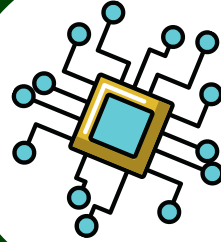




# FALCON FLIGHT PATH

## PROJECT OVERVIEW

Faribault High School is listening to its Area Chamber of Commerce, which encouraged students to have sufficient computer skills for gainful employment after graduation. The district responded by updating its software and equipment to meet industry demands.

### What was purchased:

- 24 computers (district matched)
- Software: CAD, Fusion 360, Vectric VCarve, Microsoft Office, and Adobe Creative Suite

### Students gain:

- Technical preparation for workforce needs
- Increased course offerings at the high school, specifically in the Business and Health pathways
- Full utilization of equipment such as 3D printers, laser printers, and other fabrication tools

## Project Impact:



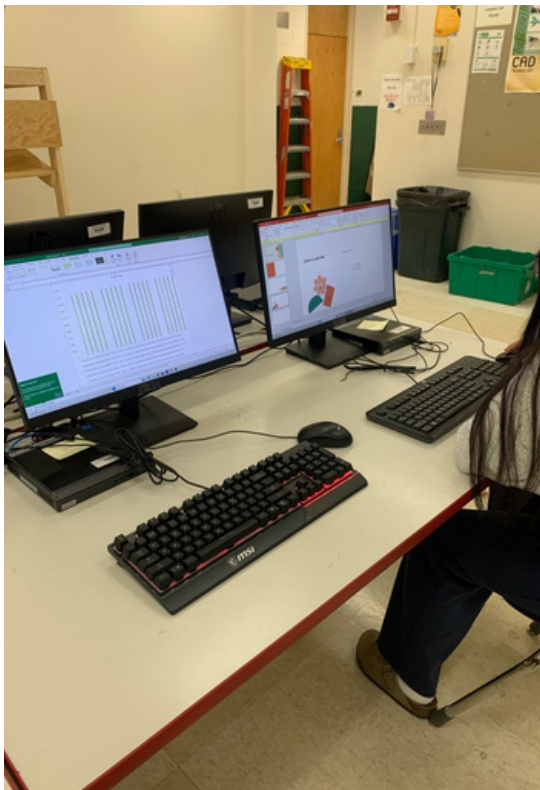
More than 600 students served in grades 9–12
