Pride in personal appearance:

Children at Widey are expected to wear the correct school uniform including: a tie, black shoes, dark green jumper (with or without the school badge), white collared shirt and grey trousers, skirt or dress (please check all clothing is named – thank-you). Small stud earrings and watches (not Smartwatches) are acceptable; no other jewellery please. Shoulder length hair or longer should be tied back or clipped back off the face and please, no coloured hair braids, nail varnish or temporary tattoos.

Physical education:

P.E. this term will include a range of outdoor games and indoor gymnastics, dance and yoga. Your child's teacher and a sports coach will teach P.E. Please ensure your child has the correct P.E kit for both indoor and outdoor sessions. Details of the correct kit are available on the school's website (please check that all clothing is named – thank-you).

Reading, reading, reading:

In Year 5, children are still expected to regularly read alongside an adult. The benefits of reading daily at home (and at school) include: improved vocabulary, stronger thinking skills, better writing skills, memory improvement, reading can also be calming and is a way of learning new information. The more your child reads, the more knowledge they will have and the better equipped they will be to tackle future challenges.
