There Was An Old Lady Who Swallowed Some Books by Lucille Calondro

Materials and Prep:

- 1. Print a communication board for each student. Use in combination with a core board.
- 2. Record repeated line(s) on a single message button.
- 3. If students are using a high-tech AAC system, locate necessary vocabulary prior to activity.
- 4. Use Post-it notes to add prompt reminders (C-A-R) to each page of the book.

Day 1: Picture walk, introduction to vocabulary, & activate background knowledge

Starting with the front cover, take a "walk" through the pages of the book. Do not focus on the text. but focus on what we see on each page. Help students find vocabulary on the communication board to make connections with things on the page (e.g., "I see a _____. What do you think?").

Day 2: Read the book using shared reading principals.

Point to each word as you read. Pause at the end of each page (10 sec.) and invite students to engage.

- **C**omment about something on the page (e.g., Oh no! She swallowed a _____!) and pause.
- Ask for participation and not specific question (e.g., "What do you think?") and pause.
- Respond Observe students and attribute meaning to any communication attempt.

Day 3: Read the book again and continue to focus on core and fringe vocabulary.

Use a core word page on AAC devices or low-tech vocabulary board in combination with the story vocabulary board.

LOOK (LOOK at that!) **MORE** (Let's read MORE!) **YOU** (What do YOU think about that?) **NOT** (She should NOT do that.) **LIKE** (I can see that you LIKE this!) **IN** (She put it IN her mouth!)

Day 4: Read the book again and then write about it.

Create a poll and allow students to vote on their favorite item the Old Lady swallowed. Then have each student write about why they liked the item. Use the keyboard AAC devices, symbols, drawings, or word banks to allow students to put thoughts down on paper. Scribbling is accepted!

Day 5: Read the book again and focus on alphabet awareness.

Have a scavenger hunt around the school and look for words that start with the same letter. Print a copy of the scavenger hunt page (p.7) for each student and allow them to mark off each item (Hint: Alternative pencils, like stamps, can be used for student with access needs). Explore letters using the keyboard page on AAC devices.



If the student is using an AAC device or app on an iPad, combine the use of core vocabulary with the included book vocabulary board.

- I think you LIKE it.
- Let's <u>TURN THE PAGE</u> to see what happens next.
- OH NO! I can't believe it!
- That **OLD LADY SWALLOWED** !
- This book is so **FUNNY**!


