Childhood sexual assault (CSA) claims continue to have a significant impact on schools– both emotionally and financially. Beyond the harm to survivors, these claims can lead to costly litigation, loss of trust within the community, and long-term reputational damage. Proactive prevention, education, and clear policies are essential to protect students and support

safe learning environments. This presentation is designed to help school district leaders effectively engage their Board of Education in the development and implementation of a comprehensive Childhood Sexual Assault (CSA) prevention program. The session outlines the importance of board-level buy-in, presents key data on the impact of CSA in educational settings, and highlights policy strategies that align with best practices and legal responsibilities. Attendees will gain communication tools, sample policy language, and implementation steps to create a culture of safety and accountability, ensuring every student has the opportunity to learn and thrive in a protected environment.

Amber McKeen is a child abuse prevention expert with over 16 years of experience helping youth-serving organizations strengthen safety measures. At Praesidium, she specializes in abuse prevention for K-12 schools, conducting risk assessments, policy analyses, and training sessions. Before joining Praesidium, as part of the CDC Foundation, Amber led a team of CDC scientists in a large-scale environmental scan of youth-serving organization policies and procedures focused on preventing child sexual abuse in youth-serving organizations. She previously spent six years at Children's Healthcare of Atlanta, training over 35,000 professionals; and developing their webinar education program; co-developing training programs and conducting evaluation research on child exploitation, foster parent training, and first-responder abuse prevention interventions.

What risk management services are to be performed by a member and what services are to be performed by a JPA? BREAKOUT SESSION: ENHANCING SCHOOL SAFETY: PREPARING SCHOOLS AND DISTRICTS FOR ANONYMIZED THREATS (10:25 - 11:10 AM) - SORREL ROOM

Anonymous threats continue to strain school and law enforcement resources, contributing to losses in instruction time and traumatizing school communities. Join a representative from the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency School Safety Task Force to explore evidence-based practices and share research-informed strategies to address the

evolving range of risks and threats that K-12 schools face.

This session will focus on CISA's Anonymized Threat Response Guidance (ATRG), and other federal resources and tools designed to help support schools in identifying and implementing scalable response solutions to threats originating on anonymized platforms and mediums. Presenters will outline the steps that school leaders can take to work alongside law enforcement organizations to assess the level of concern posed by a threat, and how to respond in a balanced way to minimize stress on their communities. The ATRG is designed to help create tailored approaches to addressing anonymous threats, from assessment to response.

Participants will come away with an understanding of how they play a role in addressing anonymous threats and improving their school safety plans to promote preparedness and resilience in support of their educational mission. This session is highly interactive, with speakers soliciting input from the audience throughout the discussion.

Andrew Dominic serves as the Engagement Manager for the School Safety Task Force at the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency. In this role, Mr. Dominic enhances the safety and security of the nationwide K-12 school community by managing the School Safety Task Force's involvement in external engagements and leading the development of program engagement materials.


