### Minimum booking

A minimum booking of two full days is required to attend our Nursery. If only two days are booked, one day must be a Monday or Friday.

### Invoicing

Invoices are sent out monthly and are to be paid by the first of the month in advance. Fees are payable even if your child is not attending nursery due to sickness or holidays.

### Sibling discount

A discount of 5% may be offered towards the child with the lower monthly fee if more than one child is attending. Terms and conditions apply.

### Ad hoc and additional hours

We are happy to provide ad hoc sessions for full and half days on top of regular bookings, subject to availability. Half days are not available as a permanent booking.

### Application fee and deposit

A non-refundable application fee of £50 is required with the return of an application form.

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## nurseries

A deposit of £100 per day of the week booked is required (max £500). This will secure a space for your child for the agreed sessions. Terms and conditions apply.

### Government funded hours

We are pleased to offer all streams of government funding.

#### 15 hours funding

All 3 and 4-year-olds are eligible for 15 hours of weekly funding. The government also offers funding for some 2-year-olds based on economic, DLA, CLA, NRFP, or EHCP criteria. We stretch the 15 weekly hours (38 weeks a year) over a full year, meaning eligible children receive 11 funded hours per week for 51 weeks. Visit [Childcare Choices](#) for full eligibility details.

#### 30 hours funding

Working families with children aged 9 months to 4 years old may be eligible for 30 hours of weekly funding. As with the 15-hour scheme, these hours are stretched over the full year, resulting in 22 funded hours per week for 51 weeks. Visit [Childcare Choices](#) for full eligibility details.

### Consumables

The above 15 and 30 hours funded monthly fees include consumables. Government funding is intended to deliver funded childcare, and does not cover the costs of meals, other consumables, or additional services. Should you not wish to pay for consumables, please see our fully funded offer on the following page.

Consumables include (but are not limited to):

- All meals and snacks during the nursery day - breakfast, mid-morning snack, 2-course cooked lunch (made on site by our nursery cooks), mid-afternoon snack, and light tea.
- Formula milk
- Nappies and wipes
- Sun cream
- Calpol
- Extracurricular classes (sports, languages, etc.)
- Trips outside the nursery.



## Fully Funded Offer

We offer completely free 15 and 30 hours funded places. Places are offered on a stretched basis over 51 weeks per year and allocated based on availability within the nursery.

### 15 hours funding

- 570 hours per annum

Monday-Friday (5 days), 3.46-6.00pm (2 hours 14 minutes per day) | Total: 11.17 hours per week

### 30 hours funding

- 1140 hours per annum

Monday-Friday (5 days), 10am-2.28pm (4 hours 28 minutes per day) | Total: 22.35 hours per week

### What does the fully funded session cover?

All funding is paid directly to the nursery by the local authority. According to the Department for Education funding guidance, the funding amount we receive covers the funded session but does not cover meals, other consumables, or additional activities.

Fully funded sessions do not include:

- All meals and snacks during the nursery day - breakfast, mid-morning snack, 2-course cooked lunch (made on site by our nursery cooks), mid-afternoon snack, and light tea.
- Formula milk
- Nappies and wipes
- Sun cream
- Calpol
- Extracurricular classes (sports, languages, etc.)
- Trips outside the nursery.

Water and cow's milk are provided by the nursery. Parents must provide food from home, however due to the high number of children with allergies, some foods will not be permitted to be brought into the nursery.
