS HARRIS POLL



Field Dates: August 28-30, 2026



SURVEY METHOD

This survey was conducted online within the United States on **August 28-30, 2026**, among **2,100 registered voters** by The Harris Poll and HarrisX.

Respondents for this poll are recruited through opt-in, web-panel recruitment sampling. Recruitment occurs through a broad variety of professional, validated respondent panels to expand the sampling frame as wide as possible and minimize the impact of any given panel on recruiting methods.

Results are weighted for age within gender, region, race/ethnicity, marital status, household size, income, employment, education, political party, and political ideology where necessary to align them with their actual proportions in the population. Propensity score weighting was also used to adjust for respondents' propensity to be online. The margin of error for the total sample is +/- 2.1 pts on a 95% confidence level.

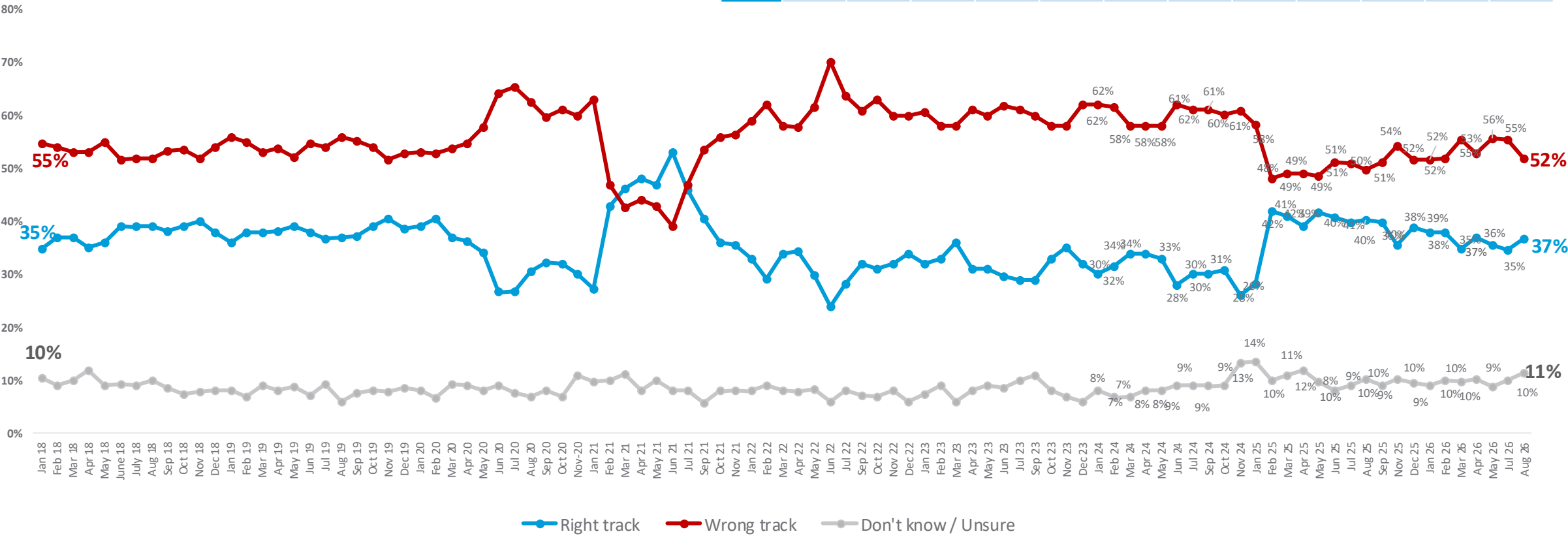

Country: Right Track / Wrong Track



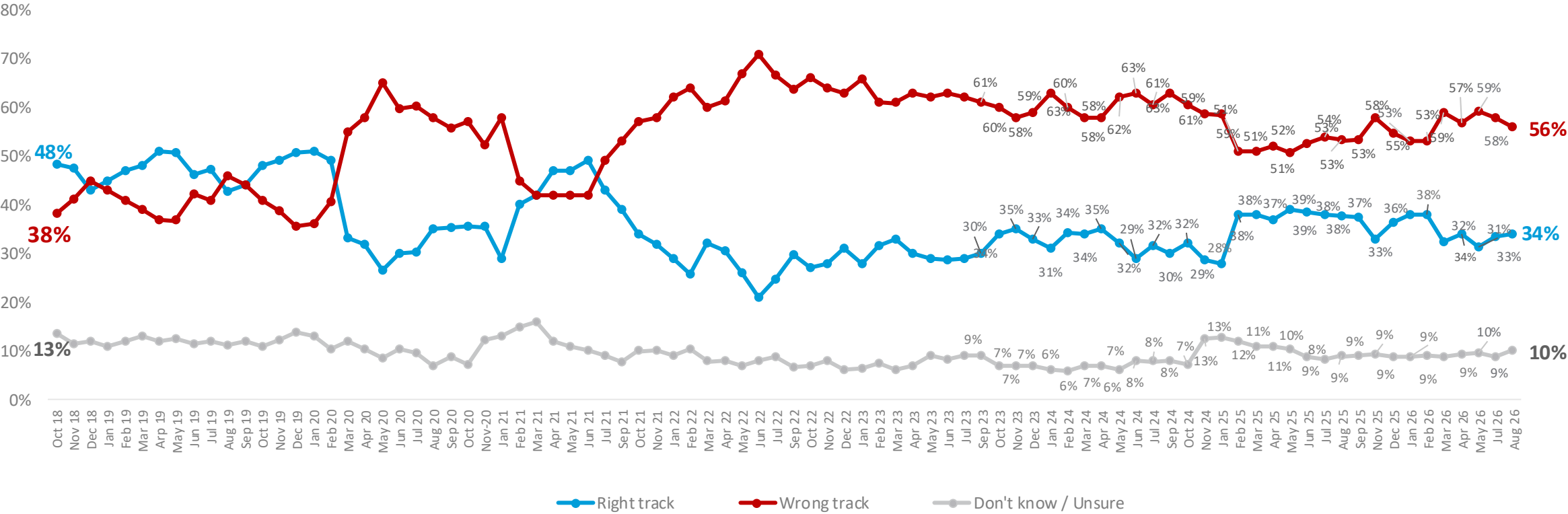

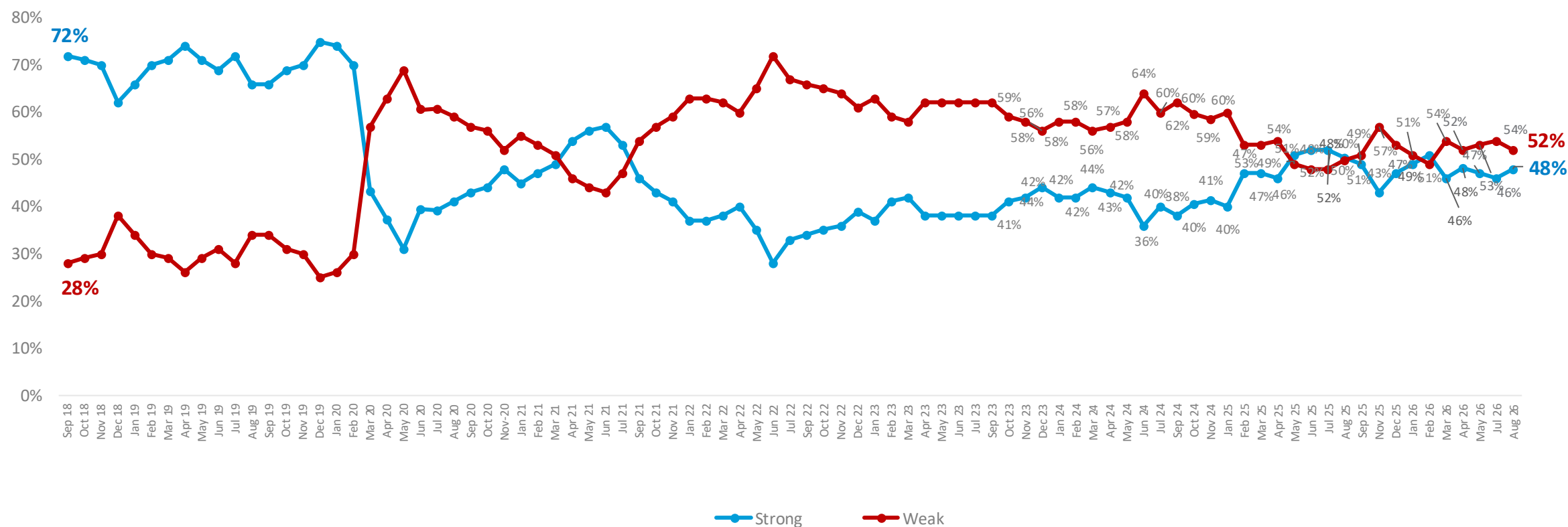

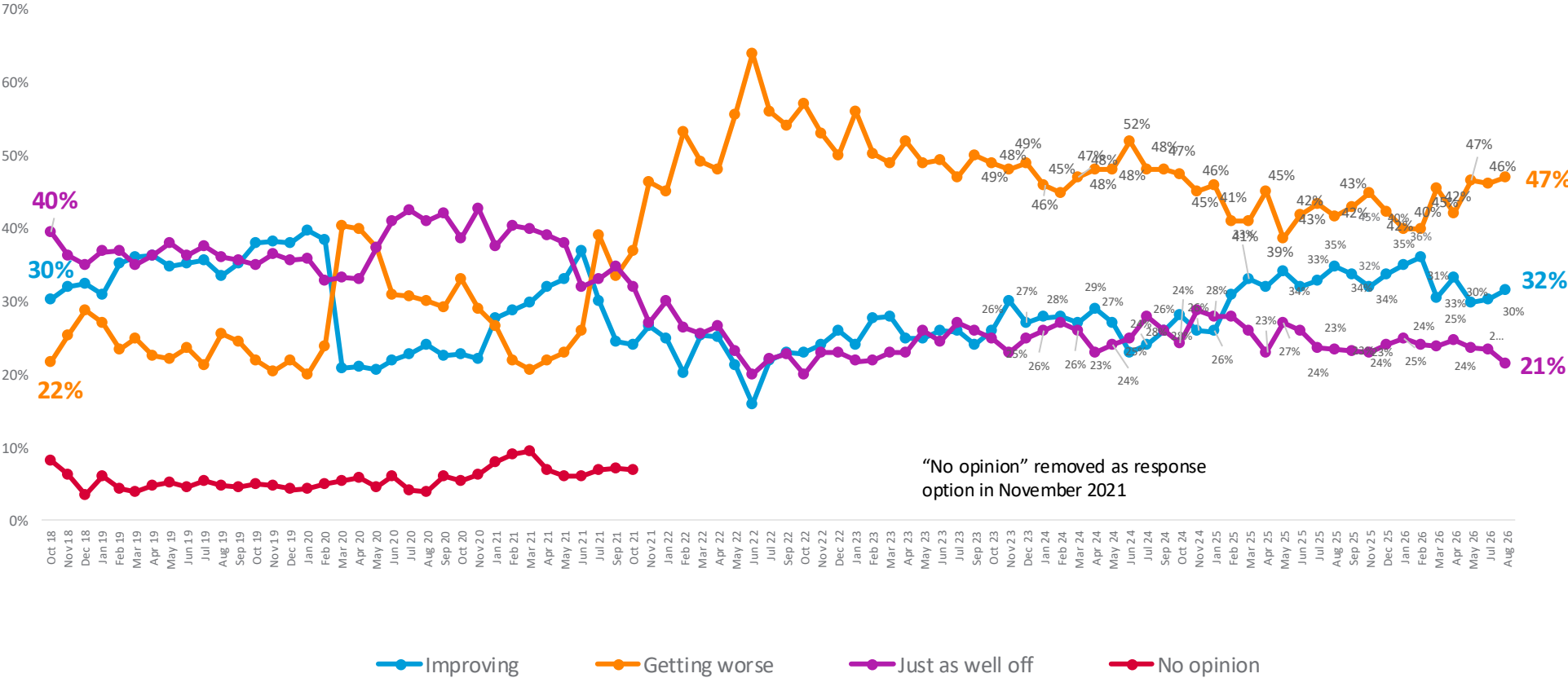
JUST UNDER HALF SAY THE U.S. ECONOMY IS STRONG TODAY

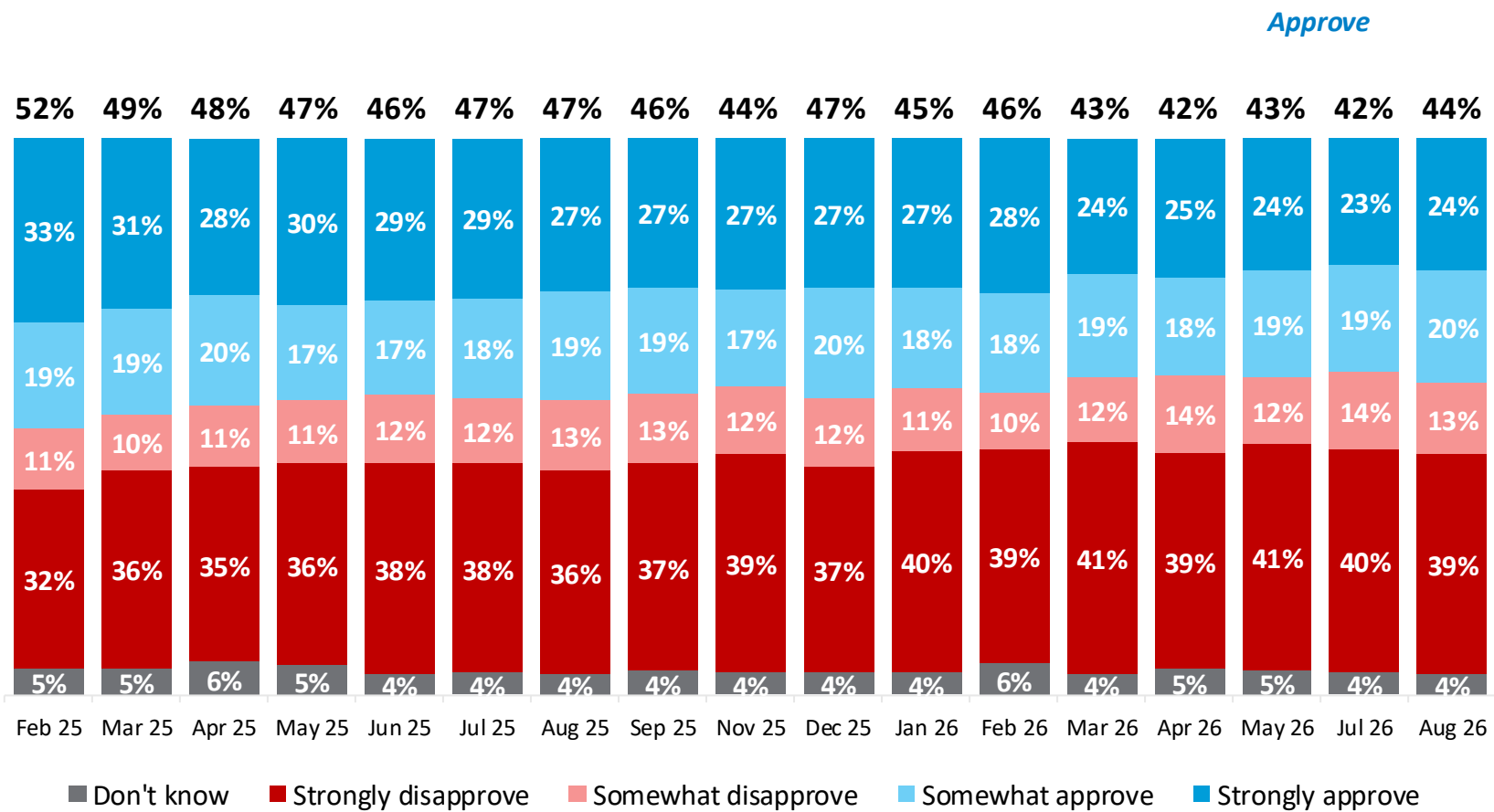

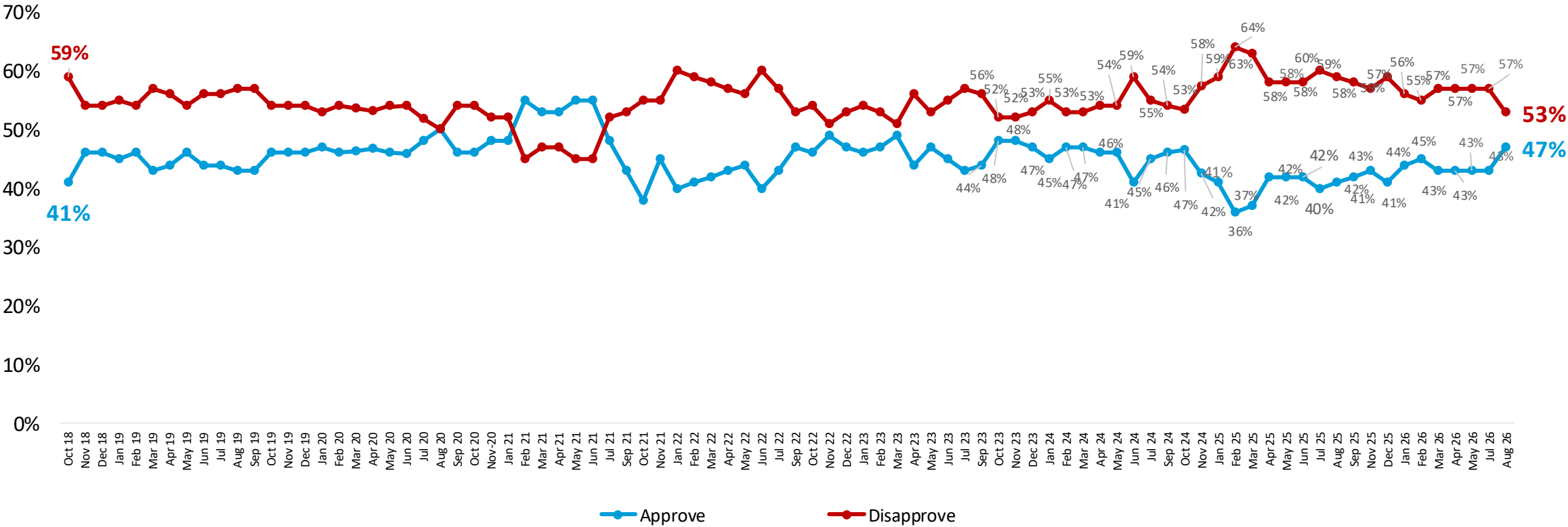

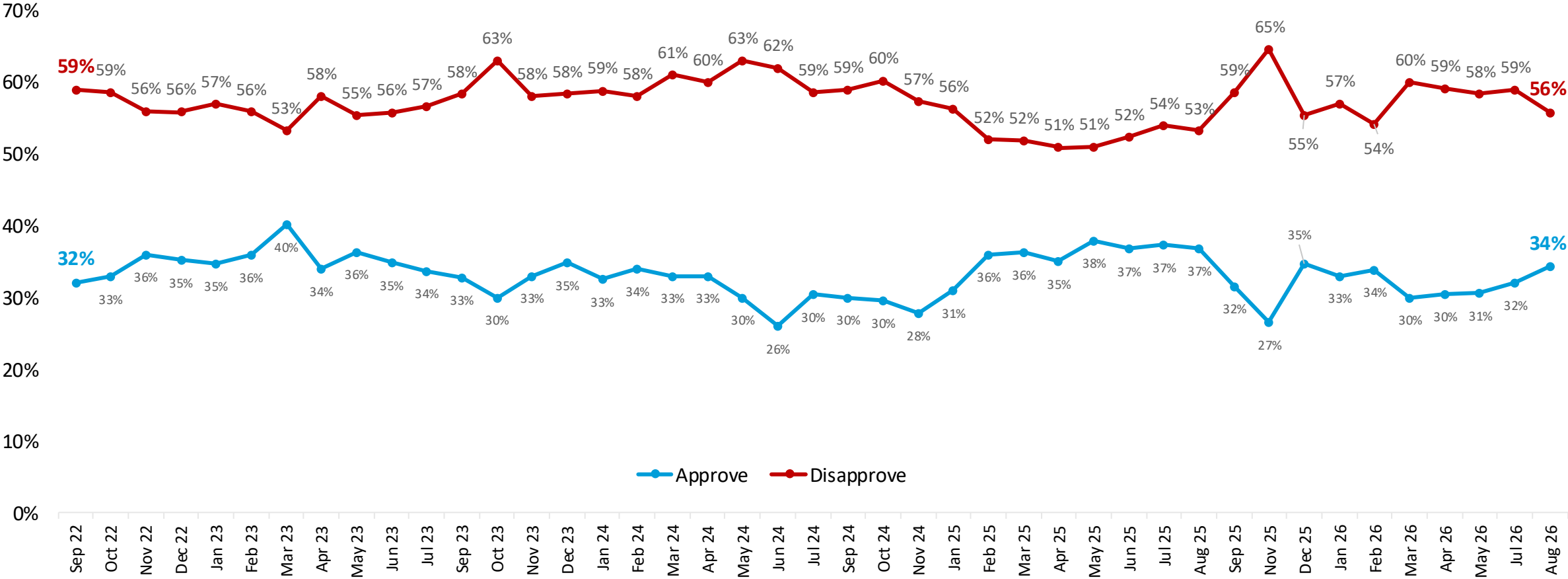

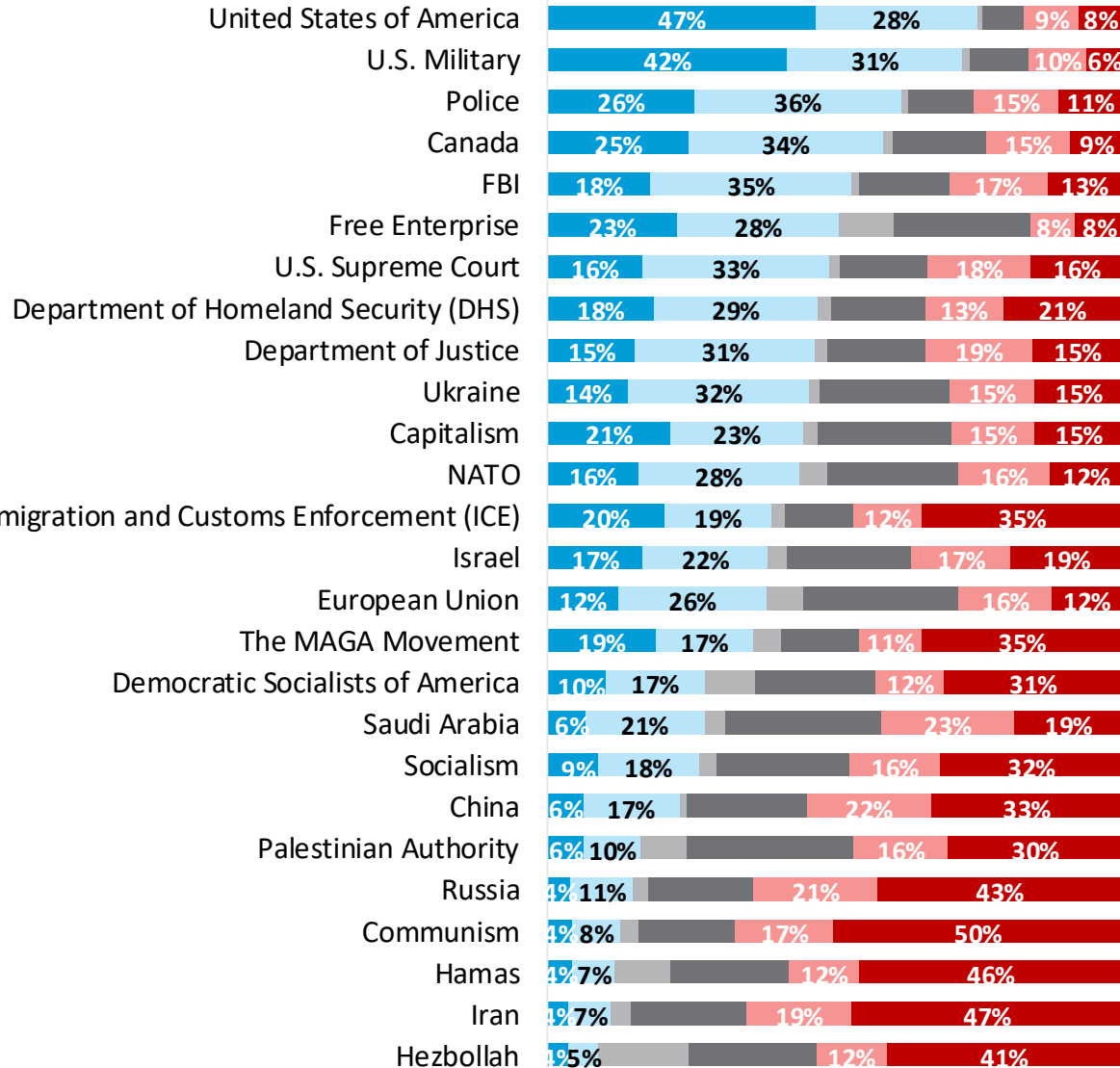

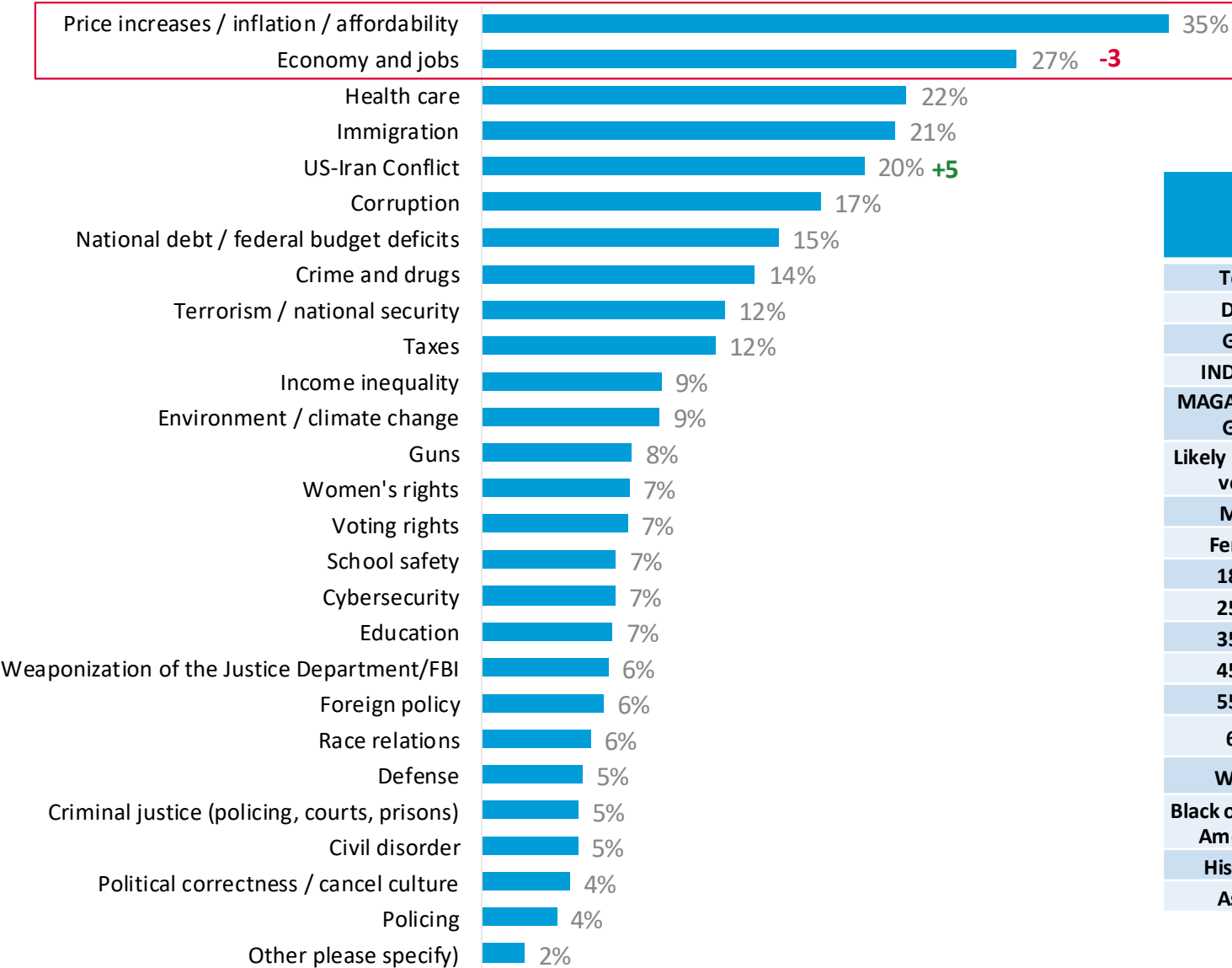

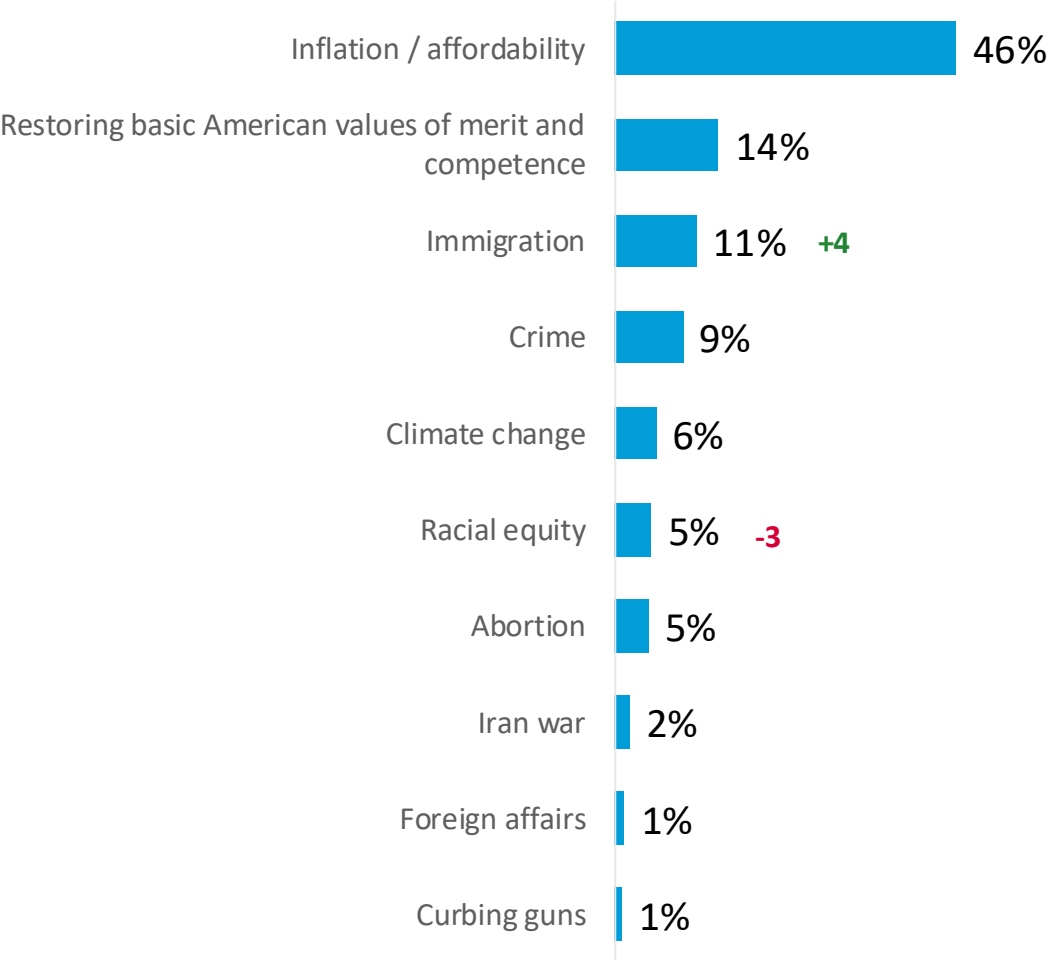

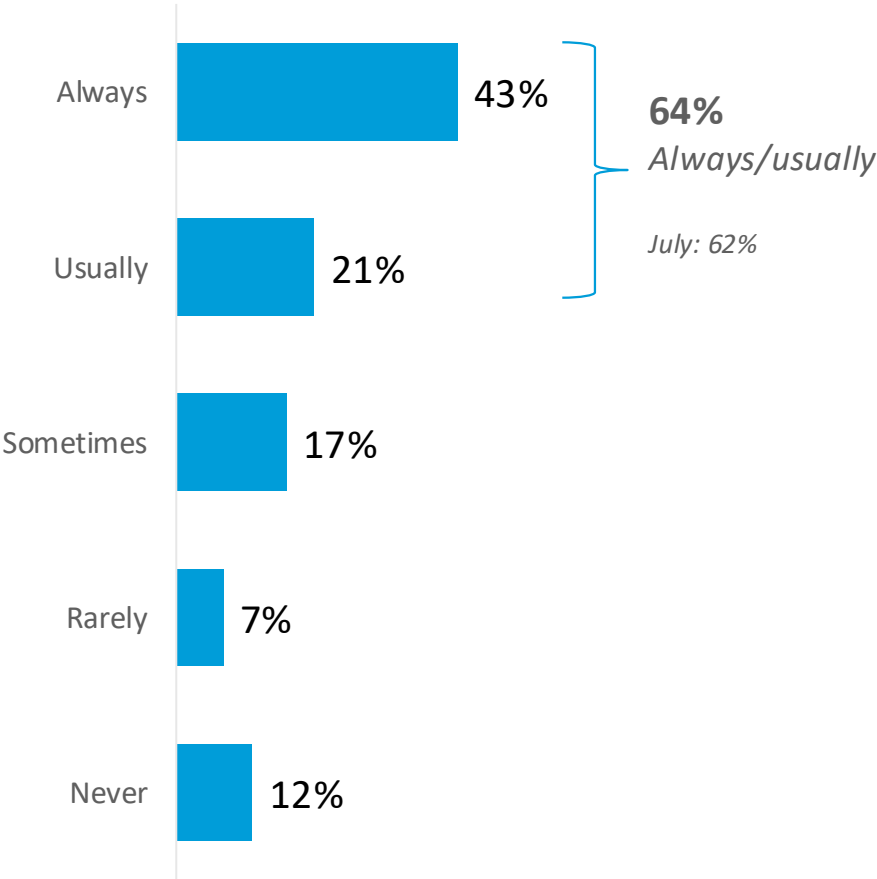

How often do you vote in Congressional midterm elections?

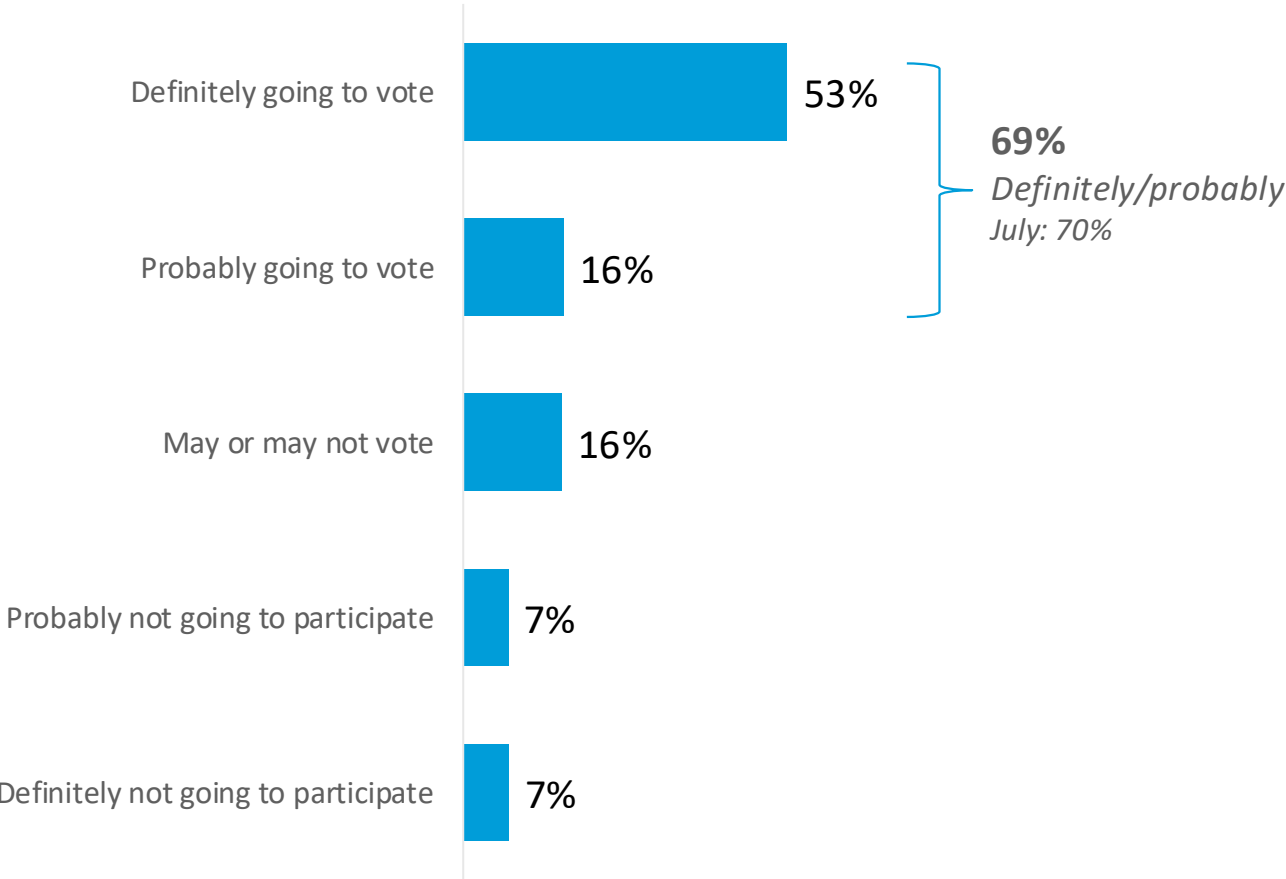

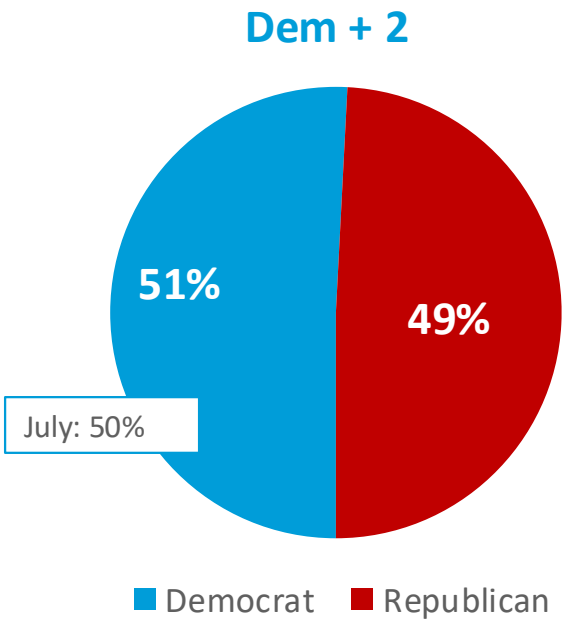
How likely or unlikely are you to vote in the upcoming 2026 Congressional midterm elections on November 3rd?

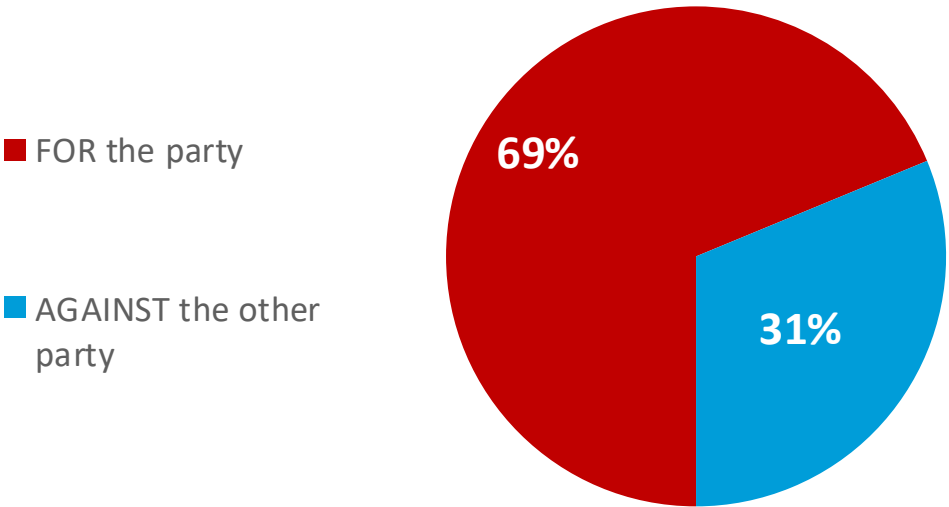
If the congressional election were held today would you be more likely to vote for a Democrat or a Republican for Congress?



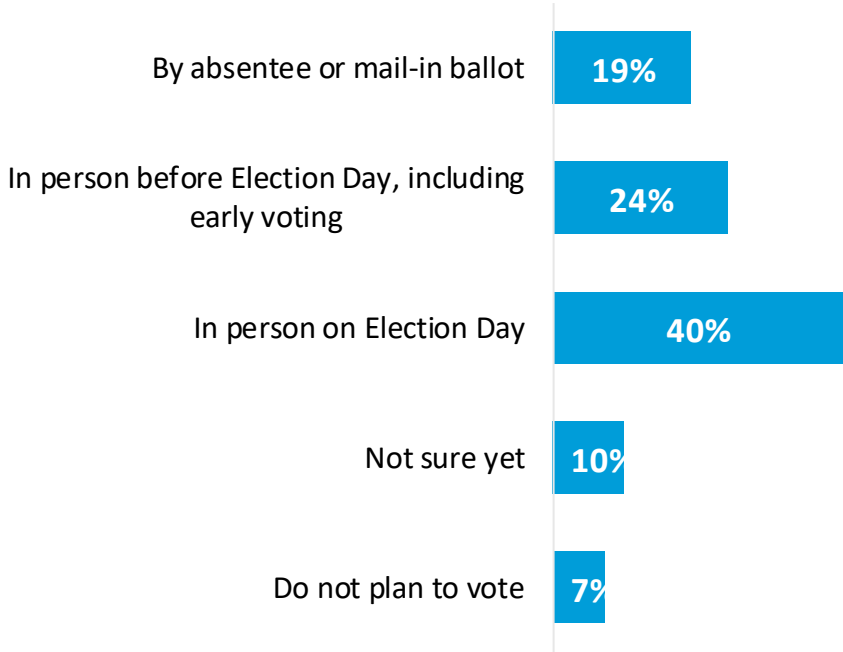

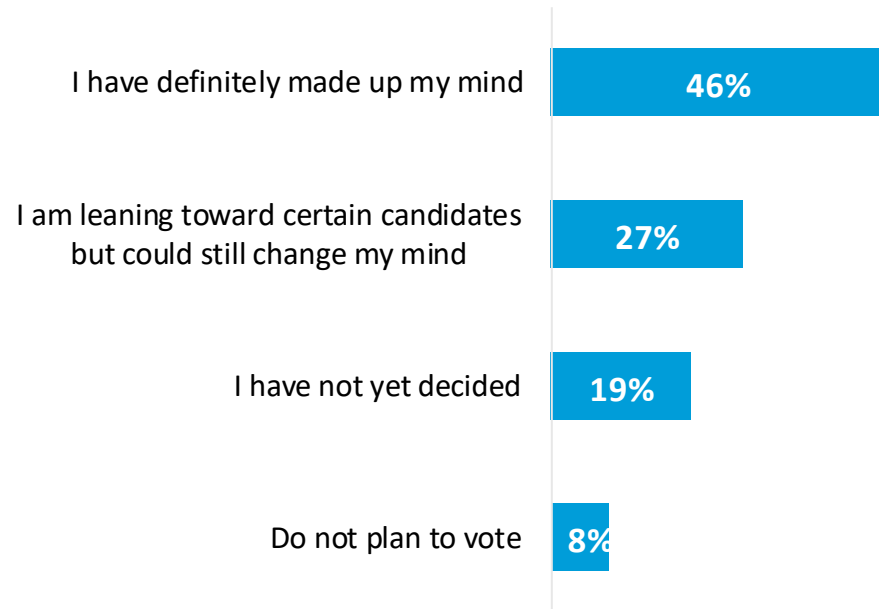

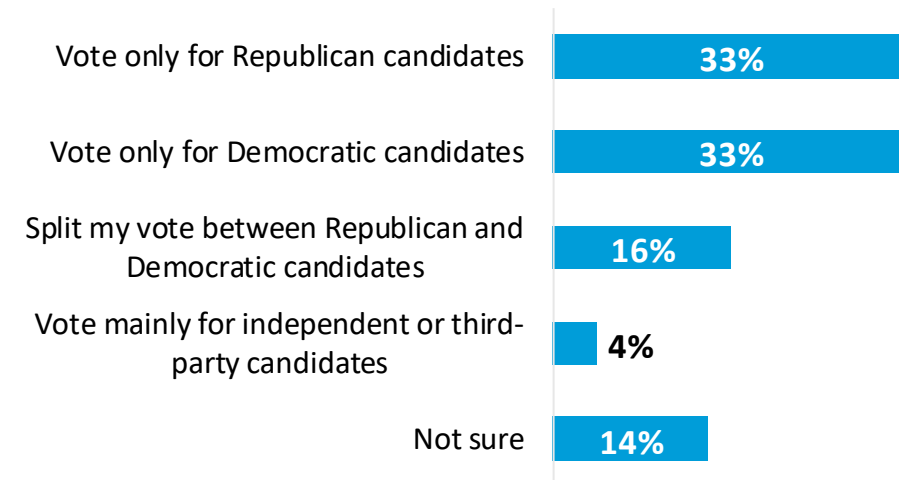

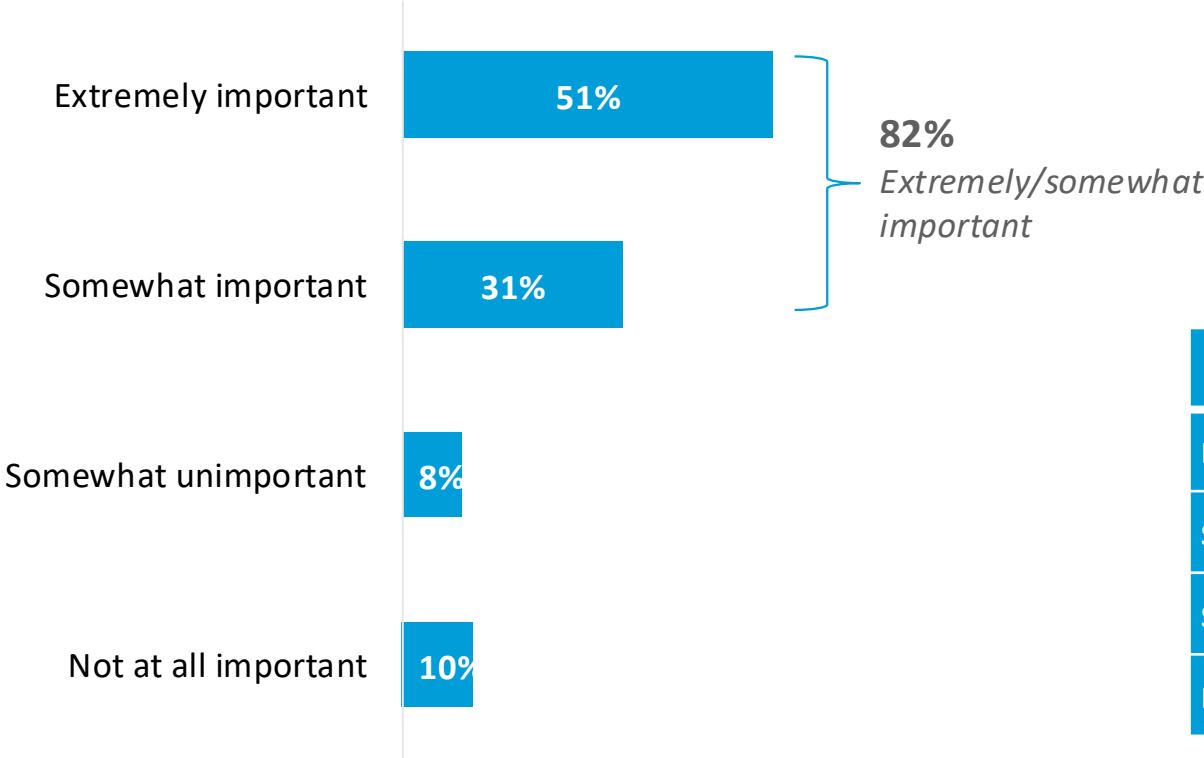

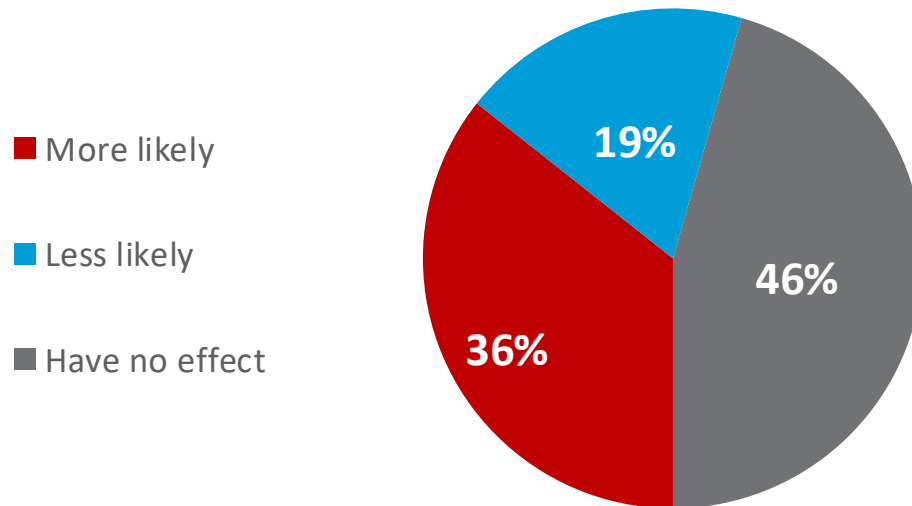
How important or unimportant is this midterm election to you?

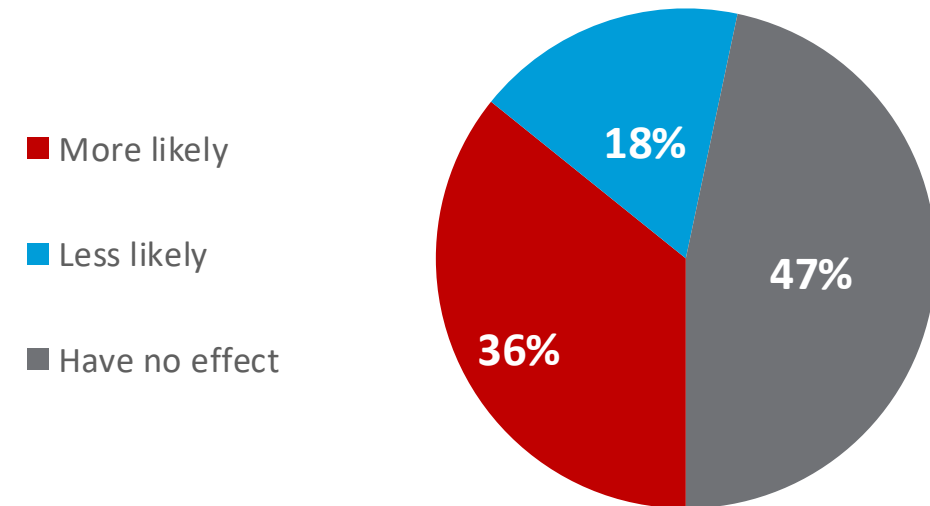

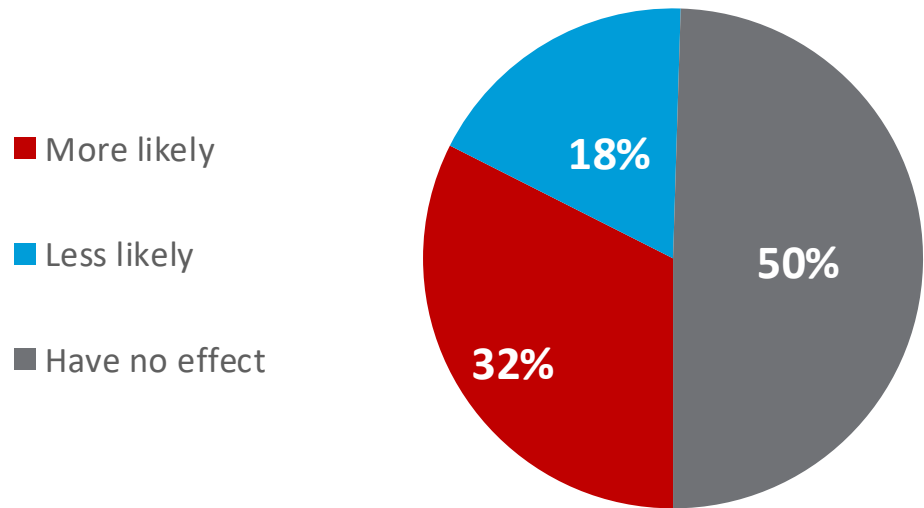

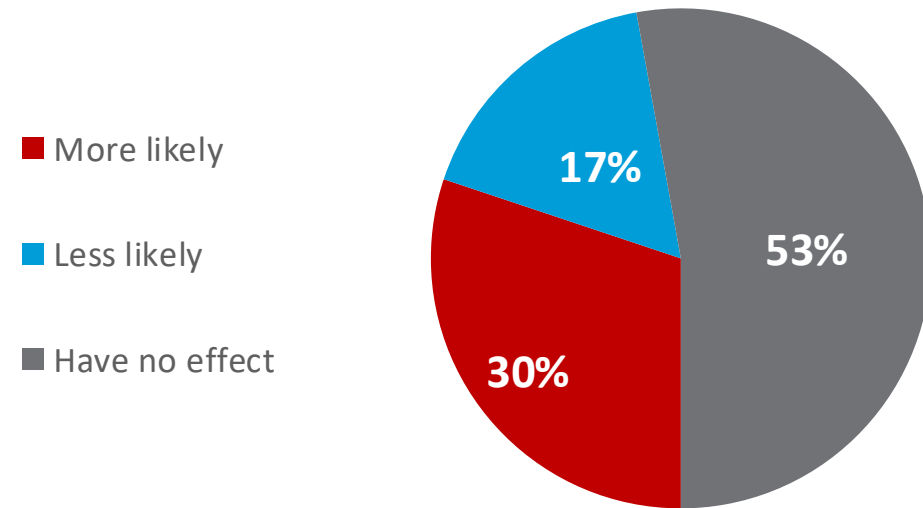

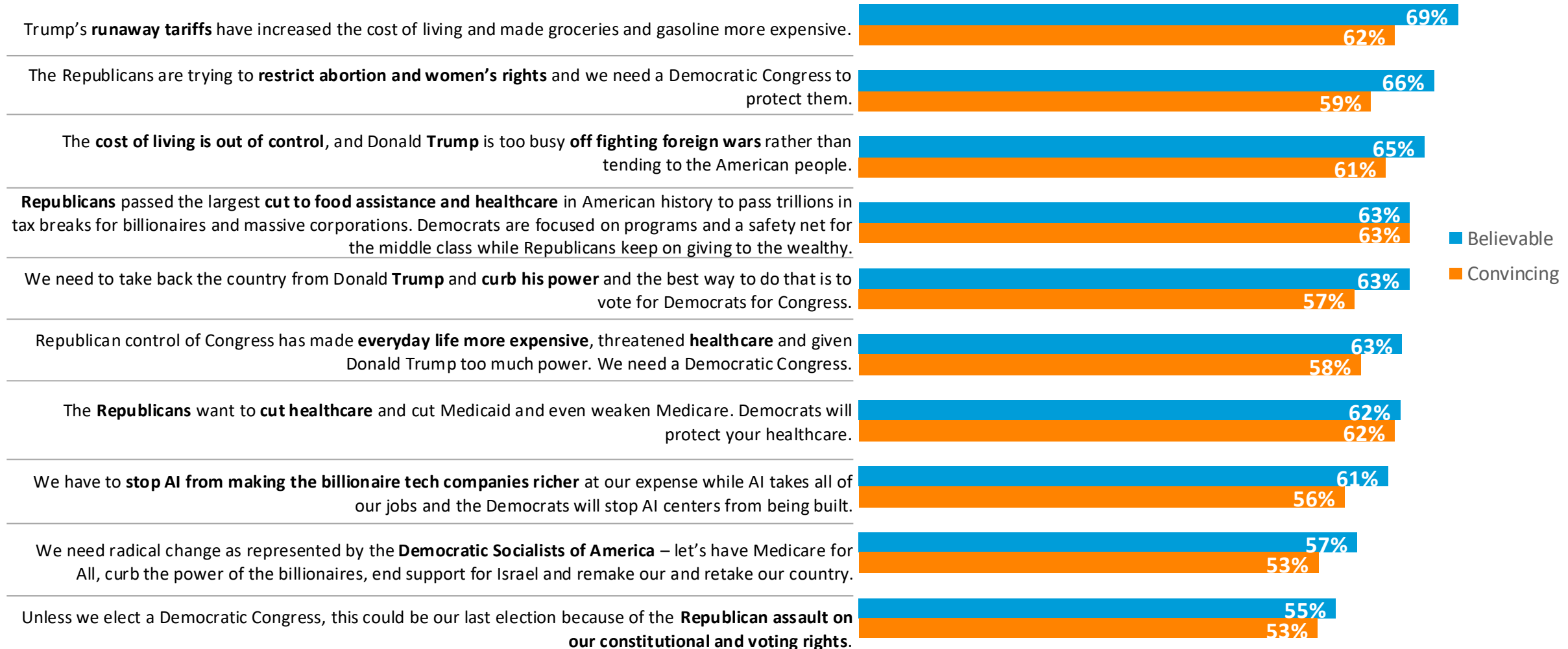

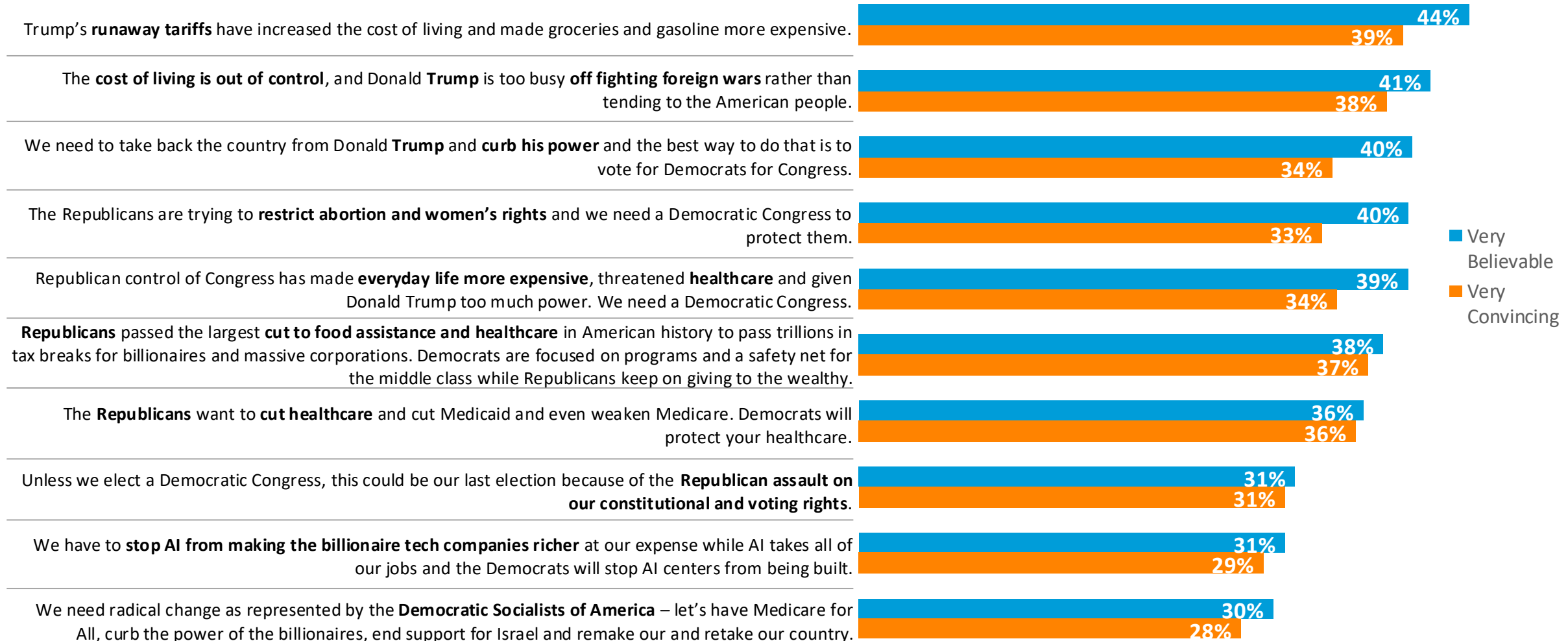

DEM Messaging – Total Believable/Convincing



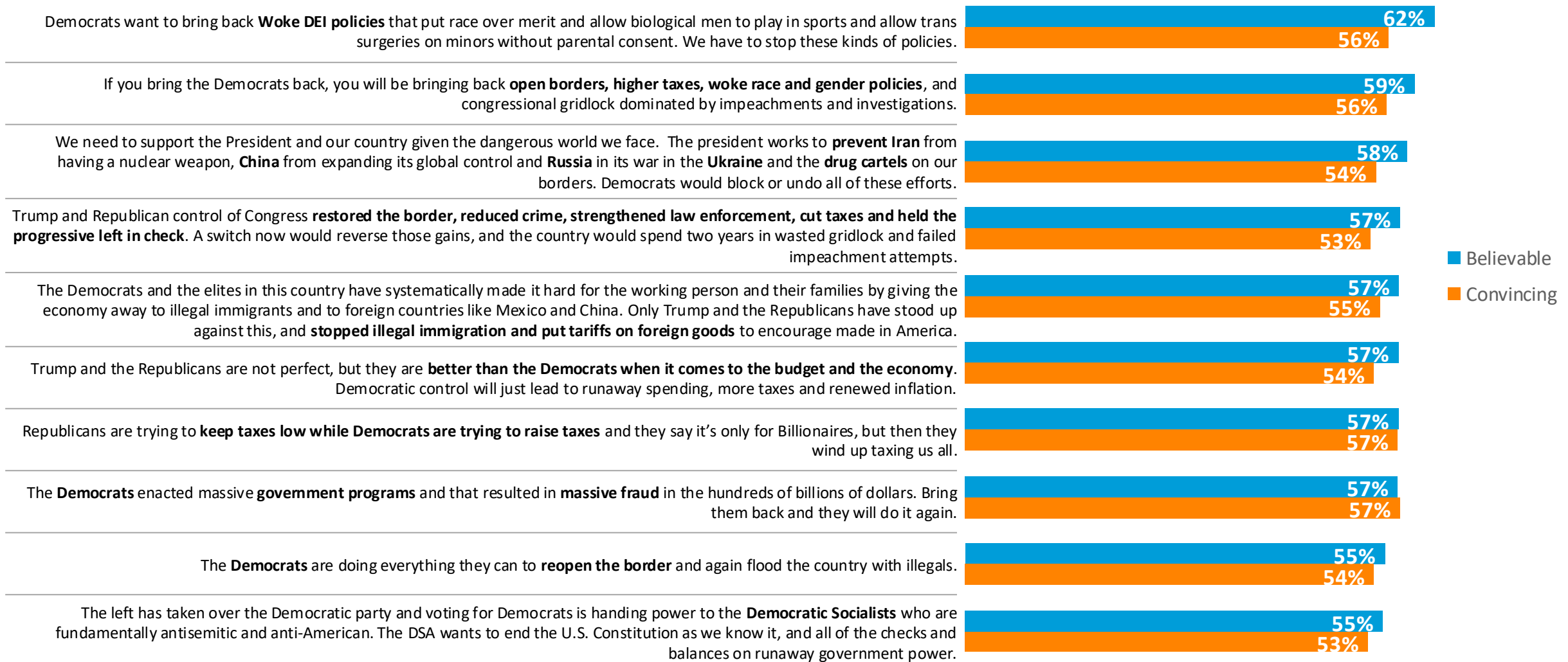

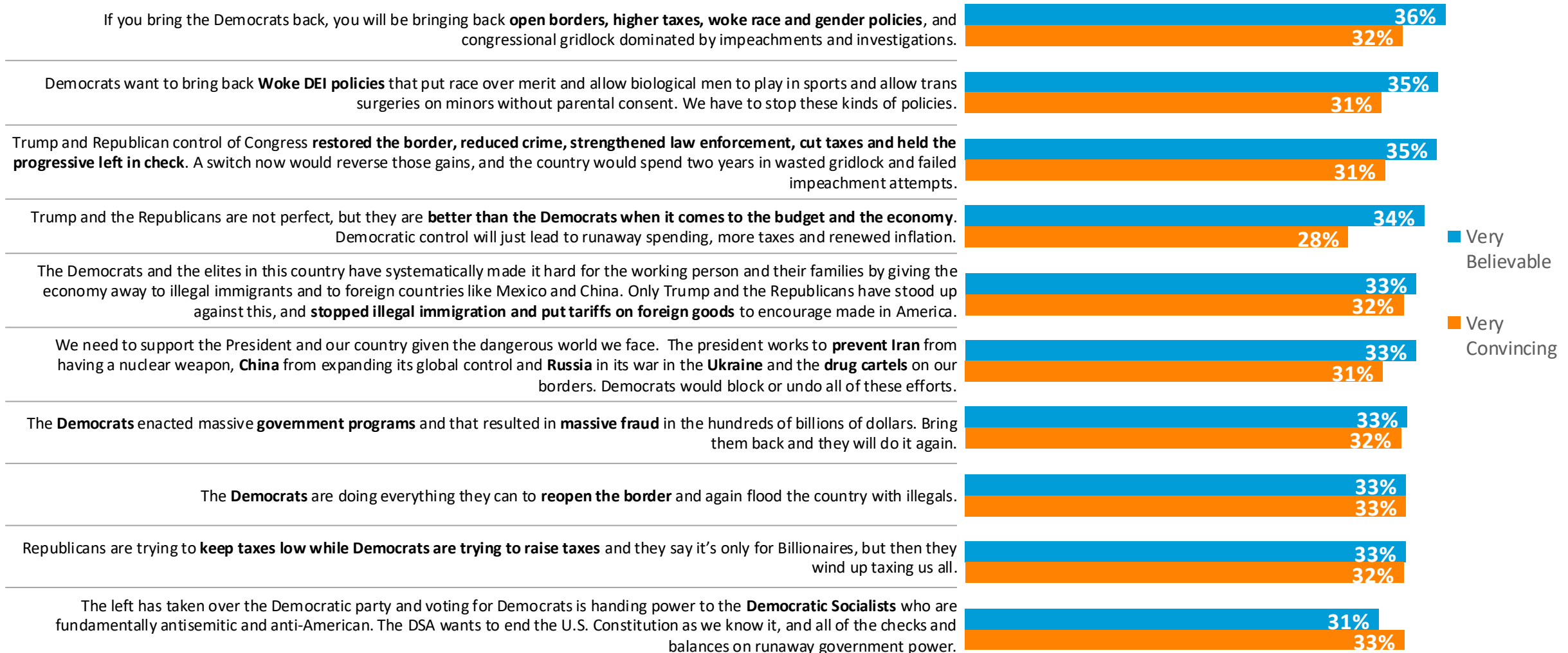

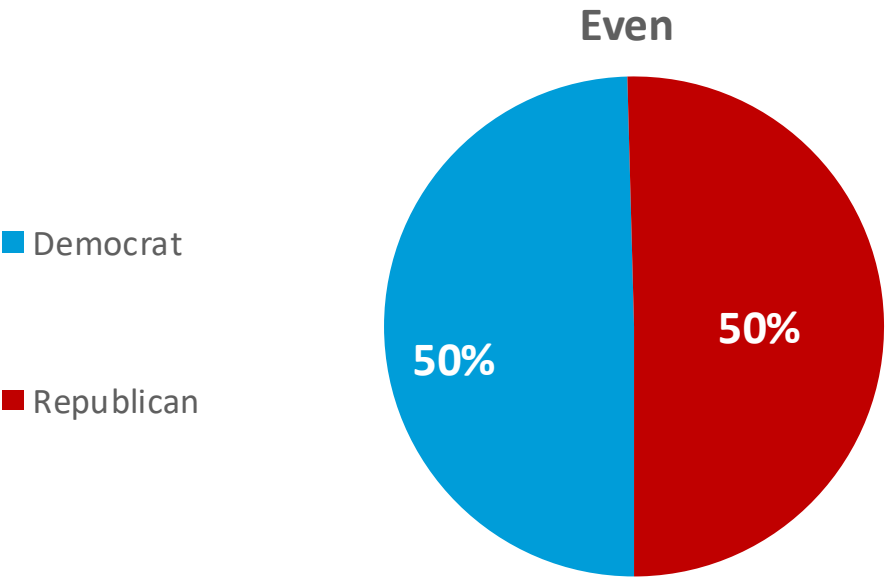

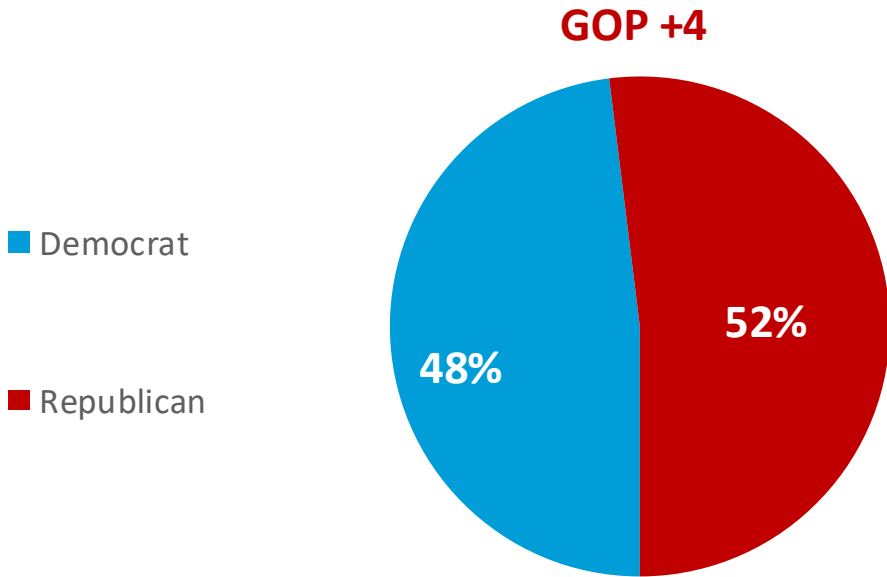

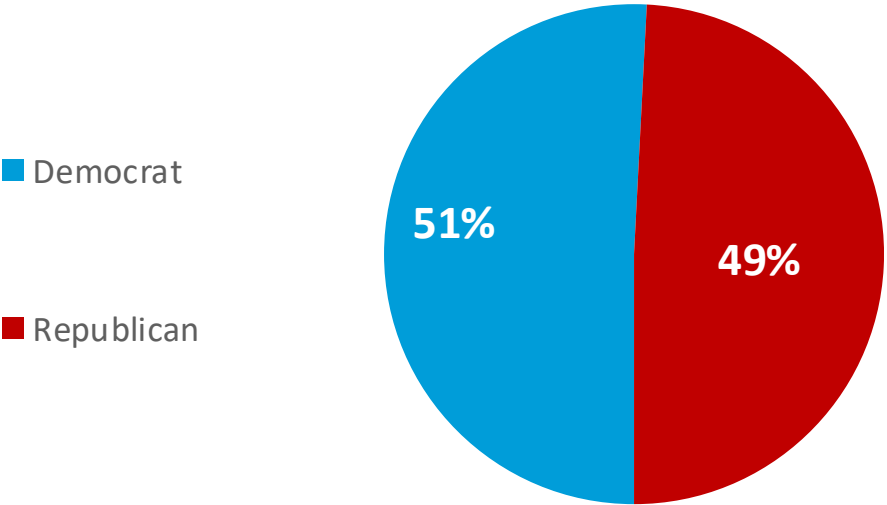

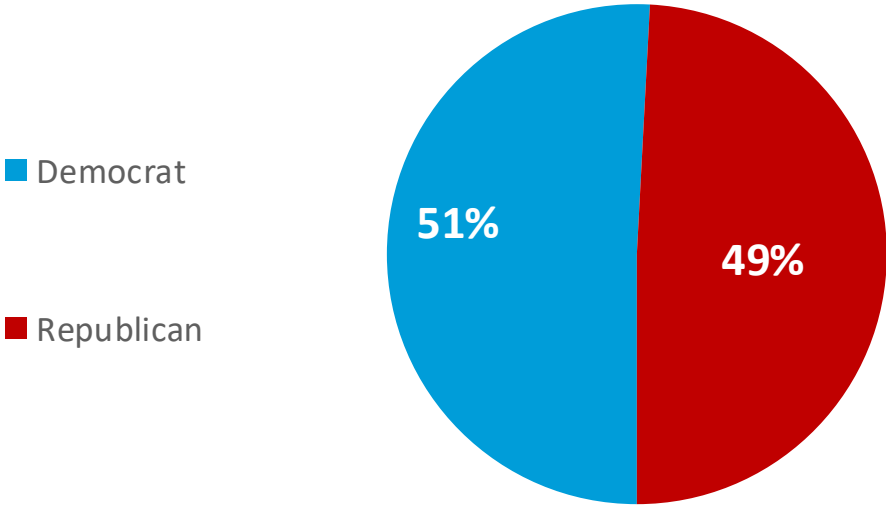

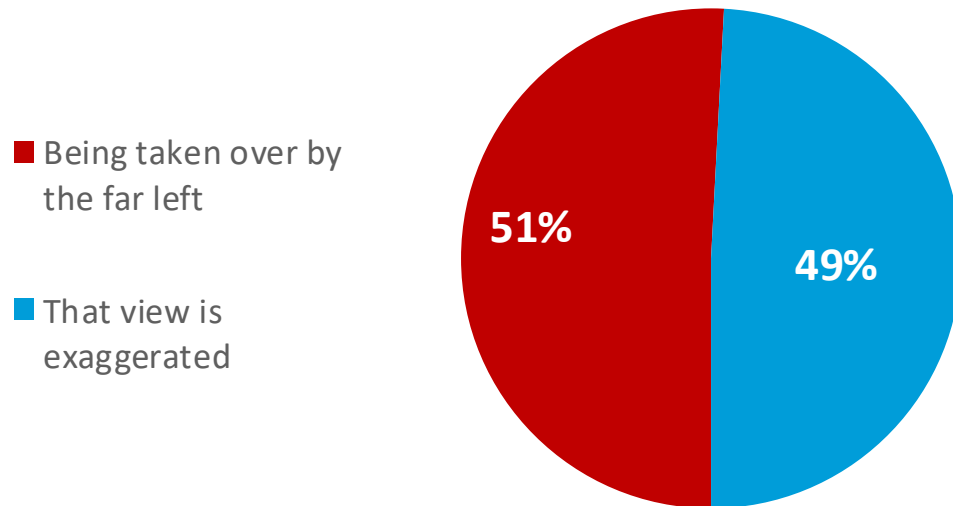

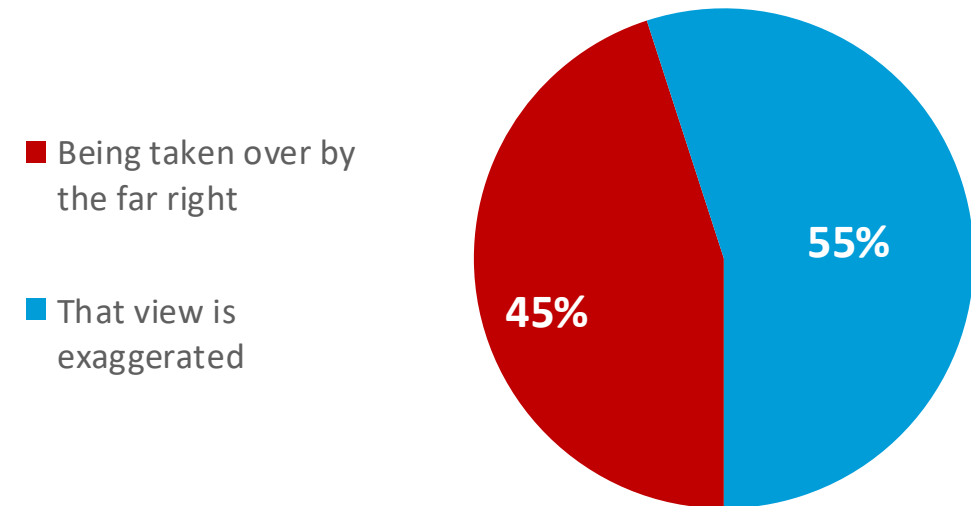

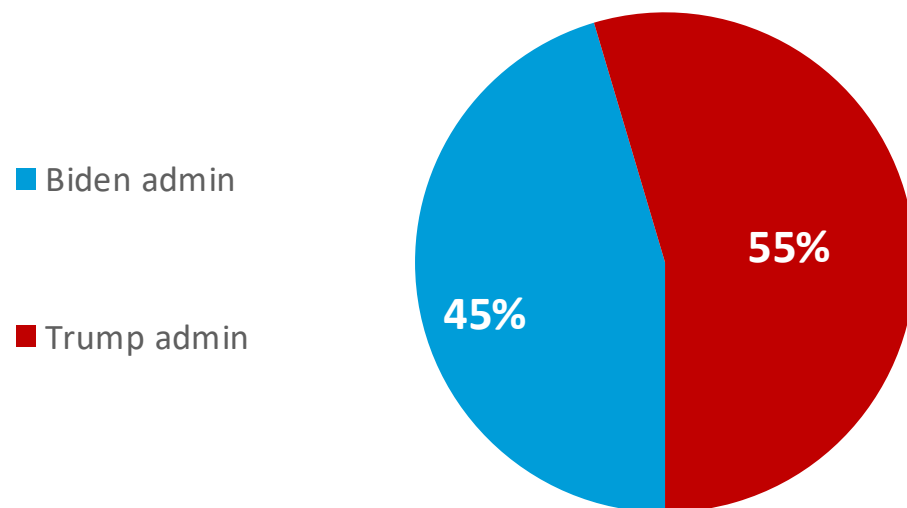

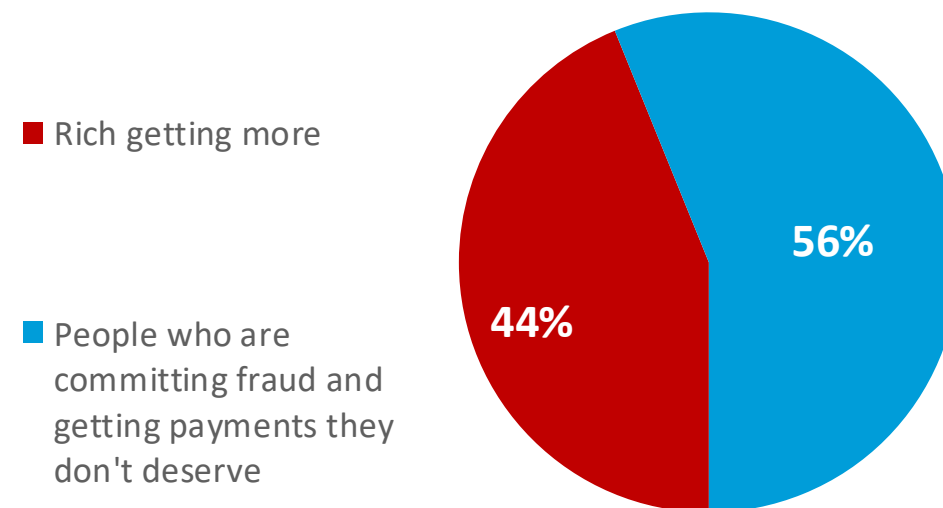

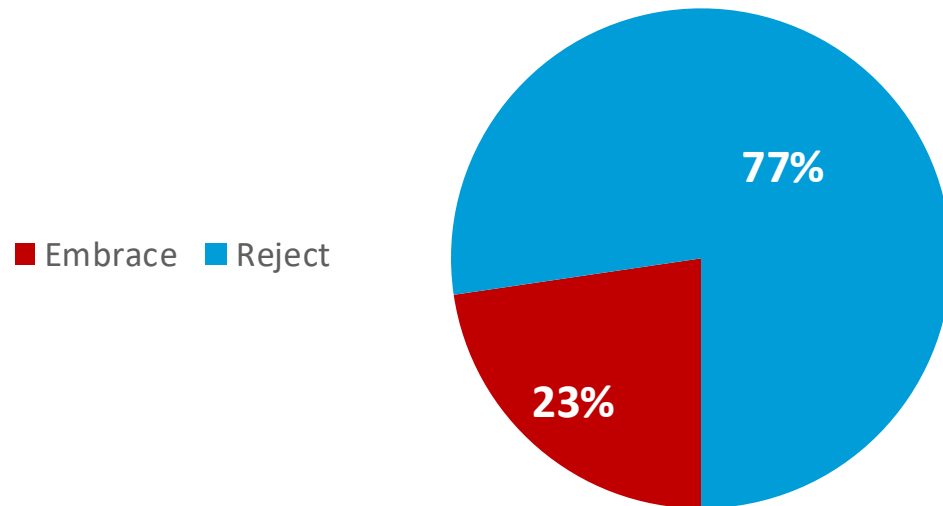

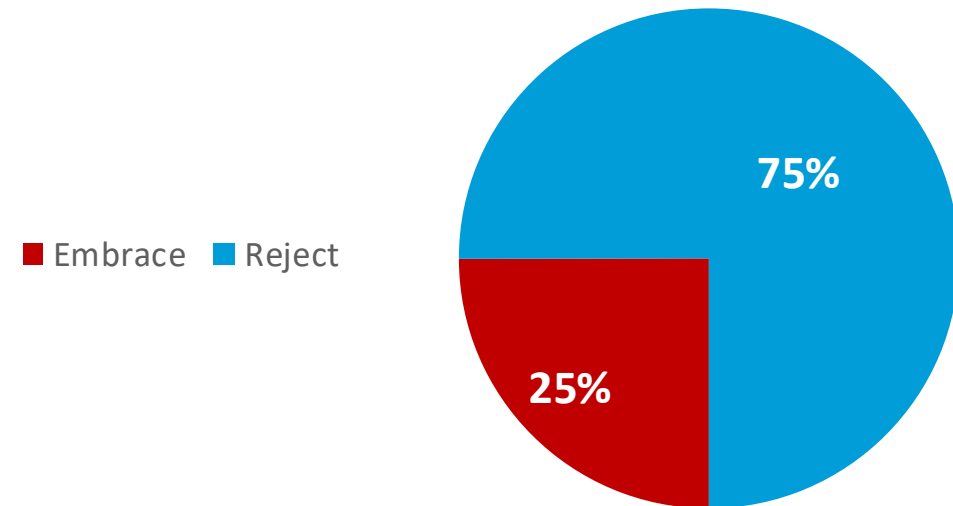

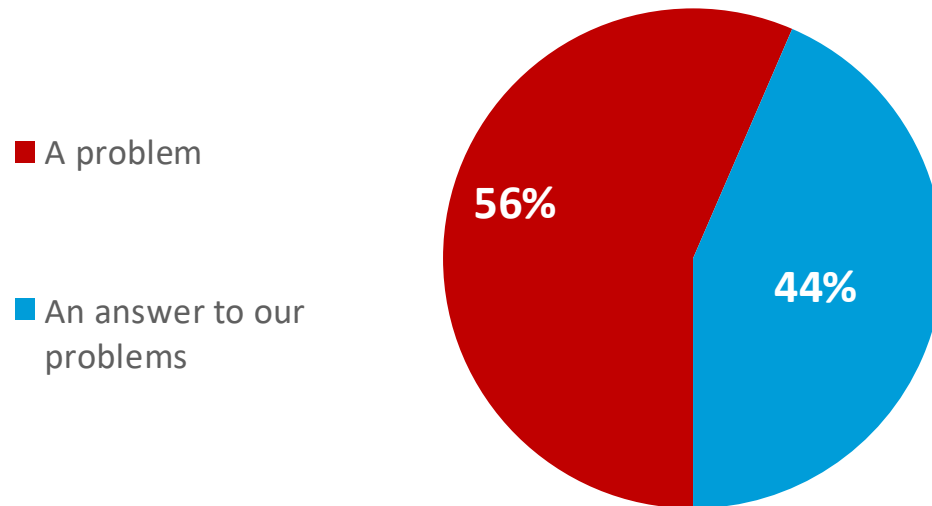

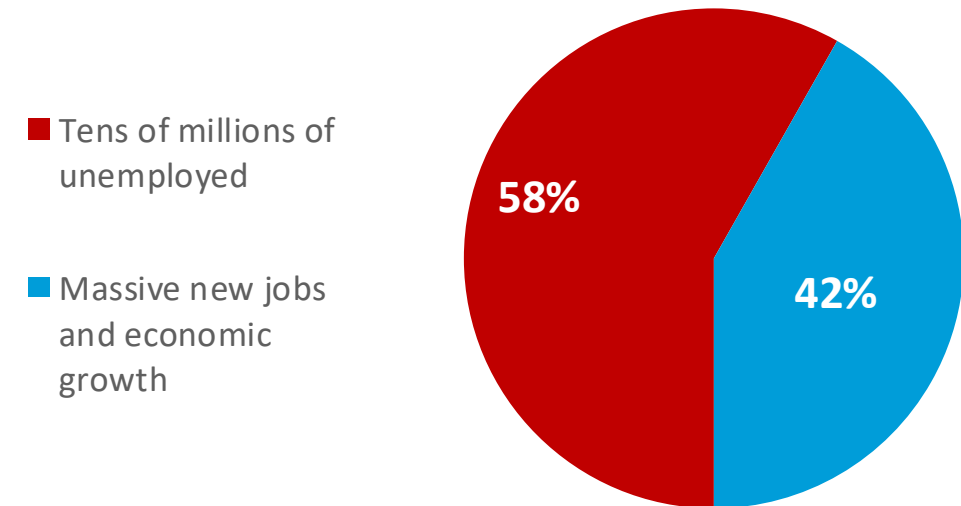

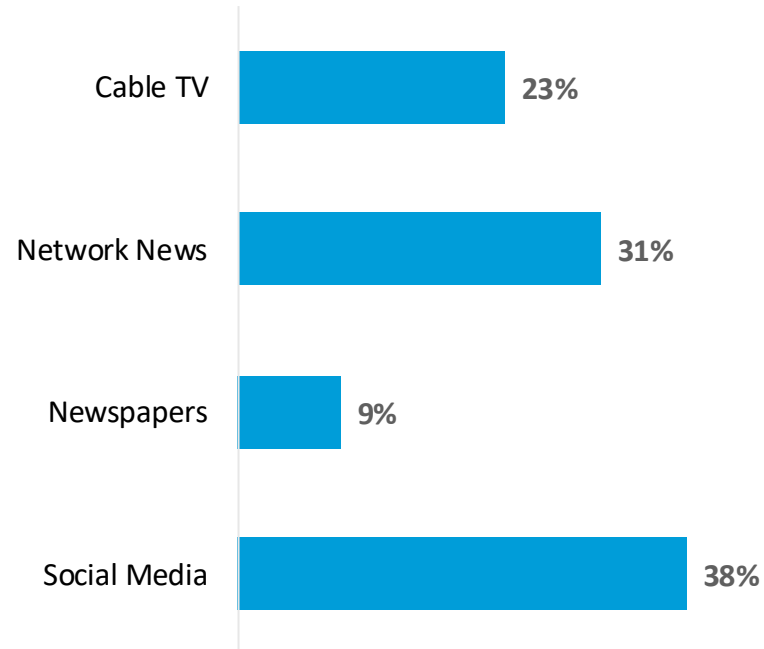

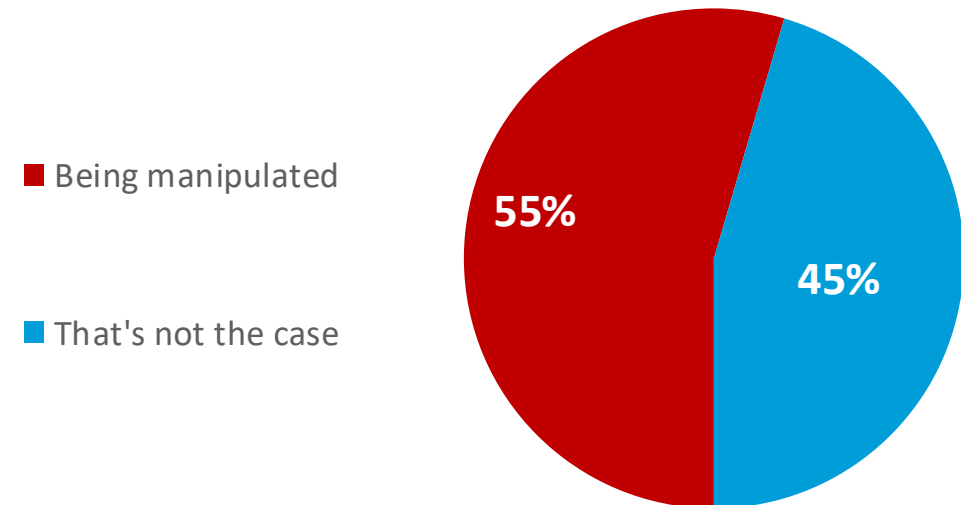

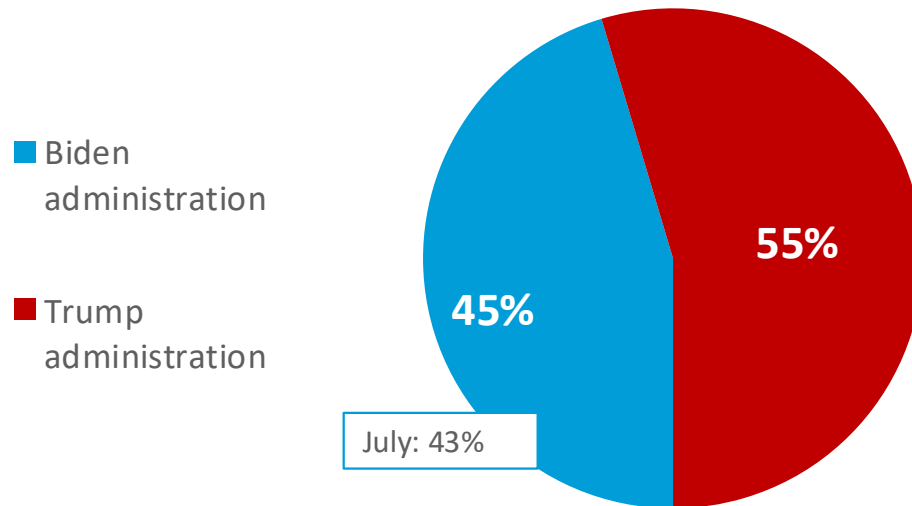

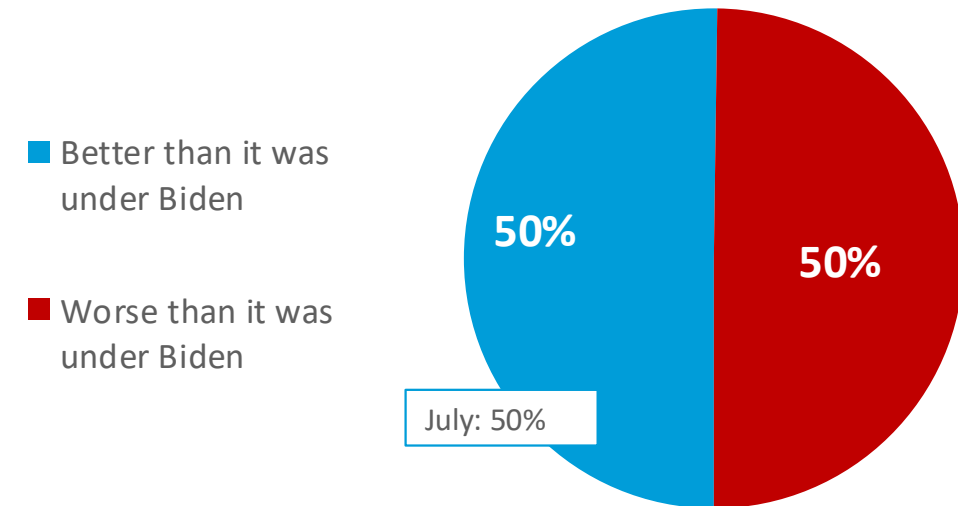

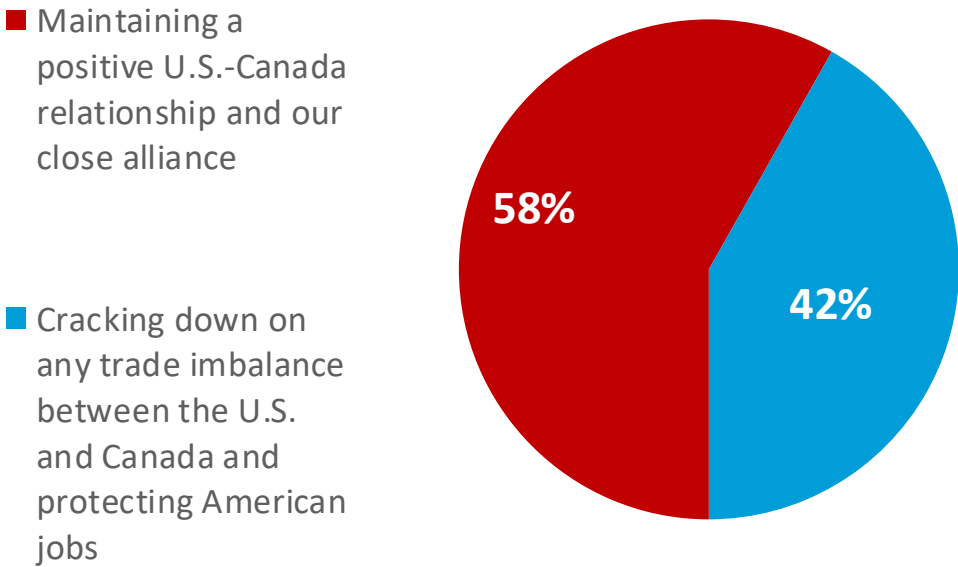

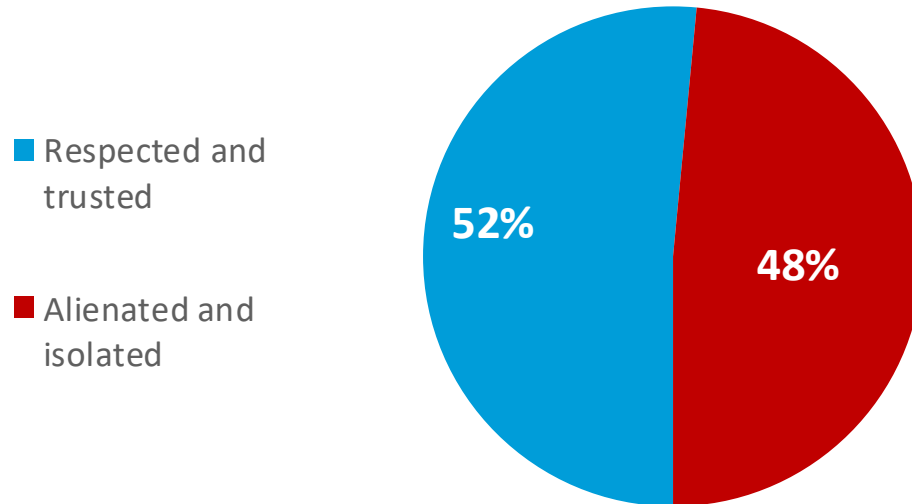

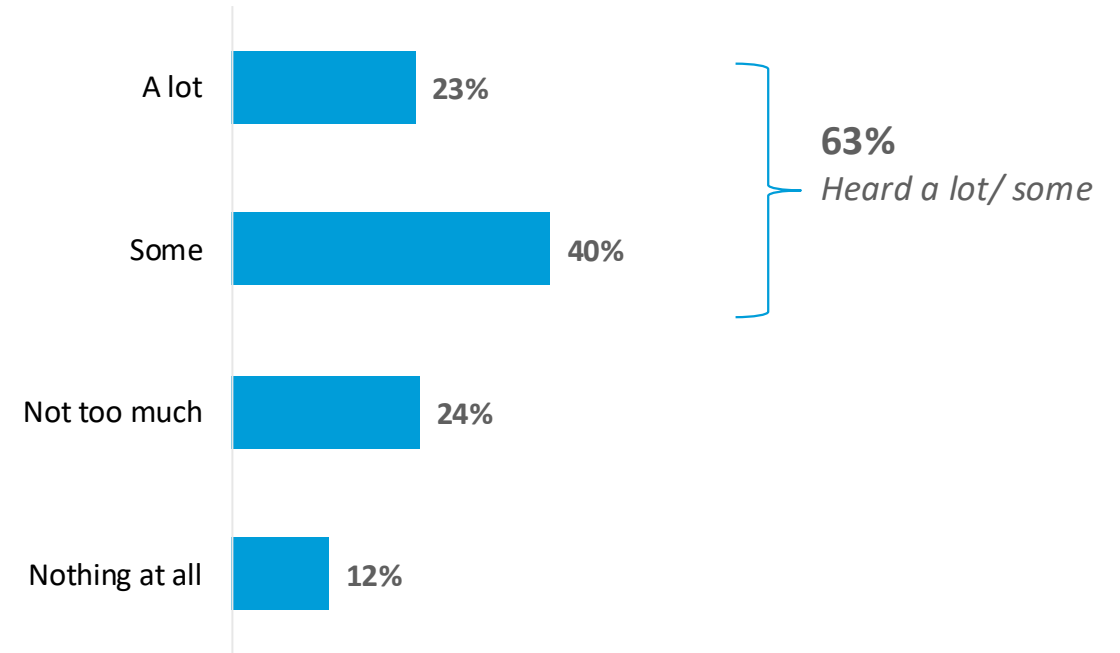

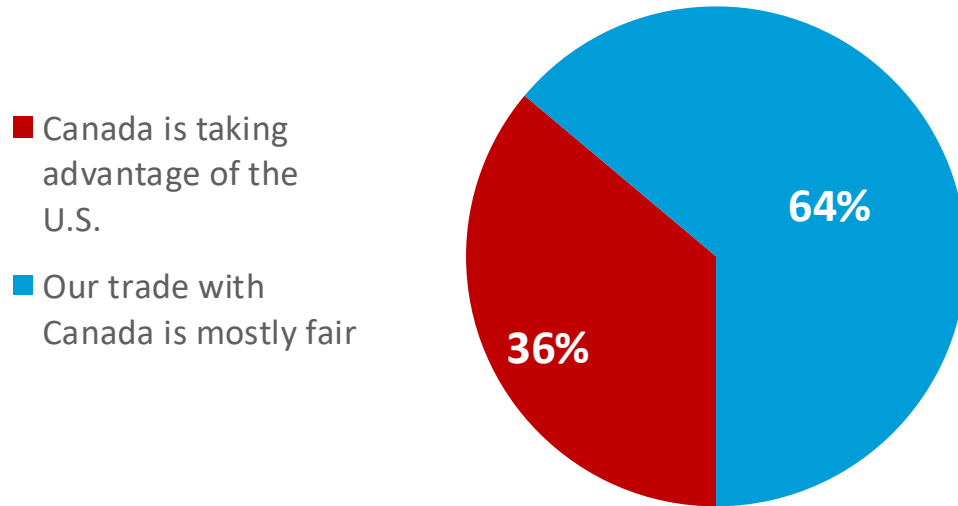

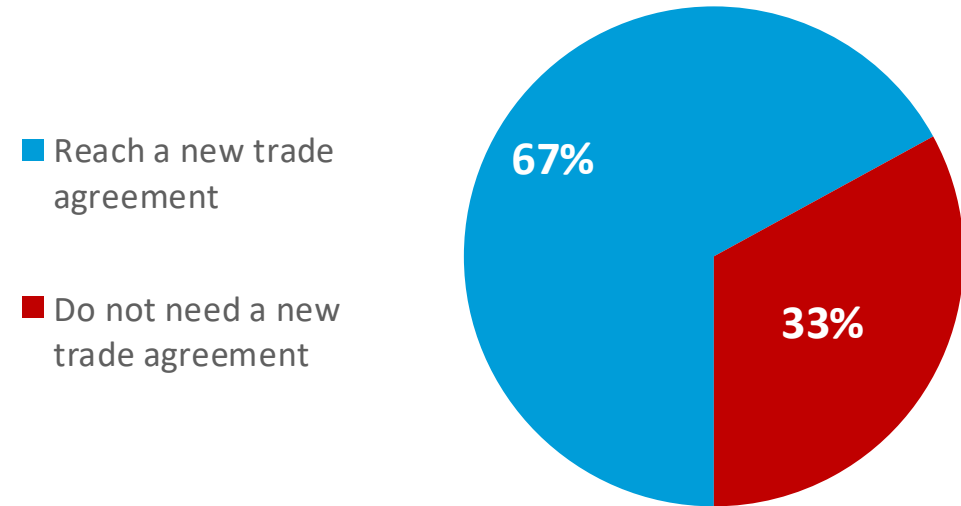

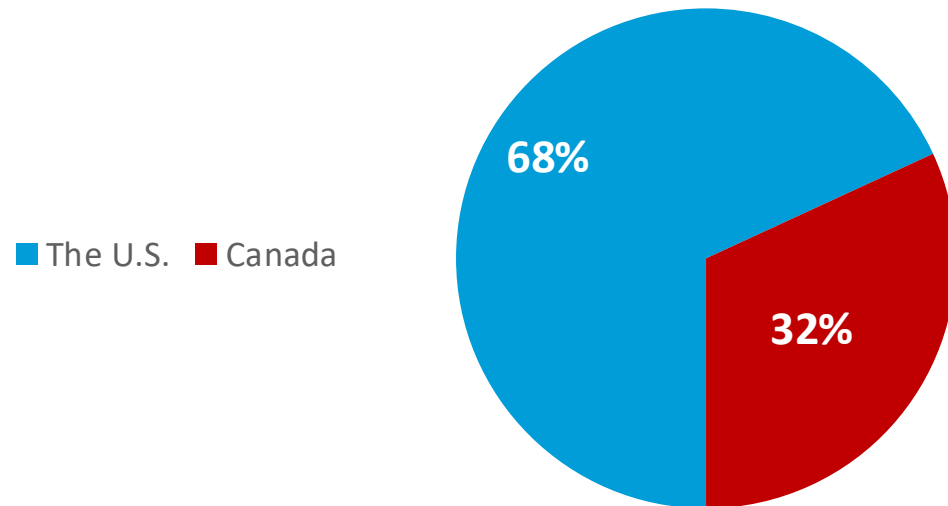

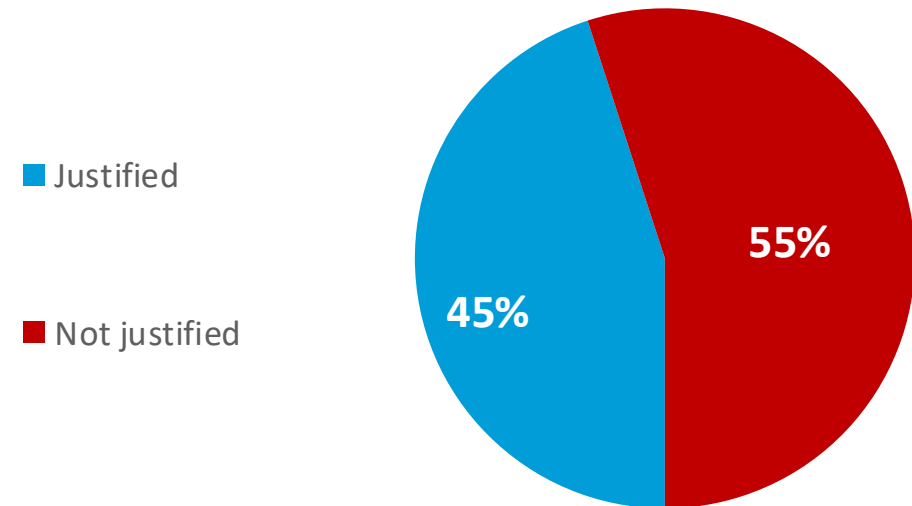

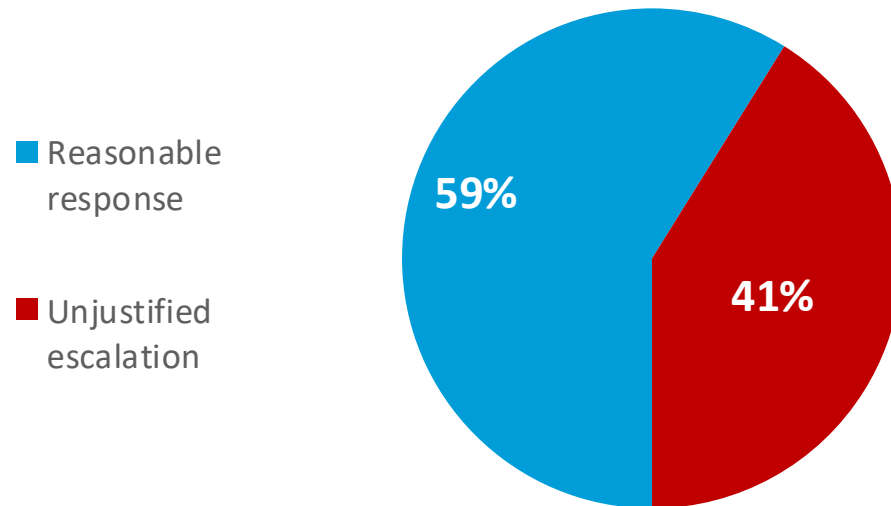

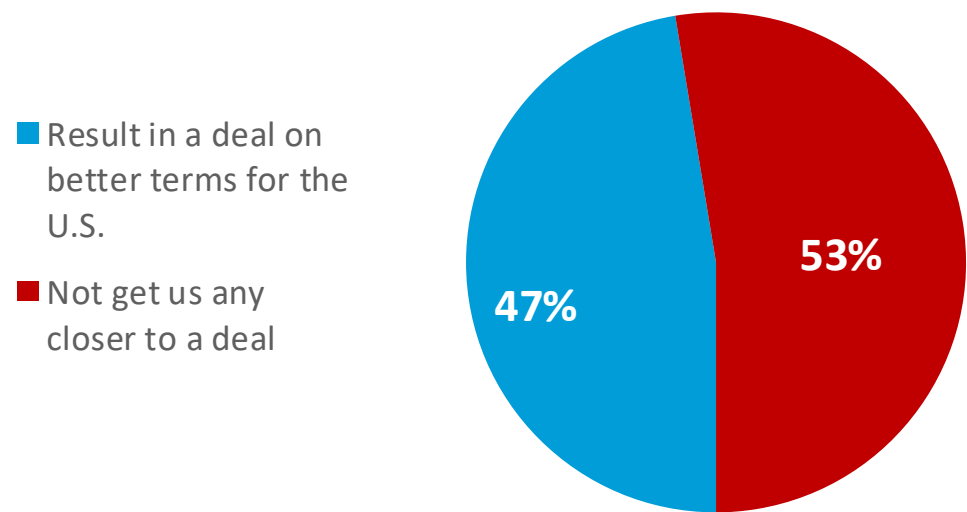

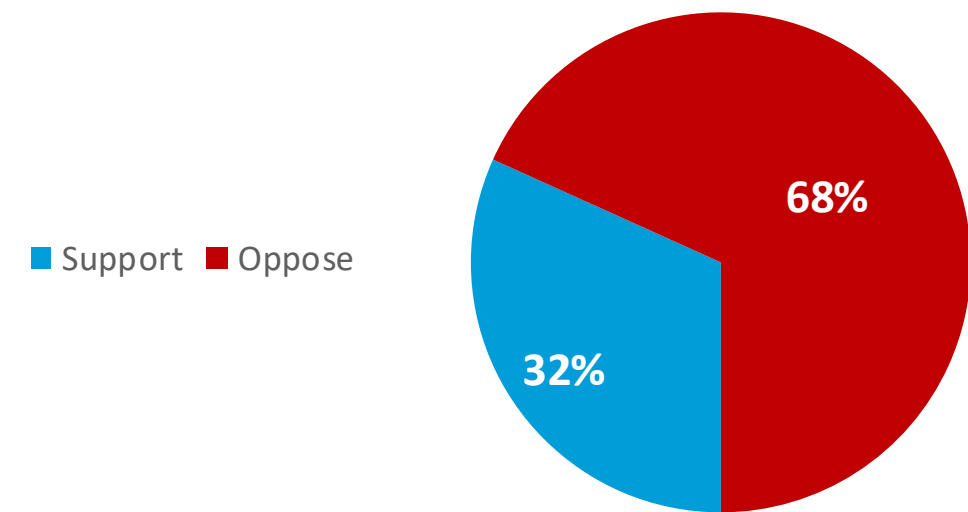

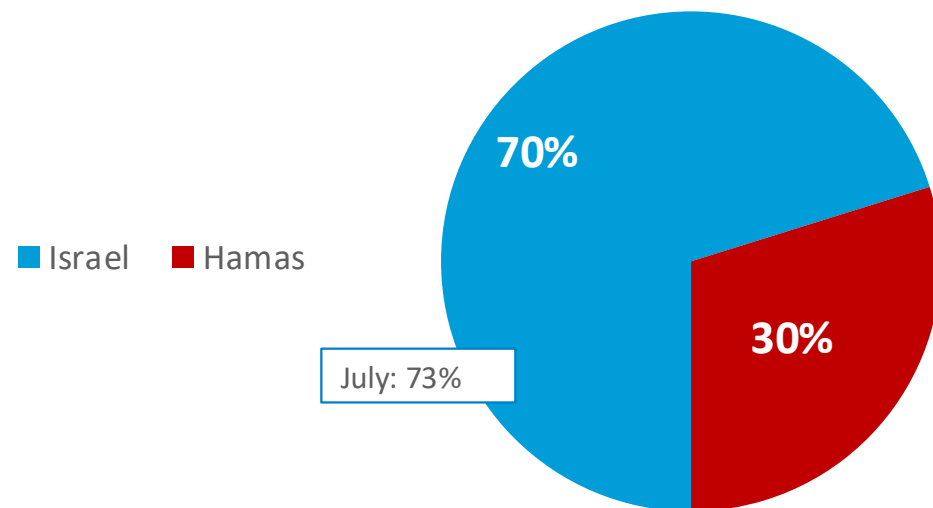

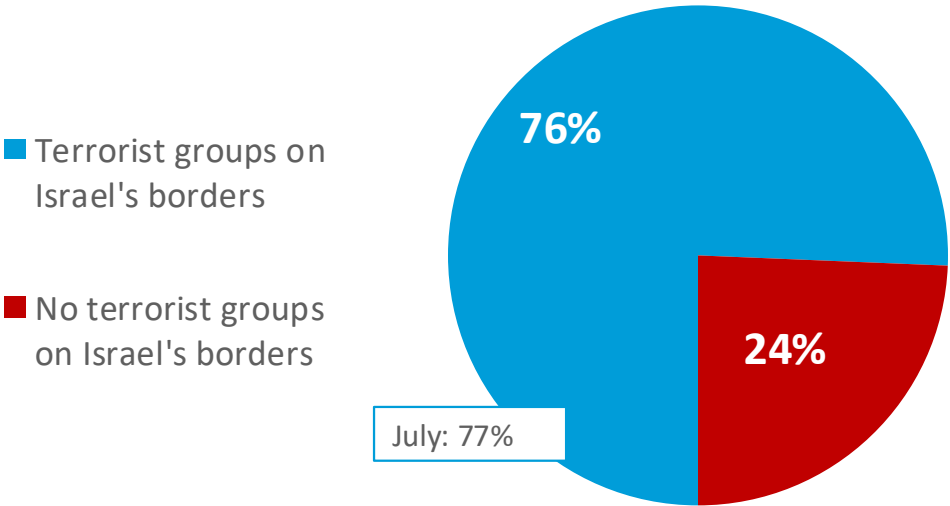

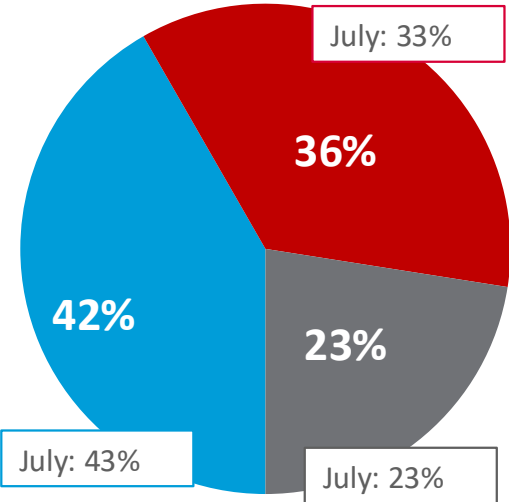

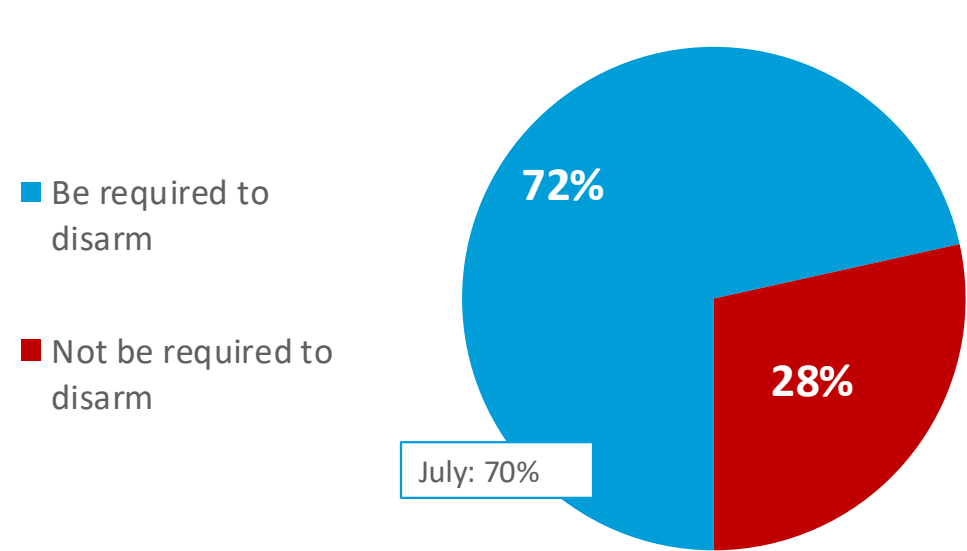

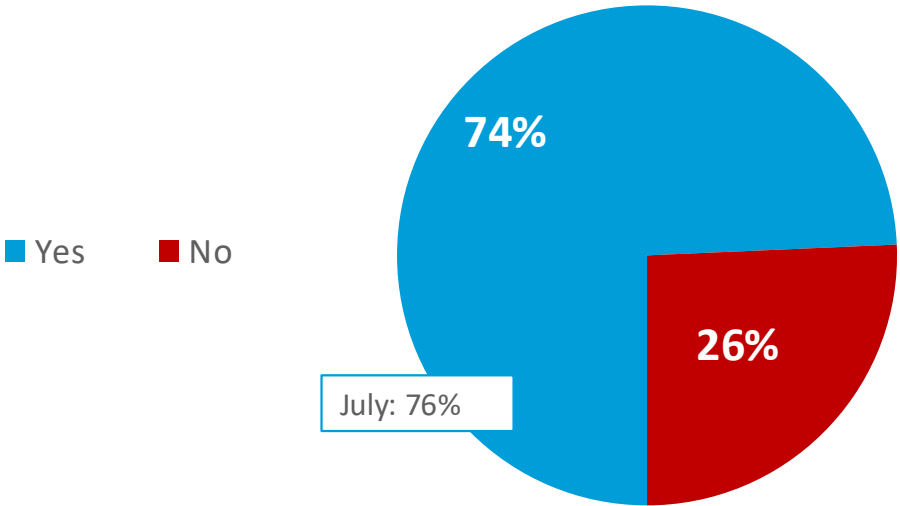

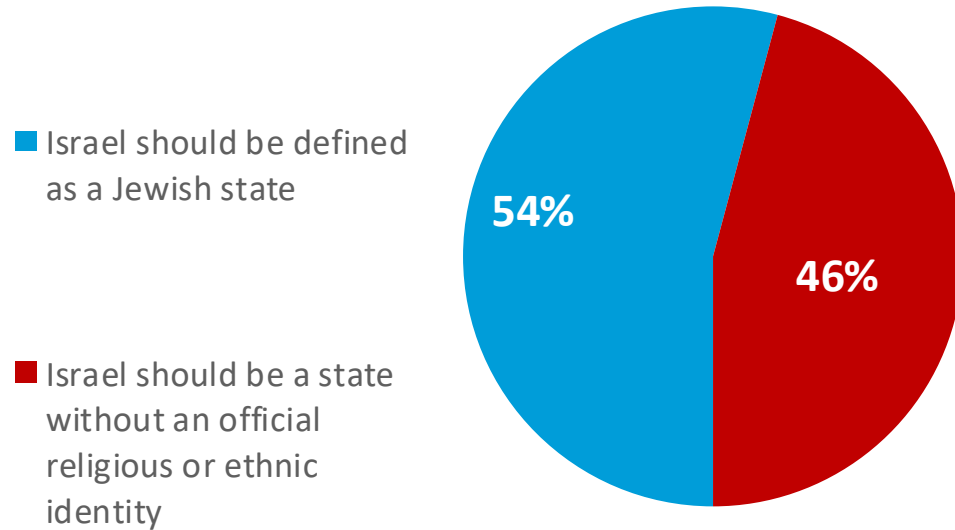

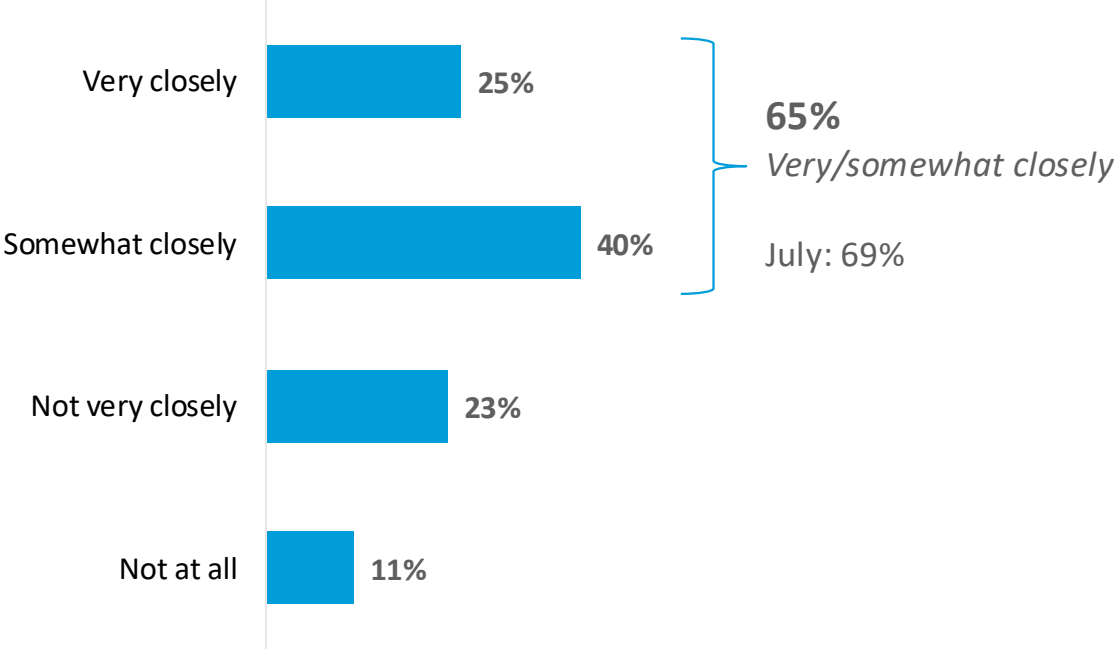

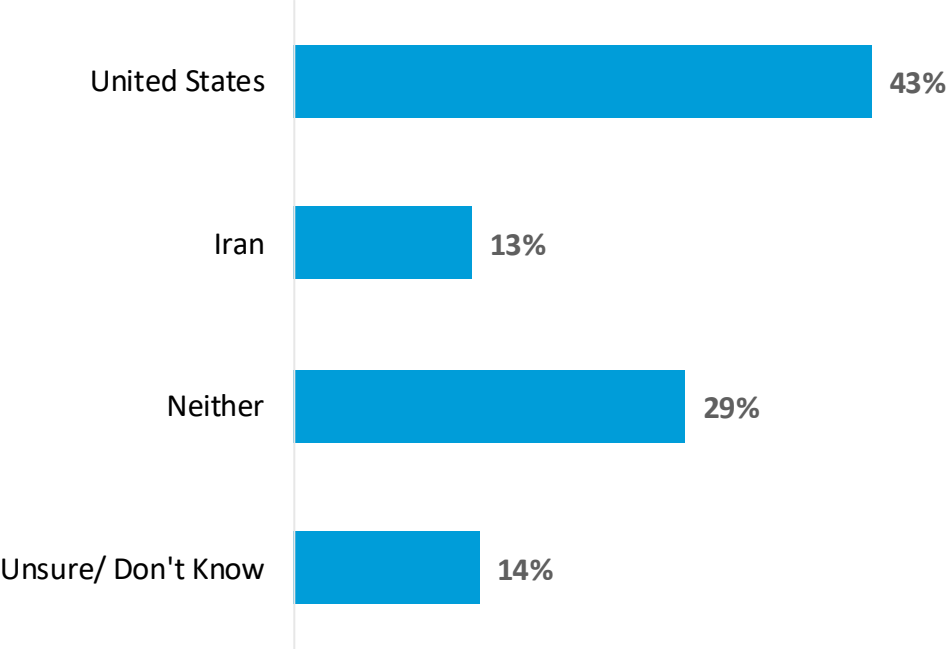

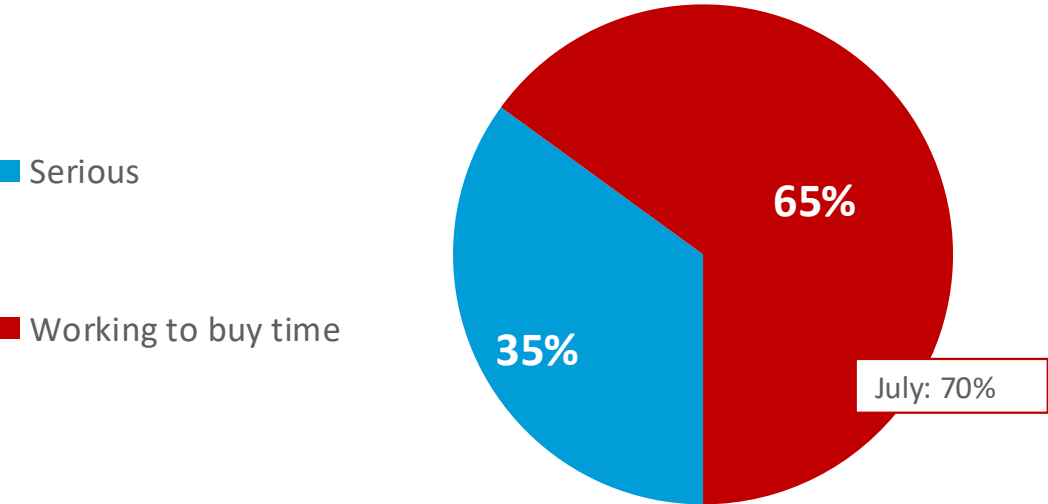

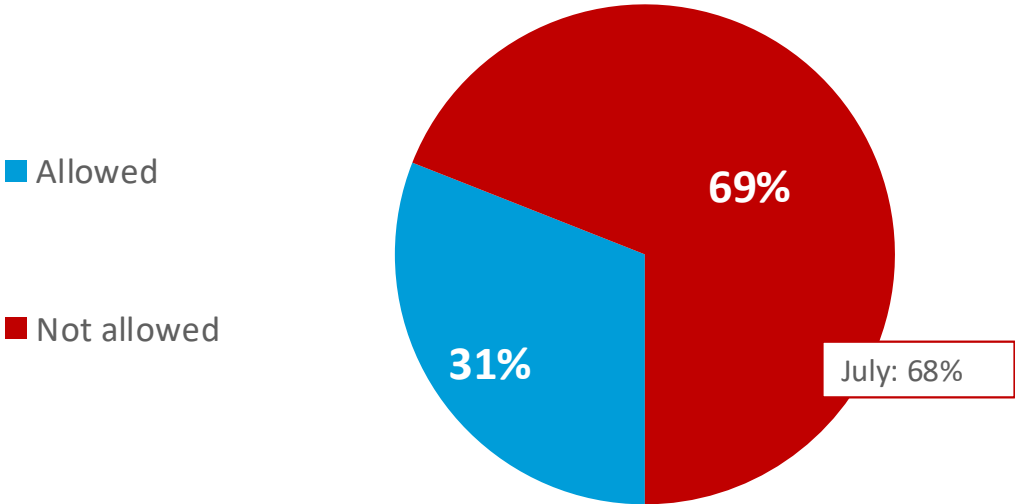

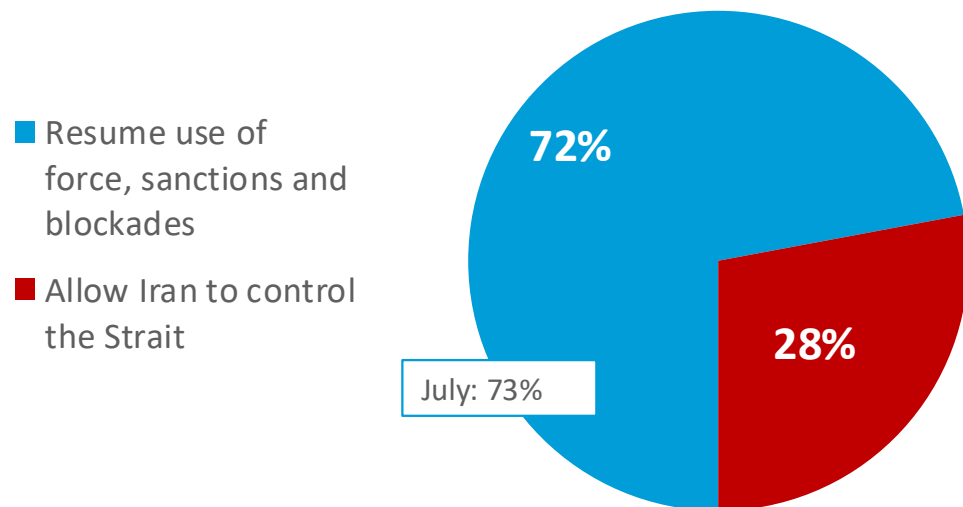

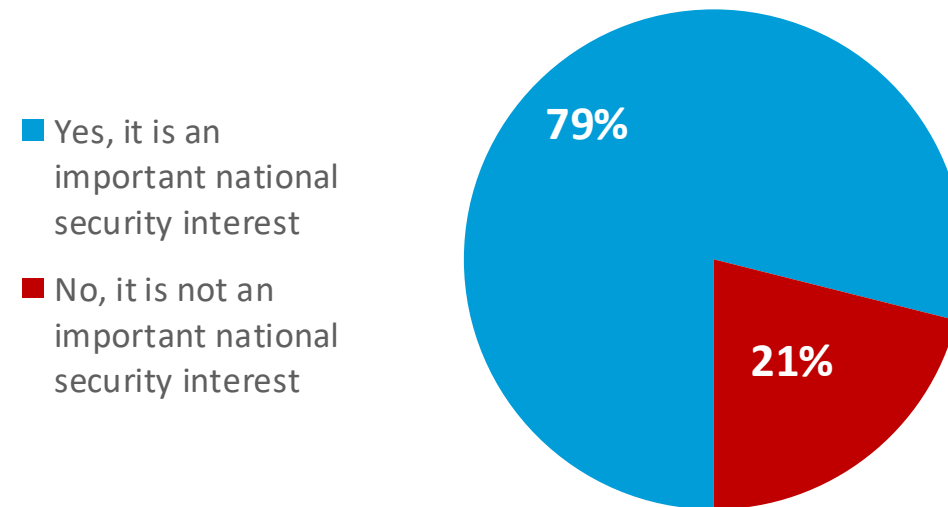

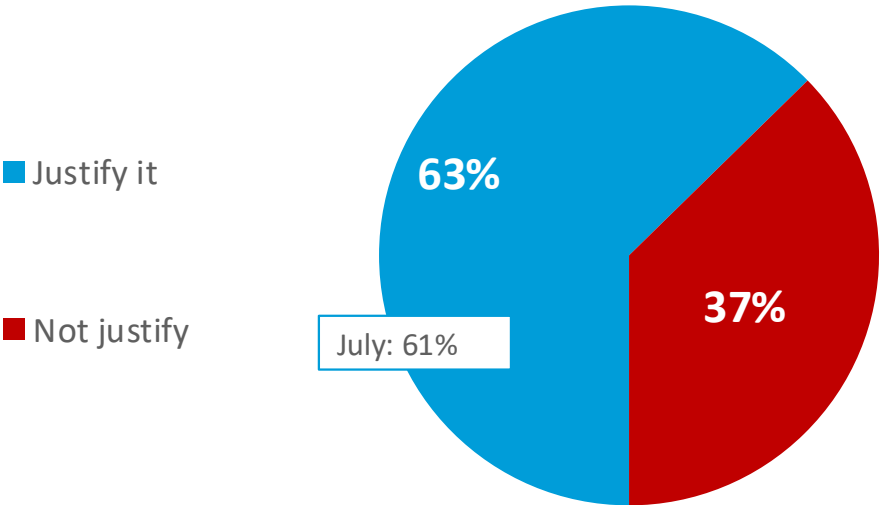

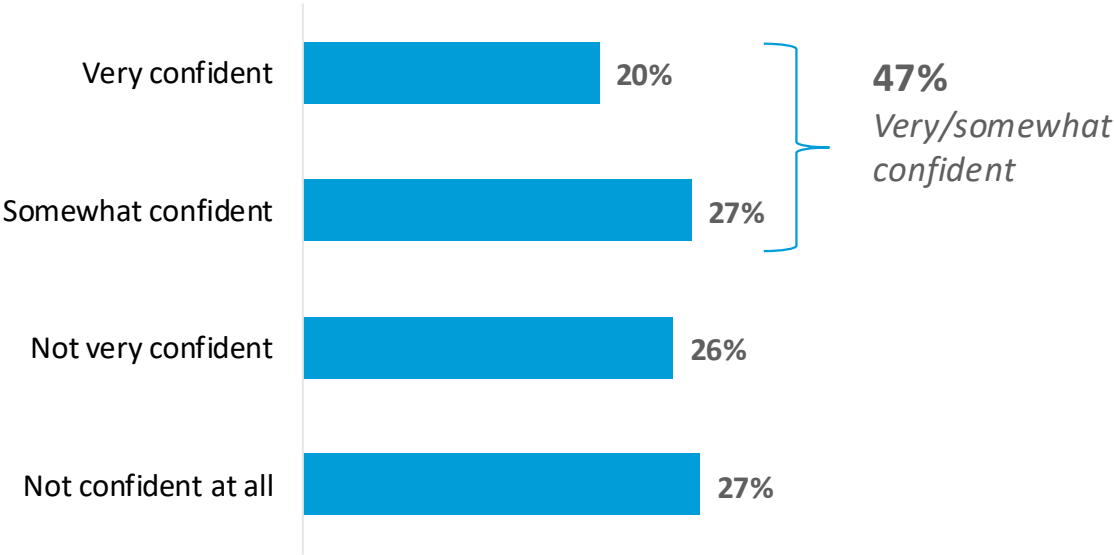

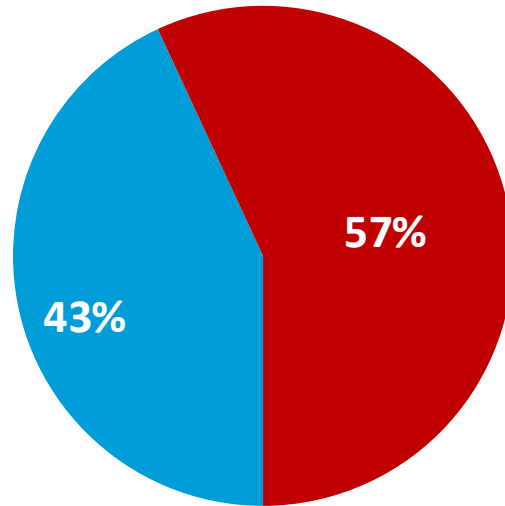

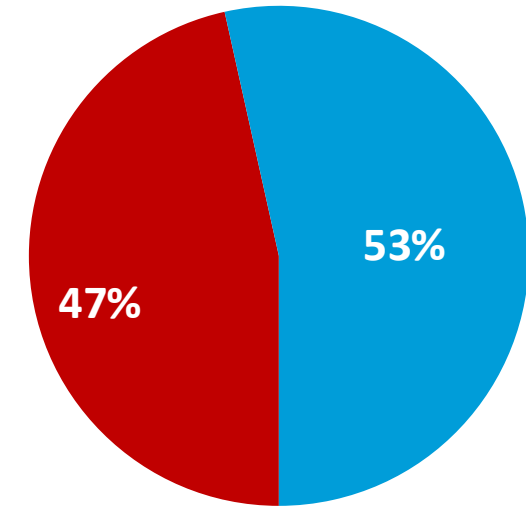

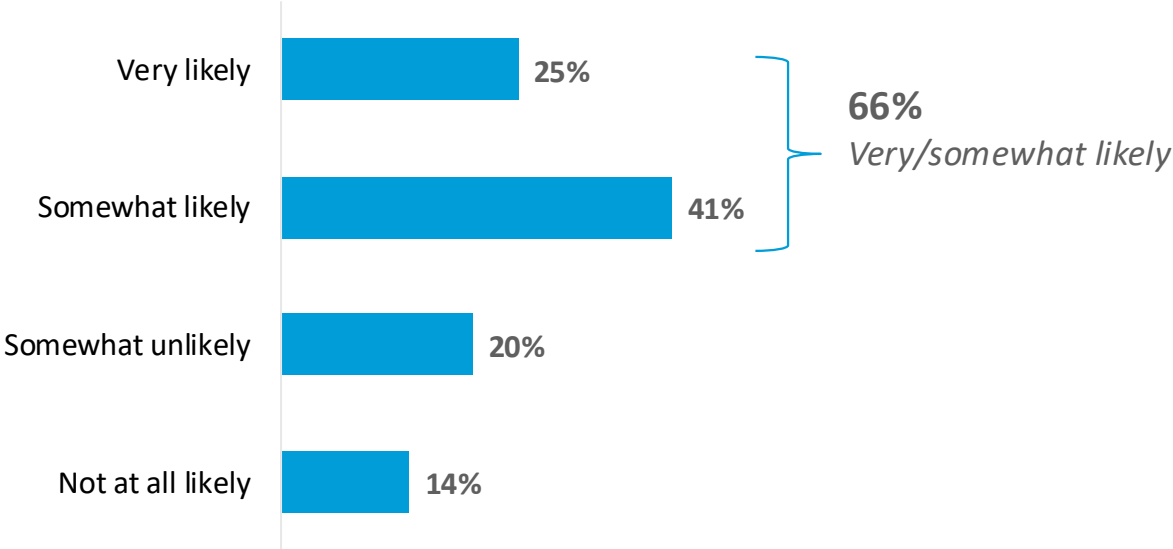

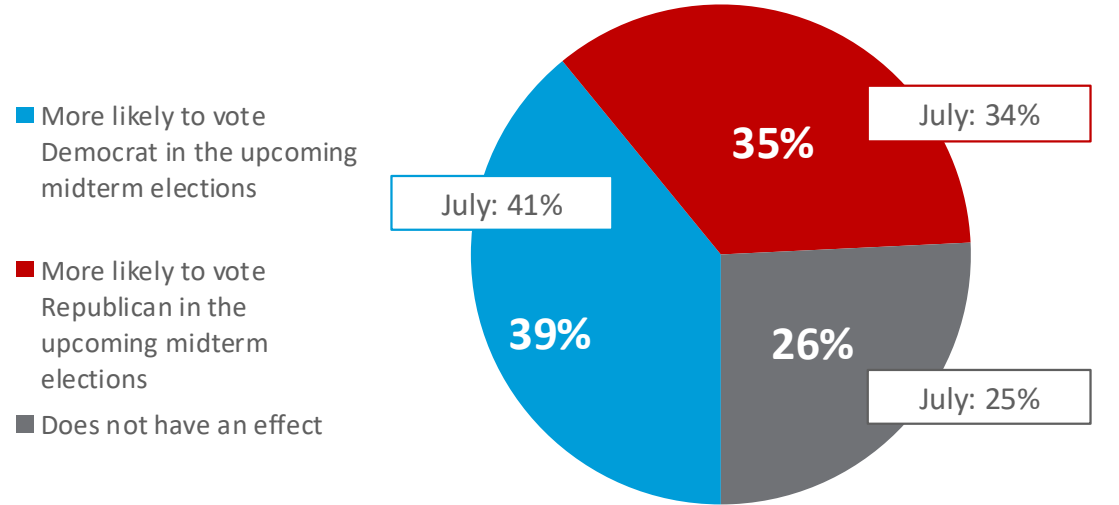

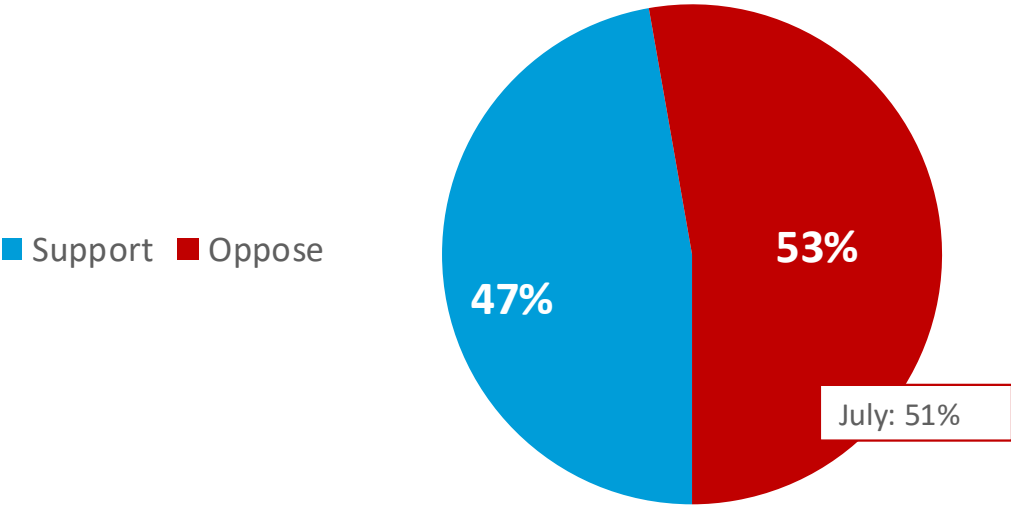

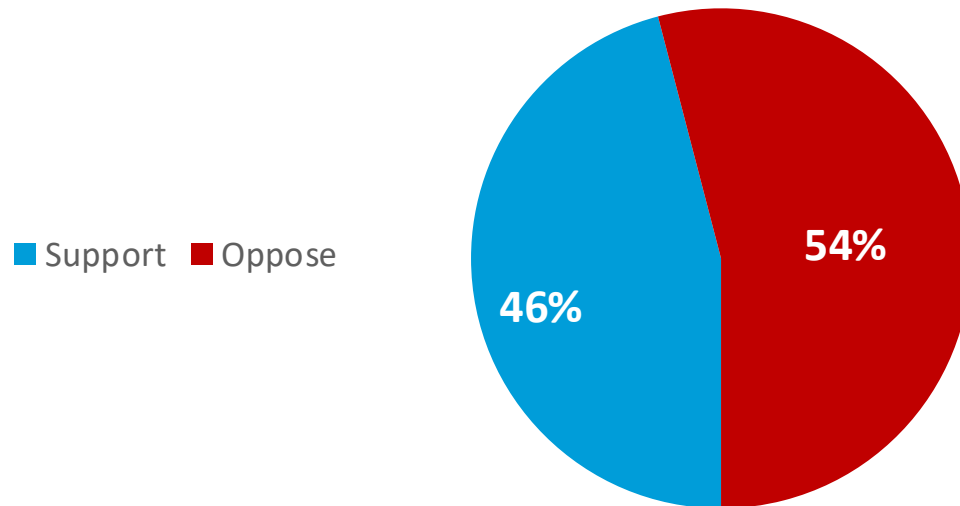

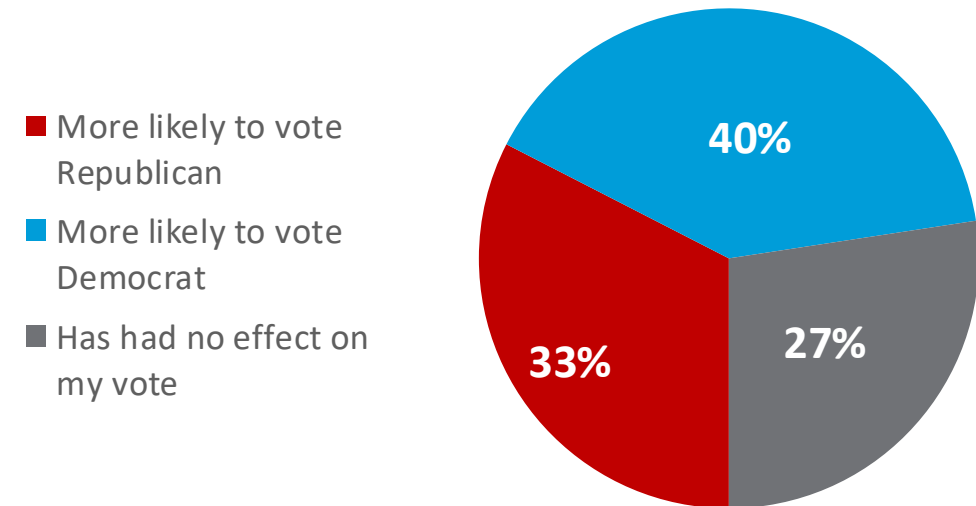

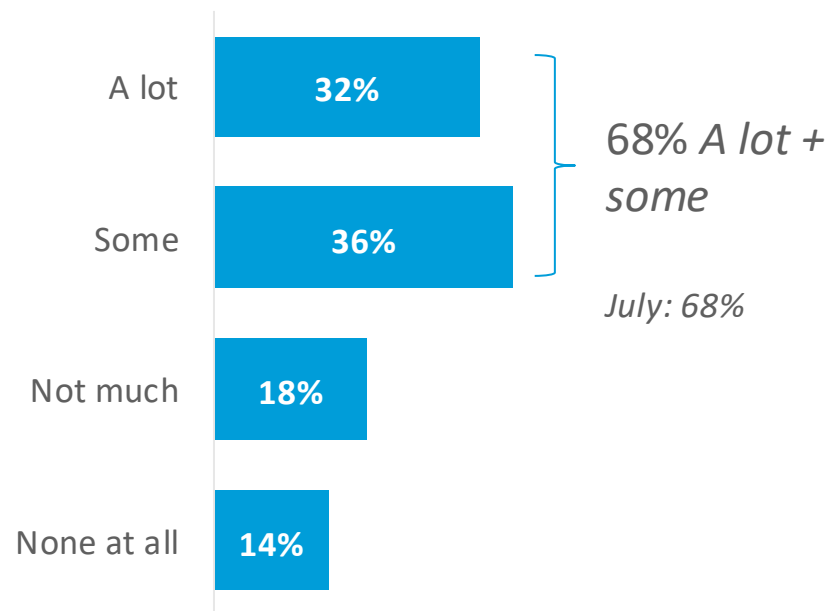

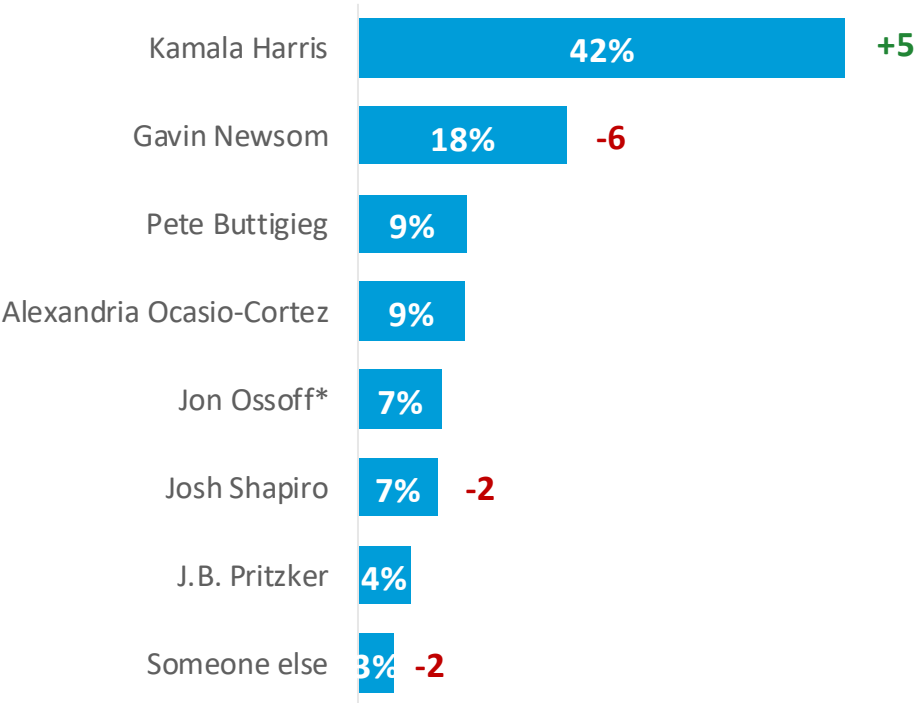

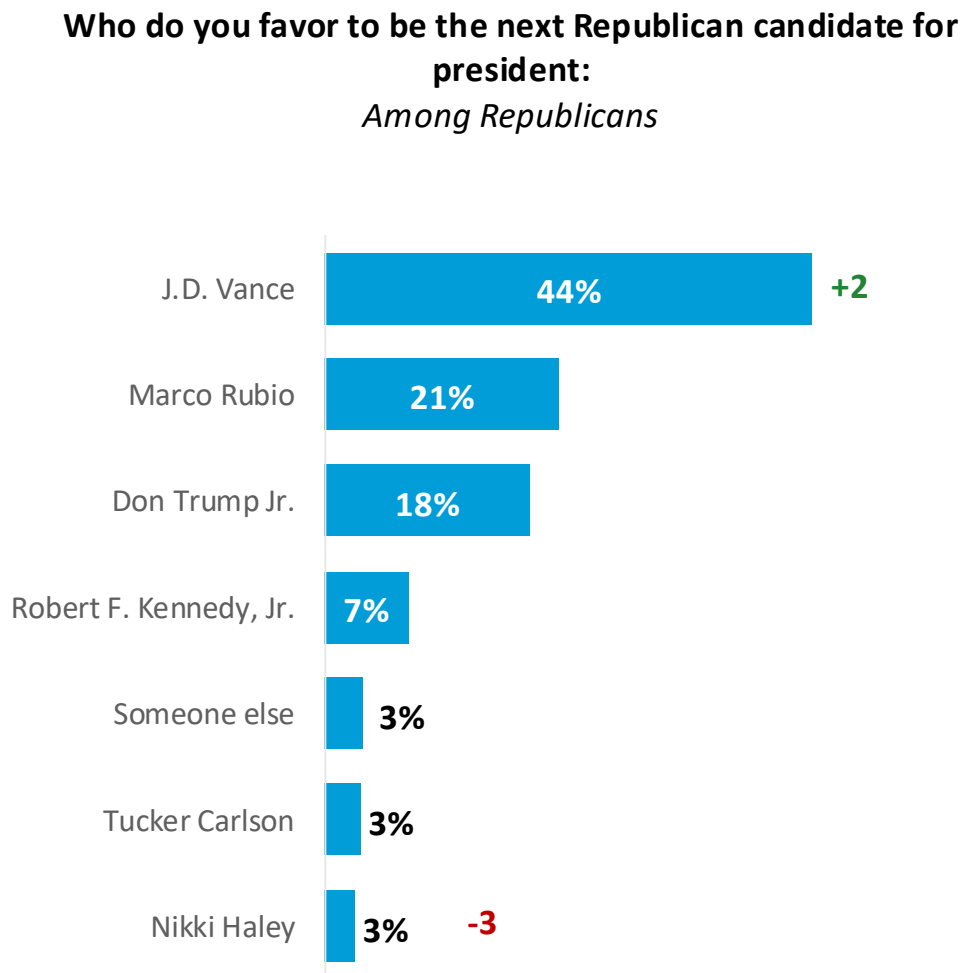
