In addition to our Mission Statement 'Love & Justice' we aim to ensure that pupils leave with high aspirations, built in resilience and equipped with the knowledge, skills and behaviours to achieve them.

We want each child to have enrichment and extracurricular opportunities that they will be proud to participate in as a representative of the school.

We also want our parents/carers to have access to information, knowledge and skills to support their child.

All Saints Catholic High School is a Knowsley based Catholic secondary school educating pupils aged 11–18 years of age in the Kirkby area of Merseyside. The school also operates a small specialist sixth form.

We have a PAN of 210 in each year group, and a current sixth form of 80 students, making us the largest school in Knowsley. The majority of our students enter our school in year 7 from our local feeder primary schools within Kirkby. We work hard to foster good relationships with our local primary schools and a particular emphasis is placed on transition to year 7.

Our school is located close to the town centre and the two train stations in Kirkby. We are in a modern building, constructed in 2010, with 1121 students and over 140 staff onsite. Our facilities include a light and welcoming atrium, a well resourced library, modern sports hall and gym, a dance studio, music practice rooms, Science labs, DT, Engineering and Food rooms and a specialist Sixth Form area. In addition to the indoor facilities, there are well maintained grounds which include social areas, a 3G astroturf pitch and a large playing field for grass pitches and athletics.

Each member of staff receives an Apple Mac laptop and all students and staff work on Google Workspace. All students in years 10, 11 and Sixth Form are provided with a Chromebook to facilitate their digital curriculum work using Google Classroom.
