Center Joins Partnership with Government of Guyana and the Regional Biodiversity Alliance



Guyana is a country immensely rich in biodiversity and committed to becoming a global leader in meeting the UN 30x30 conservation goals. We attended the Global Biodiversity Alliance Summit in Guyana this past July and signed a historic Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Guyanese government. This MOU details our partnership with the office of the President of the Cooperative Republic of Guyana. We are excited to work with Guyana to help establish their biodiversity data infrastructure and support their use of the National Biodiversity Information System developed by our Center to help meet conservation goals. We look forward to guiding them in scaling the impact of the Global Biodiversity Alliance and the creation of an International Centre of Excellence in Biodiversity Research.





New York Climate Week

The BGC Center had an active presence at this year's New York Climate Week. Walter presented on a panel about "Innovating for Nature: Technologies applied for biodiversity data in Brazil" at the World Climate and Biodiversity Summit. Both Claire and Walter also hosted a session "Putting species on the map: More effective planetary decision making with Map of Life" as part of the Yale @ Climate Week series. We discussed the importance of applying the best-quality data, metrics, and tools now to support decision-making that supports both climate and biodiversity outcomes.



International Congress for Conservation Biology





BGC Center members Claire Hoffmann and Tz-Hsuan Tseng attended the 32nd International Congress for Conservation Biology in Brisbane, Australia, this past June. Claire gave a workshop detailing the Map of Life initiative and associated projects and programs, including key Center initiatives like our Species Distribution Modeling efforts, the Expert Tools platform, and the National Biodiversity Information Systems. Tz-Hsuan presented his paper "Hidden suboptimality of cost and area minimization in conservation prioritization model" which urged researchers and conservation practitioners to pay attention to the parameters they apply optimization models and the corresponding outputs. Tz-Hsuan was a finalist in the Best Oral Talk category for this presentation!

Esri User Conference

Elise, our Biodiversity Data Coordinator at the Center, attended the Esri User Conference in San Diego last July to learn the latest and greatest in map making. Her dashboard submission "Species was Protection Index: Country and Province Explorer", and it was featured in the virtual Map Gallery.
