Older students do not need something different from others who are learning to read: the same alphabetic code knowledge and phonics skills underpin all reading.

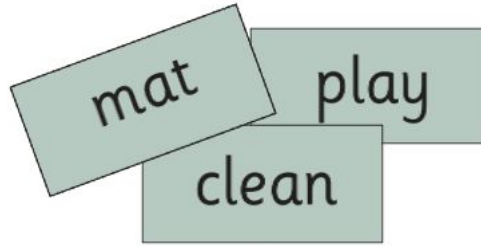
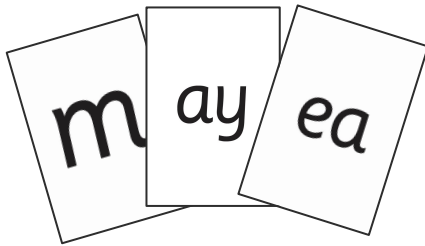

- Anne Bonny**
 Anne Cornac was born in Ireland in 1697. Her parents took their young daughter to Carolina, USA.
 The Cornacs had plenty of money and spoiled Anne with lots of lovely things. But Anne was not satisfied.
 She grew into a wild and difficult teenager. Her father tried to marry her to a local man, but Anne resisted. Bored with her life, she ran away to marry a pirate called Jack Bonny. Her furious father disinherited her.
- But Anne soon tired of her husband, so she ran off with another pirate, Captain John Rackham (Calico Jack). They travelled to the coast of Jamaica, where they sailed under the flag of the skull and crossbones.

As pirates were traditionally male, Anne dressed up in a shirt and breeches. She threw herself into her new job, attacking sailors and passengers with as much aggression as the rest of her pirate crew. These innocent people were killed or taken prisoner. One of these prisoners was Mary Read.

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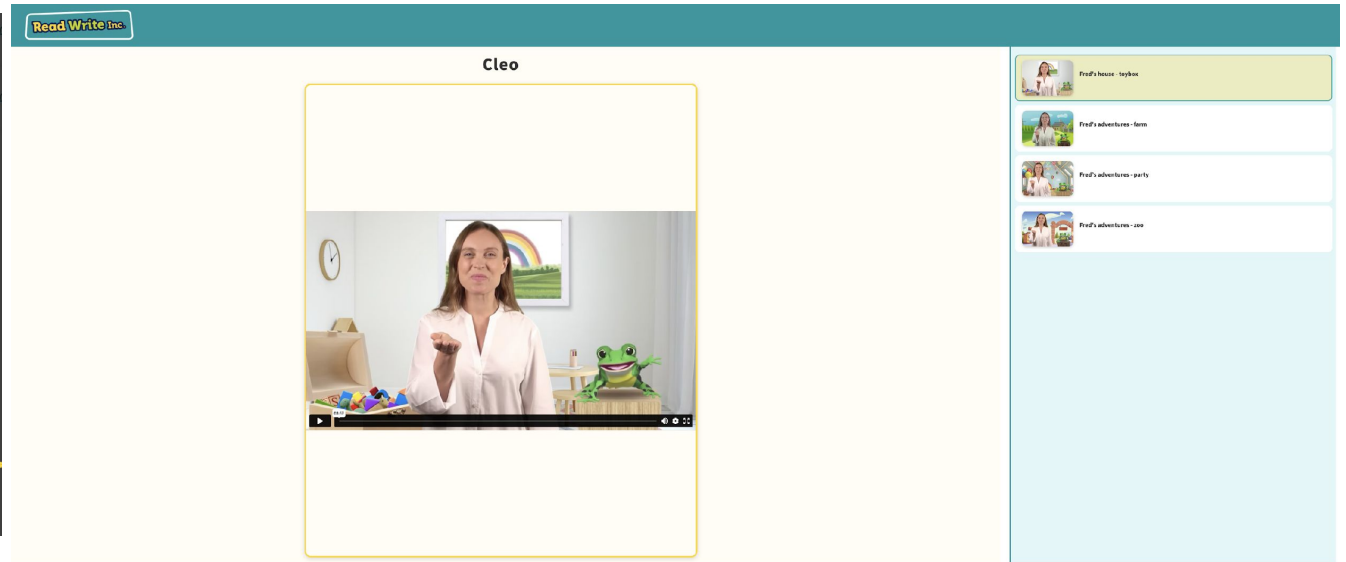
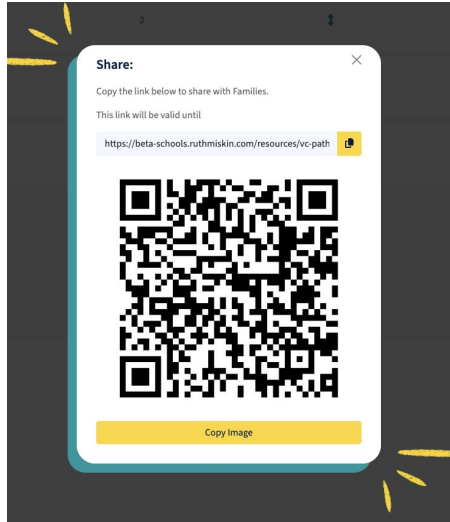

How do I use the Virtual Classroom?

1. Set aside 10 minutes to watch a film with your child each day.
2. Find a quiet space for your child to watch the film on a laptop or tablet.
3. Praise your child as they join in with the lesson – make it fun!

The more they practise using these films, the quicker they'll learn to read.

What can I do?

1. Use Sound Talk to help your child to read and spell words.
2. Encourage your child to read their Module, Anthology or Fresh Start reader.
3. Watch the Virtual Classroom films together.
4. Read aloud to your child every day.
