Mayo Clinic Complex Care Program



WHAT IS THE MAYO CLINIC COMPLEX CARE PROGRAM?

The Mayo Clinic Complex Care Program is an enhanced benefit available to help eligible Minnesota Healthcare Cooperative members and dependents facing a complex, rare or undiagnosed medical condition.

Medica Choice Passport members with a medical condition that significantly impacts their day-to-day life may be eligible for evaluation and treatment at Mayo Clinic.

This program is for medical conditions in the following areas:

- Cancer
- Complex medical conditions
- Complex pediatrics
- Hemophilia
- Multiple Sclerosis
- Spine health
- Transplant

HOW DOES IT WORK?

Call the Medica Member Services line for MHC employees at 877-347-0282 for full details, help with collecting your medical records and to get connected with Mayo Clinic. Once a referral has been received by Mayo Clinic, you can expect a phone call within two business days from a Mayo Clinic representative.

A Mayo Clinic specialist will review your diagnosis and treatment plan and any other documents related to your health condition. They will determine if you are receiving appropriate care for your condition or if you could benefit from care at Mayo Clinic.

If you decide to go to Mayo Clinic, travel and lodging for you and a caregiver (two caregivers if the patient is pediatric) may be covered and coordinated for you.

After you return home, your local medical provider and Mayo Clinic will work closely to coordinate your ongoing care.

HOW DOES THIS DIFFER FROM THE CARE I RECEIVE FROM MY CURRENT DOCTOR?

The Mayo Clinic Complex Care Program is an additional layer of medical advice and care for our health plan participants. The high level of expertise that Mayo Clinic offers for complex, rare and undiagnosed conditions helps provide you with a comprehensive solution that includes your local doctor and other health plan benefits.

ARE MY CONVERSATIONS WITH MAYO CLINIC CONFIDENTIAL?

Every patient will be treated with dignity, respect and compassion, and your privacy and confidentiality will be maintained. No information about your medical condition will be shared unless you authorize it.
