We can make them with dough and decorate them.


is for decorations.

is for ice skating.




Ice skating is moving on ice while wearing special shoes called skates. People skate for fun in winter.

A parade is a line of people, music, and floats moving down a street. People watch parades for fun in December.


is for quiet night.



A quiet night is a calm time with little noise. We rest, read, or relax during a quiet night at home.




Ribbons are

is for unity.




Unity means

is for visits.




Visits are times
