Structure and Navigation

0	Use headings and subheadings to organize your content
0	Use a clear and consistent navigation menu
0	Ensure that your website follows a logical sequence
0	Provide a sitemap or search function
0	Ensure that your website is mobile-friendly
0	Ensure that your website is accessible using keyboard-only navigation
0	Consider defining ARIA (Accessible Rich Internet Applications) roles
Colors and Graphics	
0	Use high-contrast colors
0	Avoid using color as the only means of conveying information
0	Check color contrast ratios (at least 4.5:1 for normal text and 3:1 for large text.)
Images and Media	
0	Use alt-text to describe images
0	Provide text-based alternatives for non-text content
0	Use accessible image formats
0	Provide captions and transcripts for videos
0	Use accessible media players
0	Avoid using flashing or strobing images
